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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Nebraska's statutes require the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education to biennially prepare a *Tuition, Fees, and Financial Aid Report*. As an important component of the Commission's *Comprehensive Statewide Plan for Postsecondary Education*, this report studies the public policy issues relating to tuition, fees, and financial aid for students in Nebraska and how Nebraska's public postsecondary educational institutions rank on these points when compared to their peer institutions. It examines these significant, interrelated issues facing the state's students and its institutions of higher education.

As stated in the Commission's *Comprehensive Statewide Plan*, Nebraskans will reap many benefits from affordable, accessible, and quality higher education. "Nebraska's people will value and support higher education institutions that are vital, vigorous and visionary. Each higher education institution will fulfill its role and mission with distinction by being responsive to changing academic, workforce, societal, economic, and community development needs. Together, Nebraska's institutions will provide access to educational opportunities that meet the diverse needs of students and citizens while exercising careful and creative stewardship of available resources." (2003, p. 1) It is the Commission's hope that this report will assist Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions in meeting these goals.

Affordability of Higher Education

In general, higher education is becoming less affordable—and therefore less attainable—for students. Among our findings:

- Over the past 10 years, tuition and mandatory fee increases for a full-time undergraduate resident student at Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions ranged from 57% to 134%. (See p. 4-10)
- Changes in the student payment share at Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions range from a decrease of 8% to an increase of 68% over the past 10 years. (See p. 11-16)
 - When comparing state and student contributions, the University of Nebraska at Omaha is the only Nebraska public postsecondary institution where students contribute more than 50% towards the cost of their education. (See p. 16)
- The percentage of family income needed to support undergraduate resident tuition and mandatory fees at Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions is increasing, especially for students from median-, low-, and very low-income families. (See p. 17-45)

State Investment in Higher Education

State appropriations per full-time equivalent (FTE) student at Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions have increased over the past 10 years. However, state funding is increasingly threatened by other state obligations. Among our findings:

- State appropriations per FTE student at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, the University of Nebraska at Kearney, Western Nebraska Community College, Chadron State College, and Peru State College are all higher than their peer mean state appropriations per FTE. (See Appendix p. A6)
 - When compared to their peer groups, Peru State College and the University of Nebraska-Lincoln have the highest state appropriations per FTE of all Nebraska public institutions. (See p. A93 and p. A132)
- Mid-Plains and Western Nebraska Community Colleges are the only two Nebraska community colleges whose state and local appropriations are higher than their peer means. (See pp. A45 and A54)

Financial Aid for Higher Education

As tuition and mandatory fee charges continue to rise, the availability of financial aid becomes a necessity for many students. Among our findings:

- The percent of tuition discounted in the form of tuition waivers has remained fairly stable over three years. (See pp. A59-A70, pp. A98-A103, pp. A139-A144)
 - The University of Nebraska-Lincoln, Metropolitan Community College, and Western Nebraska Community College are the only Nebraska institutions where total tuition waivers awarded exceed their peer mean.
- The amount of state grant funds awarded to students has increased. (See p. 64-68)
- Students are borrowing considerably more for their educational expenses. (See p. 69-72)

Recommendations

Affordability

- The student payment share has increased at all but one of Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions over the past 10 years. Additionally, families with median, low, and very low income especially are contributing more of their income to pay the tuition and mandatory fees required to educate a family member. While students and their families certainly should contribute financially toward the student's education, **the Commission expects colleges and universities to strive to keep resident tuition and mandatory fees, and increases to those charges, as reasonable as possible so as not to price students out of obtaining an education. The Commission also encourages institutions to keep tuition and fees comparable to institutional peers or an identified national standard. In addition, the Commission encourages institutions to continue their efforts to increase efficiency through collaboration, advances in technology, and other appropriate means.**
- While nonresident students at Nebraska public higher education institutions pay more for tuition and fees than do resident students, those additional charges generally represent a smaller percentage premium than that charged by most of our institutions' peers in other states. Nebraska institutions therefore offer a good bargain for many students that come here from other states. The Commission has supported that approach to build higher education enrollments in Nebraska and increase the number of highly educated individuals that remain in the state and contribute to its economy. **The Commission supports consideration of some additional lowering of that differential, particularly to take advantage of opportunities to entice students from surrounding states.** While low nonresident rates assist with the recruitment and retention of nonresident students, **the Commission encourages institutions to review these charges to assure that low nonresident rates do not adversely affect programs and tuition charges for resident students.**

State Investment

- Having an educated population significantly enhances the economic and social well-being of a state. Therefore, **the Commission recommends that the Legislature maintain appropriate levels of state appropriations for public postsecondary institutions in Nebraska.**

Financial Aid

- Since students from median-, low-, and very low-income families would primarily benefit from financial assistance awarded from the state, and since the contribution from their income for tuition and mandatory fees has increased considerably, **the Commission encourages increased funding for the Nebraska State Grant program.**
- Although not specifically evaluated in this report, we are aware that the means to enroll in dual credit courses (courses that carry both collegiate and high school credit) is sometimes affected by family income. To increase the number of high school students taking dual enrollment courses, **the Commission encourages the Legislature to provide scholarship funds to allow needy students to take advantage of those opportunities and better prepare themselves for college attendance or entry into the workforce.**

INTRODUCTION

Nebraska's statutes require the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education to biennially prepare the *Tuition, Fees, and Financial Aid Report*. As an important component of the Commission's *Comprehensive Statewide Plan for Postsecondary Education*, this report studies the public policy issues relating to tuition, fees, and financial aid for students in Nebraska. It examines the significant, interrelated issues facing the state's students and its institutions of higher education, such as:

- The affordability of attending a public postsecondary institution;
- The state's level of investment; and
- The trends in the state grant and student loan programs.

The appendixes of this report offer an in-depth analysis of comparisons regarding Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions in relation to their peer groups in:

- State appropriations per full-time equivalent student;
- Student payment share and affordability;
- Tuition, fees, and enrollment trends;
- Tuition and fees as compared to inflation; and
- Financial aid tuition waivers.

Data Caveats

Comparisons with peer institutions allow each of Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions to assess key indicators in relation to data from similar institutions. Such comparisons also provide a method of measuring and demonstrating an institution's progress toward specific goals and outcomes. (*Comprehensive Plan*, 2003, p. 33) This information should also help ensure that the major statewide goals in the *Comprehensive Plan* are being achieved. Two limitations may affect the validity of the data: the peer institutions used for each Nebraska institution and the return rate of the surveys.

The list of peer institutions was created more than a decade ago, based on the following criteria:

- Similarities among states;
- Closeness in enrollments;
- Comparable budget levels;
- Comparable types of accreditation;
- Comparable level and distribution of degree programs; and
- Similarities in selected measures of instructional characteristics.

Each Nebraska institution's peers may no longer meet one or more of these criteria. The Commission will review each of the peer lists before the

development of the *2008 Tuition, Fees, and Financial Aid Report* to determine if adjustments should be made.

The second data limitation in this report is the return rate of the surveys. Although some of the data for this report was derived from published literature, the survey information was based largely on self-reported data provided by a range of individuals working in Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions, along with their peers from other institutions. While the Commission obtained a 100 percent return rate on the surveys from Nebraska's institutions, there was only a 70 percent return rate from the peer institutions.

The return rate of the surveys within different sector peer lists varied significantly. For example, 100 percent of Wayne State College's peers returned the surveys, while only 56 percent of Southeast Community College's peers replied.¹

For institutions that did not return their surveys, the Commission attempted to obtain institutional information through a variety of sources such as the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) and *The Chronicle of Higher Education*, along with relevant information available through the peer institution's Web sites.

¹ Campus-based institutional researchers are busy, and there are limits to the amount of time they will or can devote to answering surveys from other states. Commission staff will consider other possible approaches for future reports.

AFFORDABILITY OF HIGHER EDUCATION

Affordability is a significant issue due to increasing college costs, which are making higher education less attainable for students. The National Center for Public Policy and Higher Education conducted a study in 2004 that rated affordability. The study, *Measuring Up: The National Report Card on Higher Education*, found that no state earned an A grade, only one state--California--received a B, two states earned a C, and 11 got Ds. The remaining 36 states, including Nebraska, received an F. (2004, p. 24) States must create public policies that will aid in making higher education affordable and accessible to an increasingly broad range of its citizens.

To determine if college is more or less affordable than it has been in the past, the following information examines tuition and mandatory fees in light of changes in family income.

This section covers three factors of affordability: tuition and fees, student payment share, and tuition and fees as a percentage of family income.

Tuition and Fees

Tuition and mandatory fees at Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions have increased significantly over the past five years. Inflation and fluctuations in state support have prompted these significant increases. The Commission continues to recommend that tuition and mandatory fee charges should be near or below the mean of the selected peer group for each institution as a means of promoting access to Nebraska higher education.

Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions are continuing to meet the Commission's recommendation to set tuition and fee rates at a level that is appropriate to each sector's role and mission. (*Comprehensive Plan*, 2003, p. 11) While higher education institutions nationwide have put in place steady increases in tuition and mandatory fees over the years, most undergraduate Nebraska students attending public, four-year institutions in 2005-06 still paid less than the national average of \$5,491 for tuition and mandatory fees. The exception is the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, where tuition and mandatory fee charges are slightly above the national average. Nebraska college students attending two-year public institutions are also paying less than the national average of \$2,191 for tuition and mandatory fees. (*Trends in College Pricing*, 2005, p. 5)

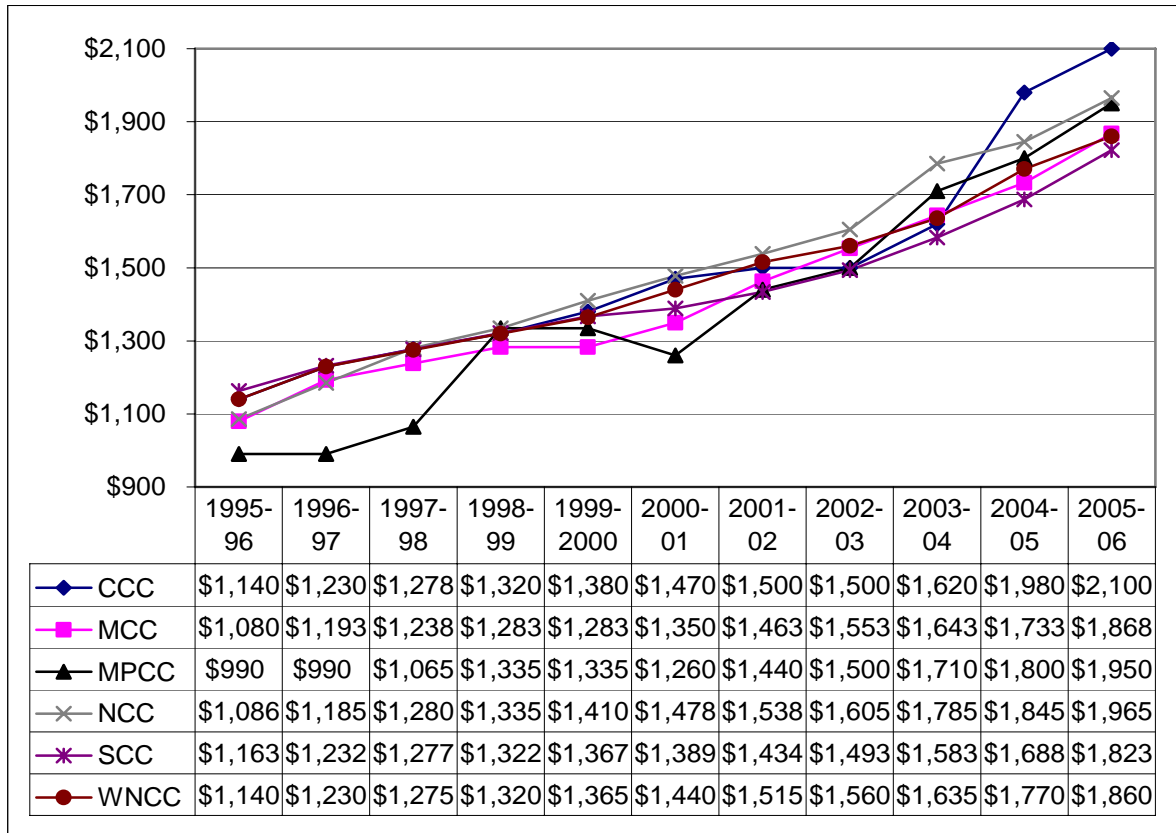
Regarding nonresident tuition and fees, the Commission has encouraged Nebraska institutions of higher education to use lower nonresident charges as a recruiting tool to attract out-of-state students. However, as recommended in the *2004 Tuition, Fees, and Financial Aid Report*, institutions are encouraged to review nonresident charges to assure that low nonresident rates do not adversely affect programs and tuition charges for Nebraska-resident students.

Consistent with that guidance, Nebraska institutions, especially within the community college sector, generally charge a significantly lower out-of-state premium than do their peers in other states.¹ Nevertheless, the community colleges continue to have the lowest undergraduate resident tuition and fee rates, followed by the state colleges and then the University of Nebraska system. The following pages reflect changes in tuition and fees occurring in the community colleges, state colleges, and the University of Nebraska.

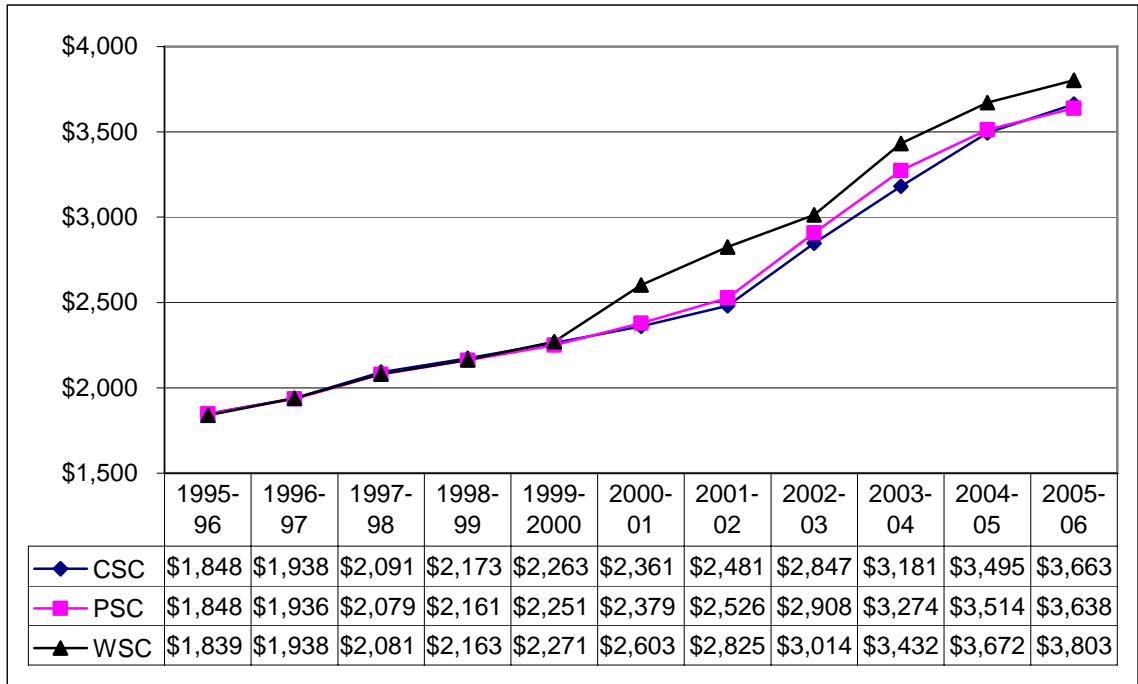

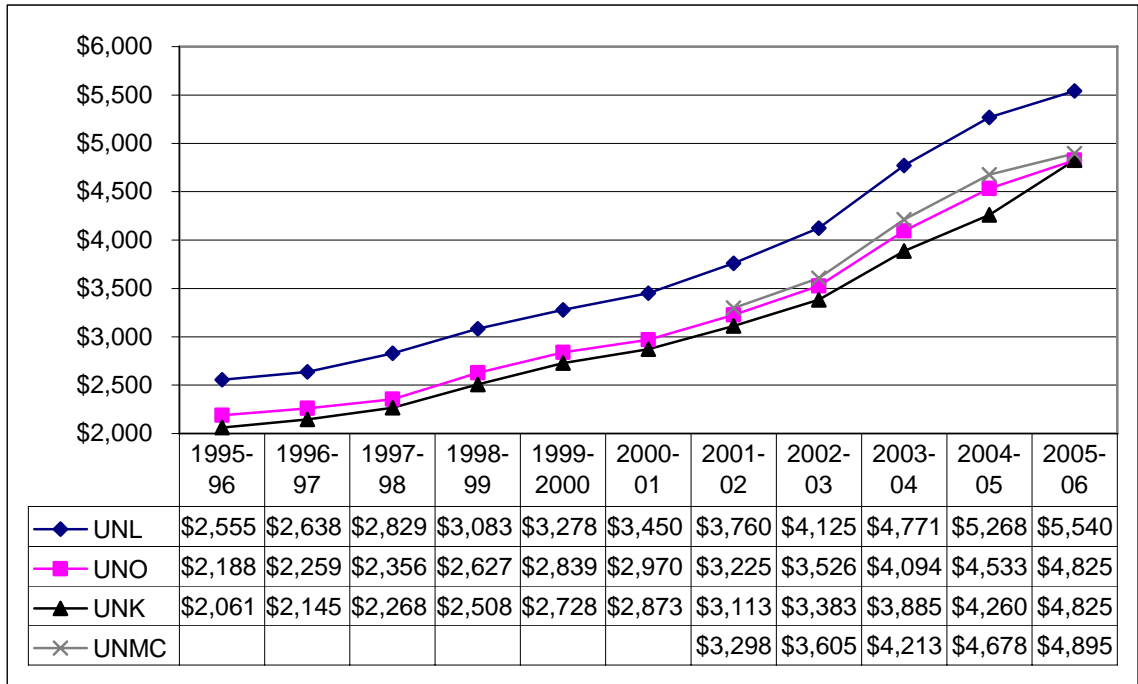

Student Payment Share

The State of Nebraska and its taxpayers bear the majority of the cost to educate public postsecondary students. Students, however, pay a percentage of the cost through tuition and fees. The student payment share for four-year institutions is determined by a formula that divides the aggregate tuition and mandatory fee revenue, in a given year, by the public institution's state appropriation plus the tuition and mandatory fees revenue. For two-year institutions, property tax revenue is also added into the equation. Overall, the State of Nebraska and its taxpayers bear the majority of the cost to educate public postsecondary students, and the students pay a percentage of the cost through tuition and fees assessed at each institution.

A common concern in higher education is how much institutional revenue is coming from the student compared to how much is coming from other sources. In simple terms, four-year public institutions receive a majority of their funding for operations from two sources: the state and the student. Two-year public institutions receive a majority of funding from the state and the student, but also receive revenue from taxes assessed on property within their service area. As students contribute a higher percentage of the cost of an education, affordability at his or her preferred institution is lessened, especially if he or she comes from a low-income family.

The Commission has recommended guidelines on the student payment share for educational costs in the *Comprehensive Statewide Plan for Postsecondary Education* (2003, p. 11). These guidelines reflect role and mission differences between sectors:

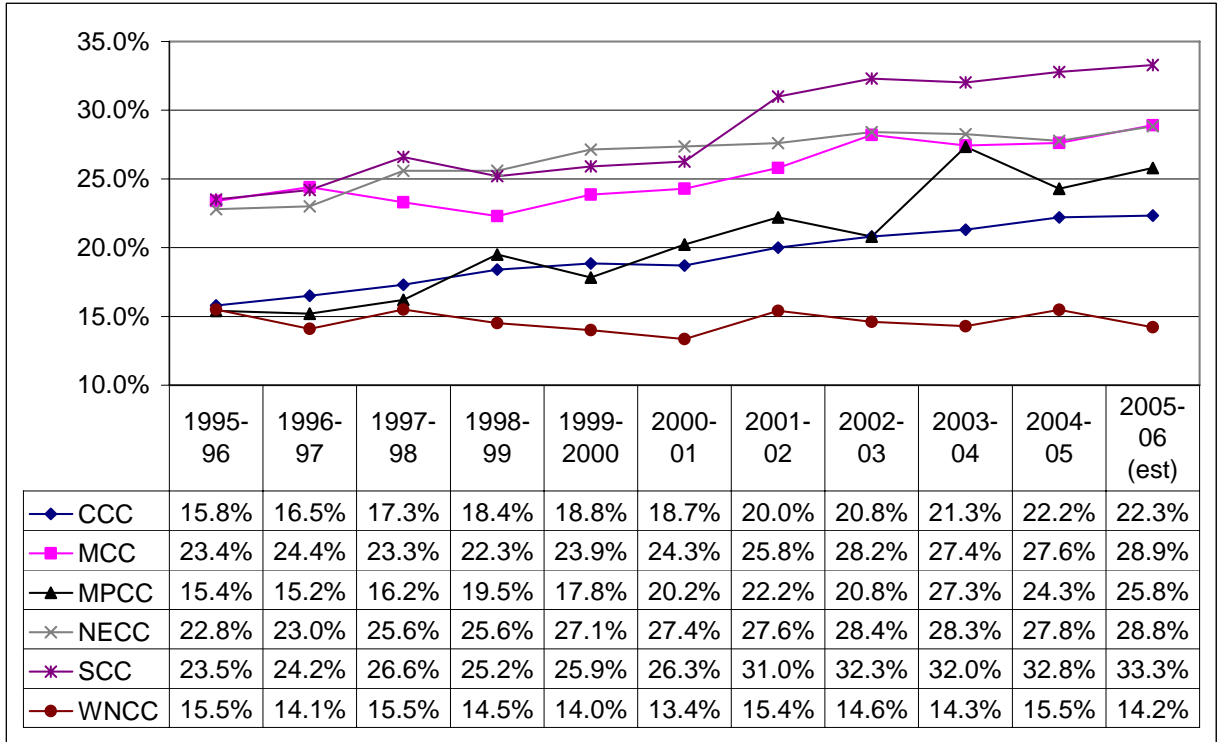
- At the community colleges, the student payment share should be the lowest of the three public sectors.
- At the state colleges, the student payment share should be greater than the student's share at the community colleges, but less than at the University of Nebraska campuses.
- At the University of Nebraska campuses, the student payment share should be greater than the student's payment share at both the community colleges and the state colleges.

With one exception, the student payment share at Nebraska institutions is consistent with established guidelines. The student payment share at Wayne State College is estimated at 41.1 percent in 2005-06—slightly above the estimated student payment share of 40.3 percent at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln for the same year. Students at the University of Nebraska at Omaha pay the highest student payment share.

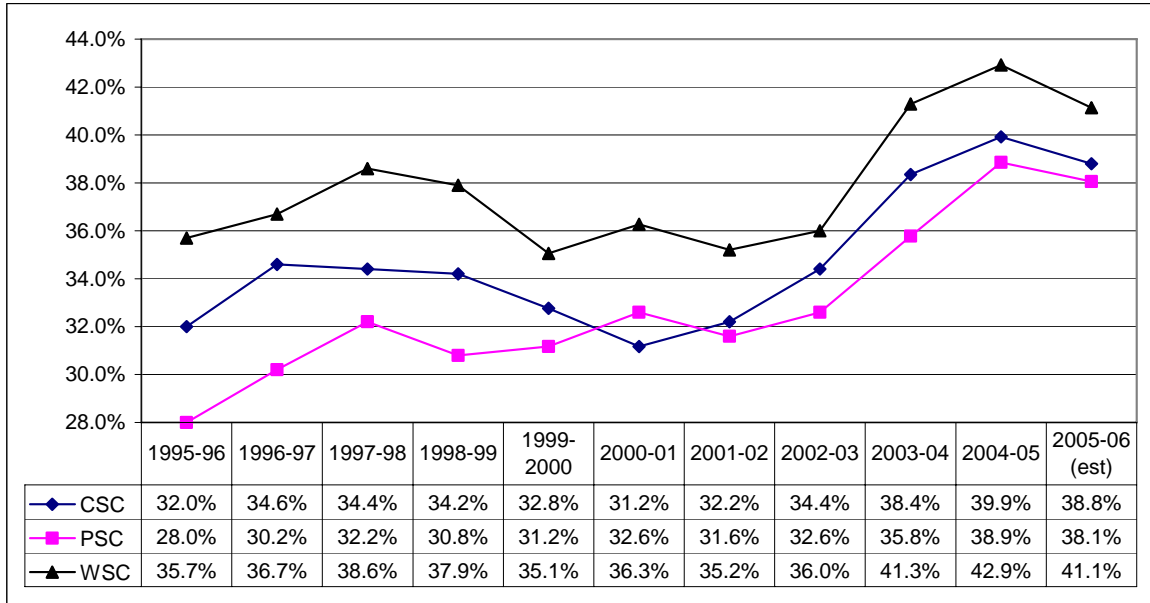

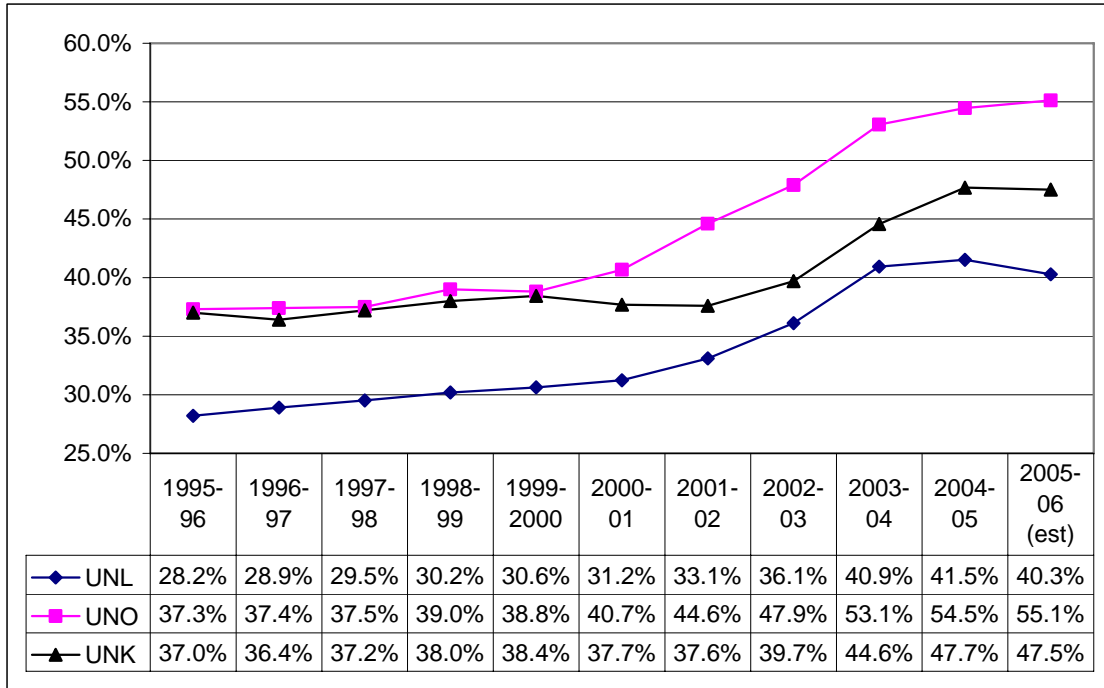

Tuition and Fees as a Percentage of Family Income

The third factor relating to affordability is the percentage of a family's annual income that must be contributed for the student to attend the institution of their choice. As the cost of a college education has increased for students and their families, concerns about pricing students--especially students from low-income families--out of an education become increasingly important.

Over the years, the Commission has reviewed how much a student's family must contribute to the student's education using per capita income to measure affordability, along with comparing the educational costs to the median family income, the low family income, and very low family income. Per capita income is determined by the U.S. Department of Commerce Bureau of Economic Analysis, while the median, low, and very low income values for a family of four comes from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development:

Low-income families are defined as families whose income does not exceed 80 percent of the median family income while very low-income families are defined as families whose incomes do not exceed 50 percent of the median family income. (2005)

Per capita, median, low and very low incomes are calculated for each institution by averaging the amounts for families in each specified county in an institution's service area.

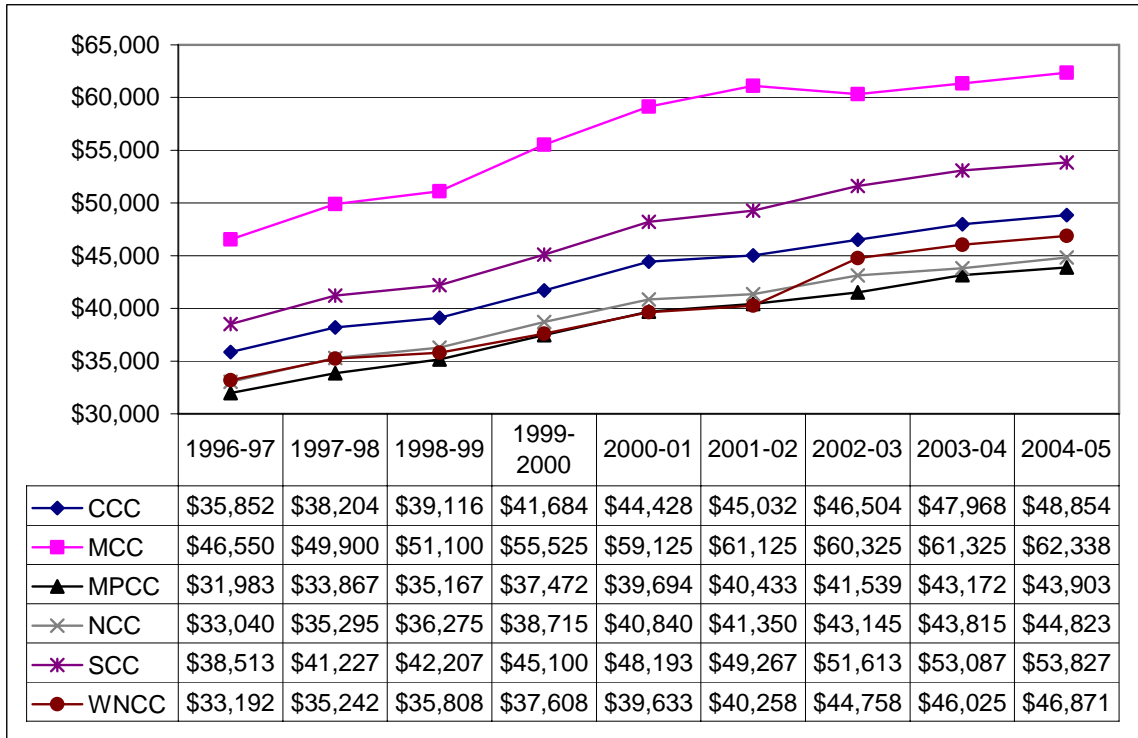
Through various calculations, such as adding the two lowest measures of family income, it is possible to assess if the increase in tuition and fees has a more detrimental effect on students from low-income families than on students from median-income families. Census Bureau research has shown that the "mean income for families in the lowest-income bracket has declined since 2000." (Giegerich, 2005, p. 6) This indicates that incomes for those families clearly are not rising as tuition and fees consistently increase in higher education. The Commission continues to remember that the higher an increase, the harder it is for students from low-income families to obtain a higher education degree.

The following pages discuss the percentage of a family's income that goes toward a student's education when attending the public postsecondary sectors Nebraska.¹

¹ It should be noted that these calculations are based on the gross amount of tuition and mandatory fees a student would be charged. While these students would, in most cases, be eligible for some type of financial assistance to help with their educational costs, the calculations for this section do not take those awards into consideration.

Average Income for Median-income Families Living in Counties Within Each Nebraska Community College Service Area 1996-97 through 2004-05



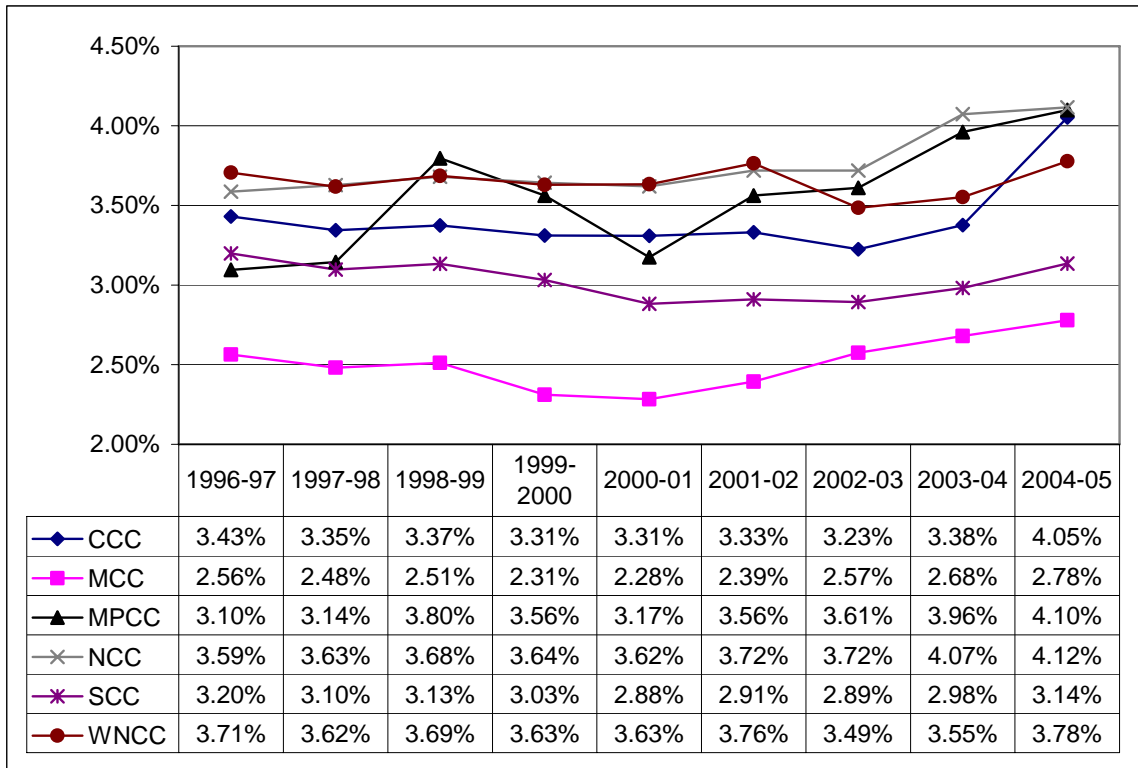

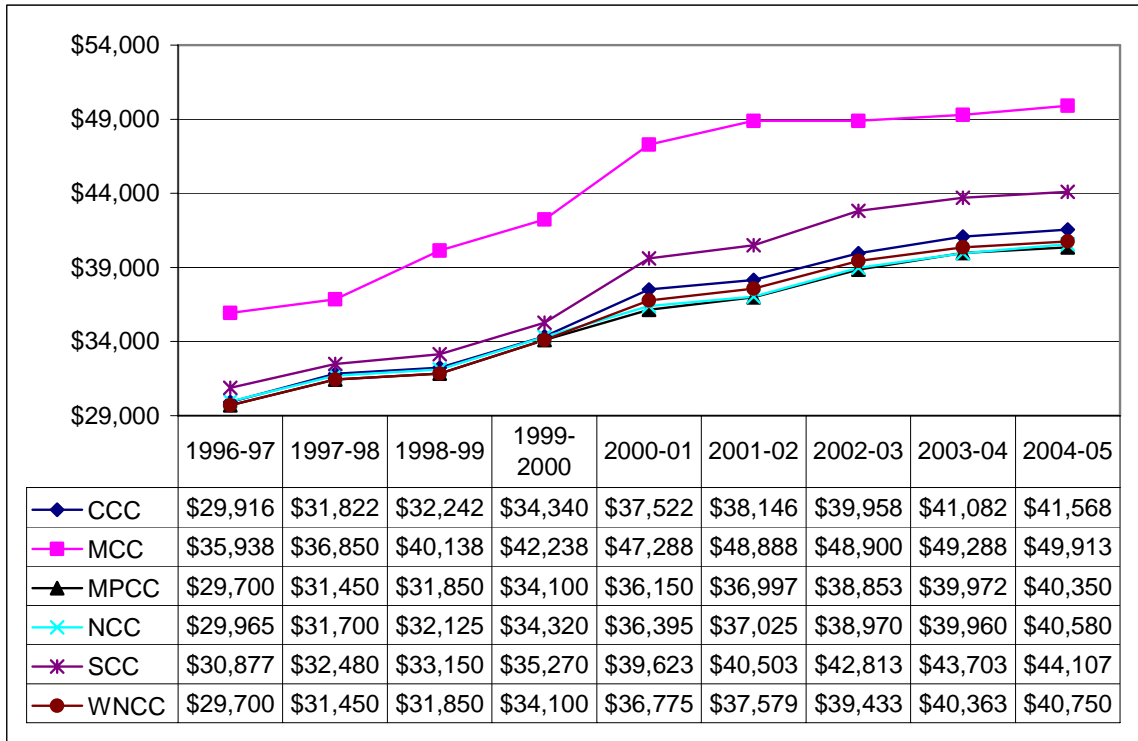

Average Income for Low-income Families Living in Counties Within Each Nebraska Community College Service Area 1996-97 through 2004-05



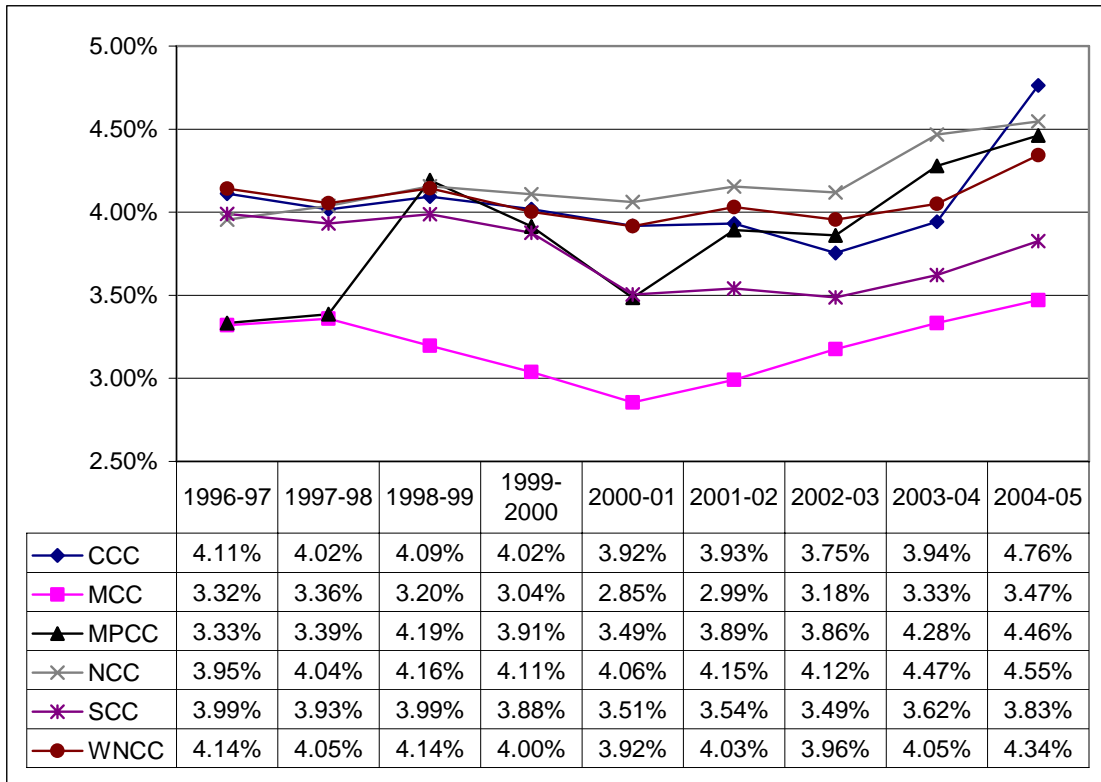

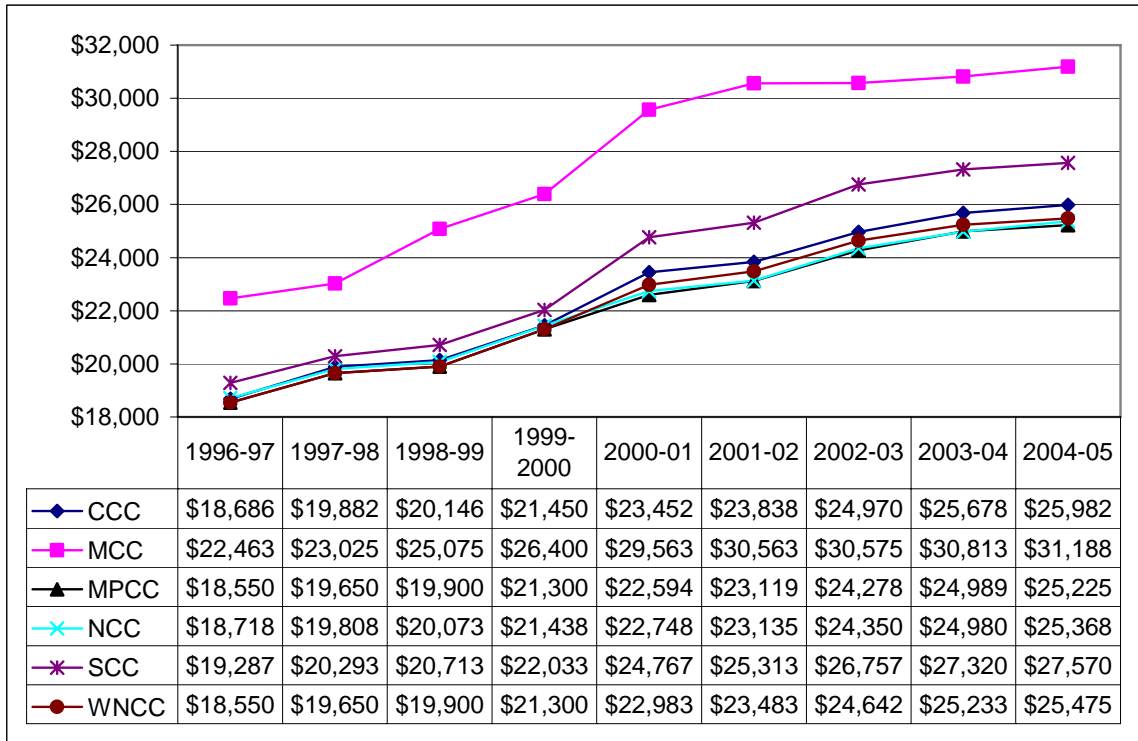

Average Income for Very Low-income Families Living in Counties Within Each Nebraska Community College Service Area 1996-97 through 2004-05



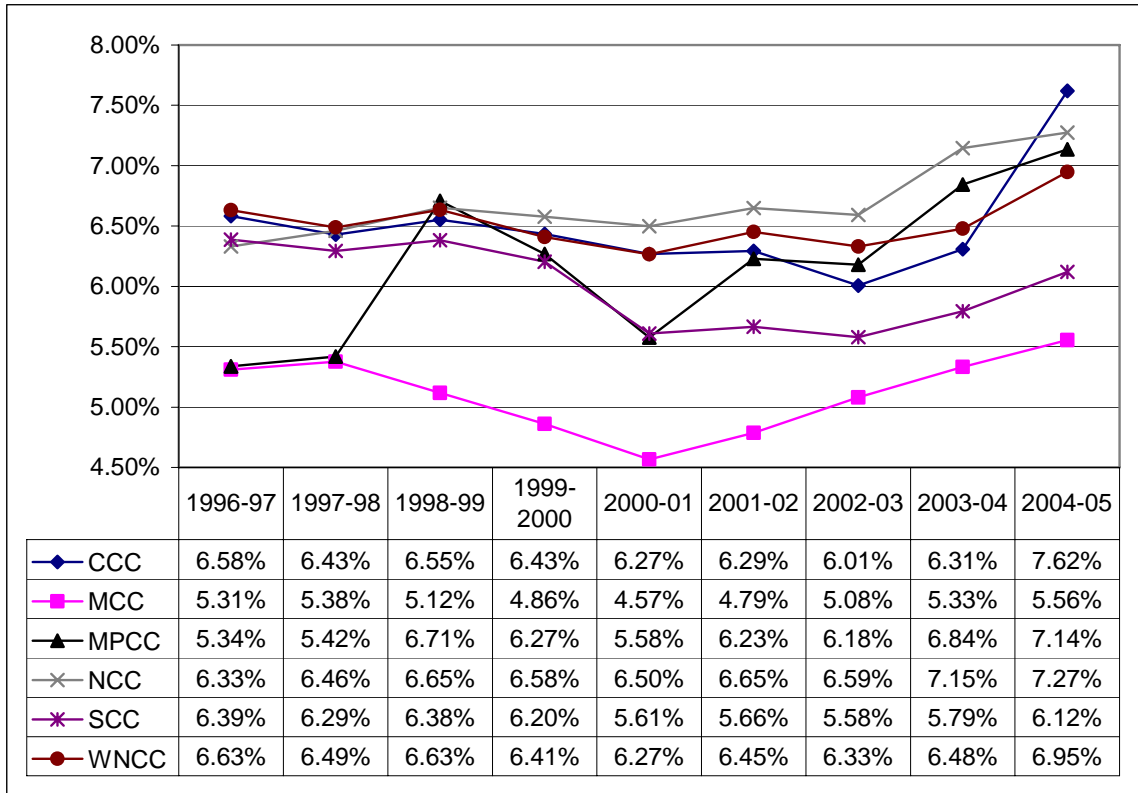

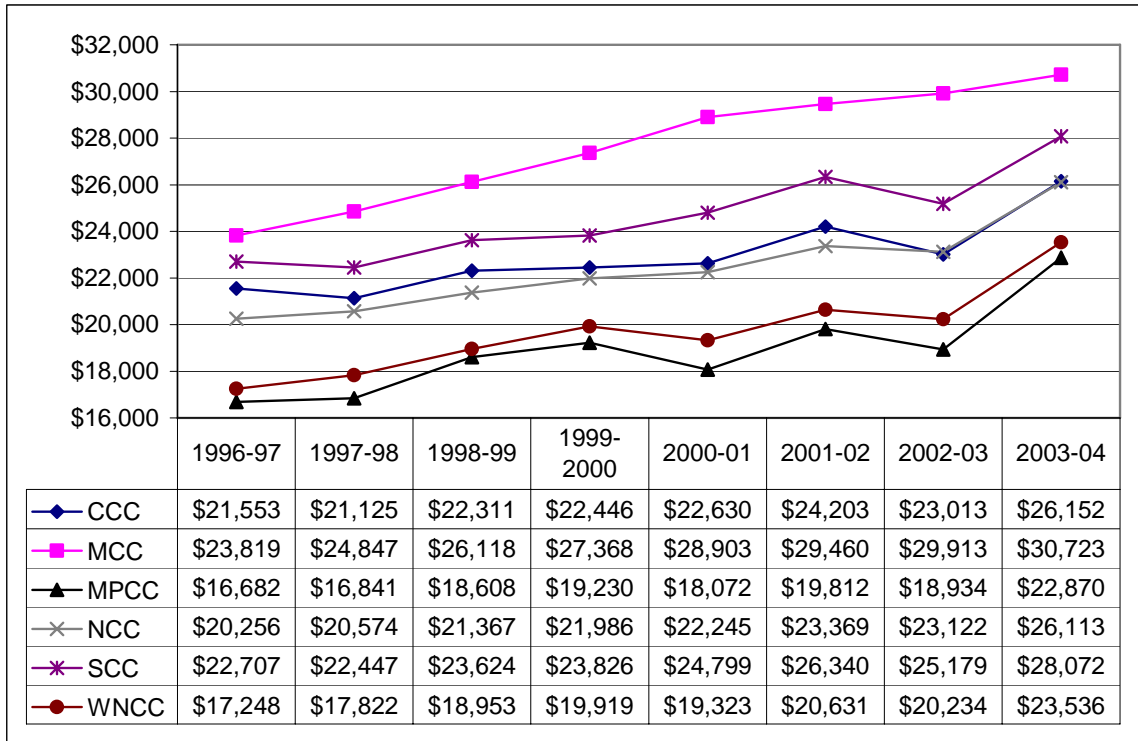

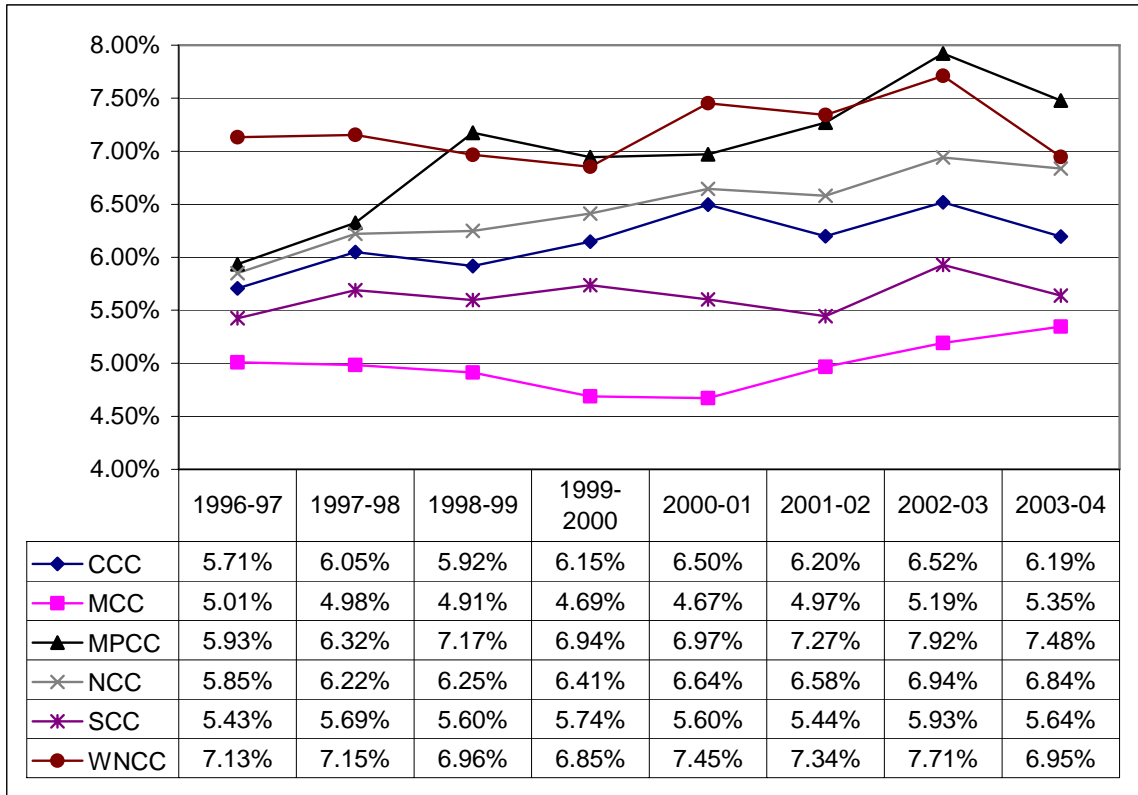

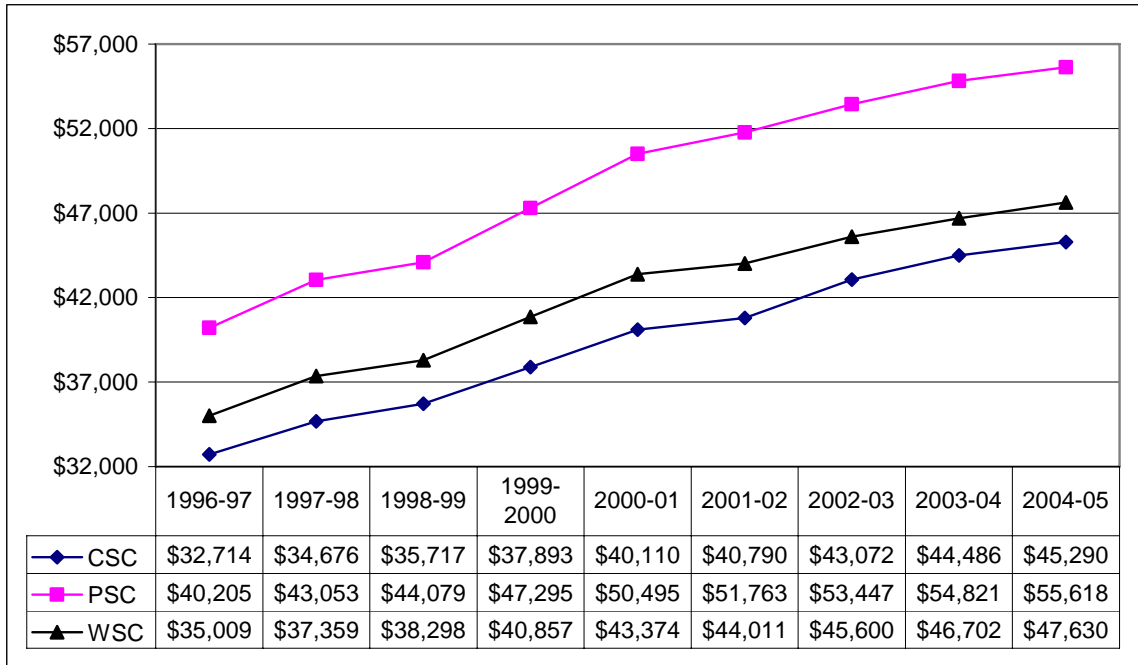

Average Income for Median-income Families Living in Counties Within Each Nebraska State College Service Area 1996-97 through 2004-05



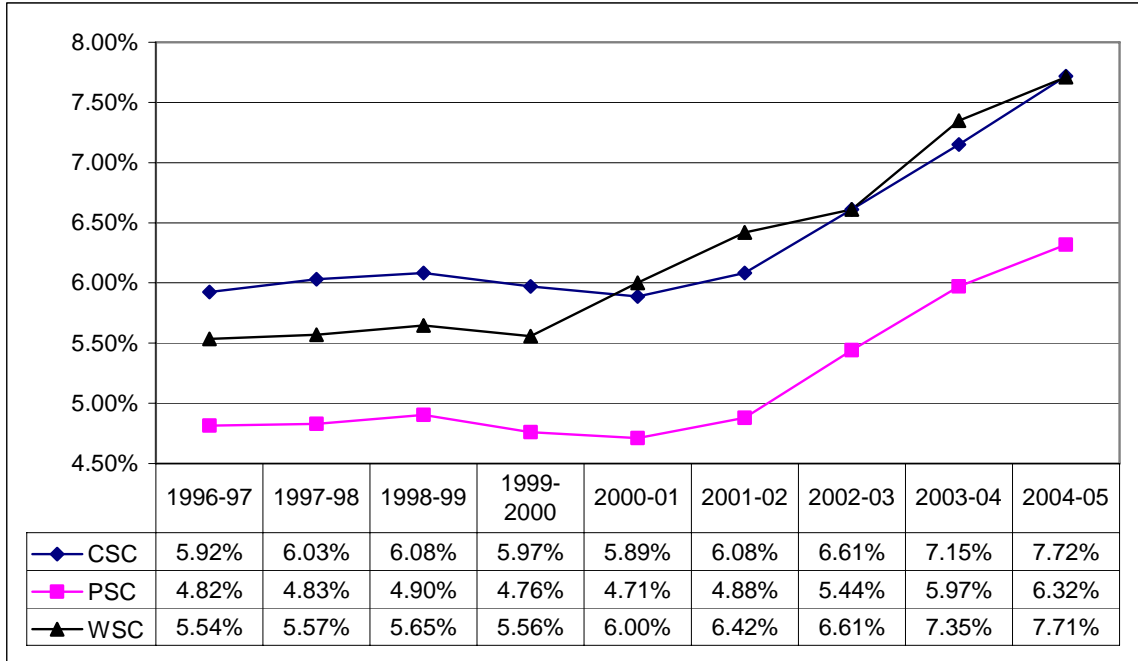

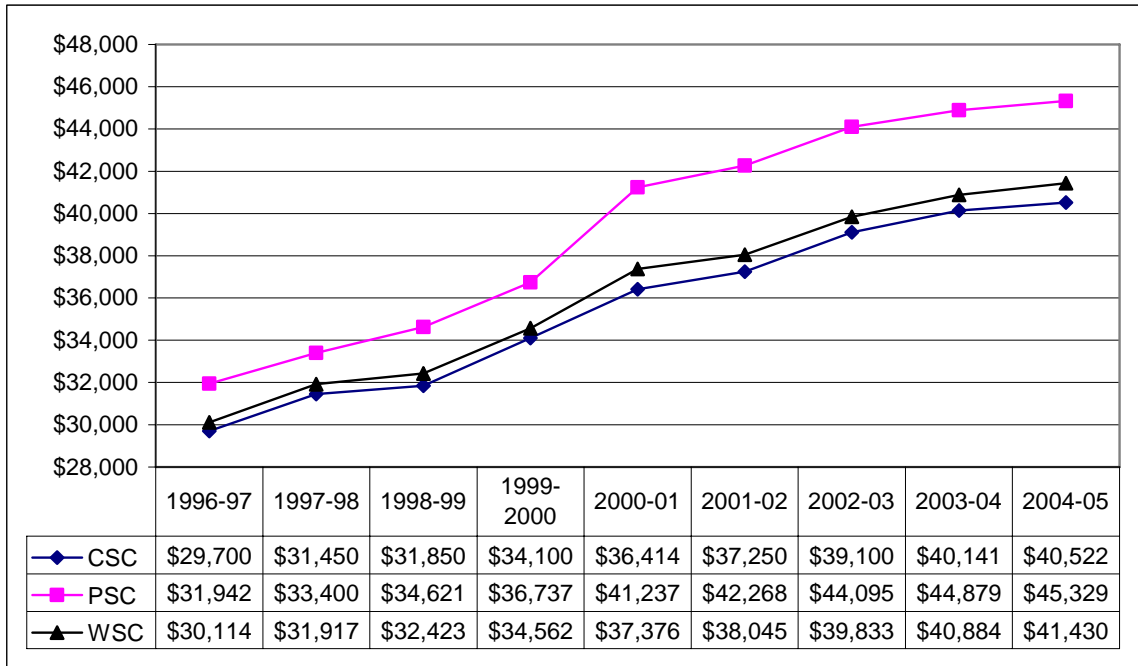

Average Income for Low-income Families Living in Counties Within Each Nebraska State College Service Area 1996-97 through 2004-05



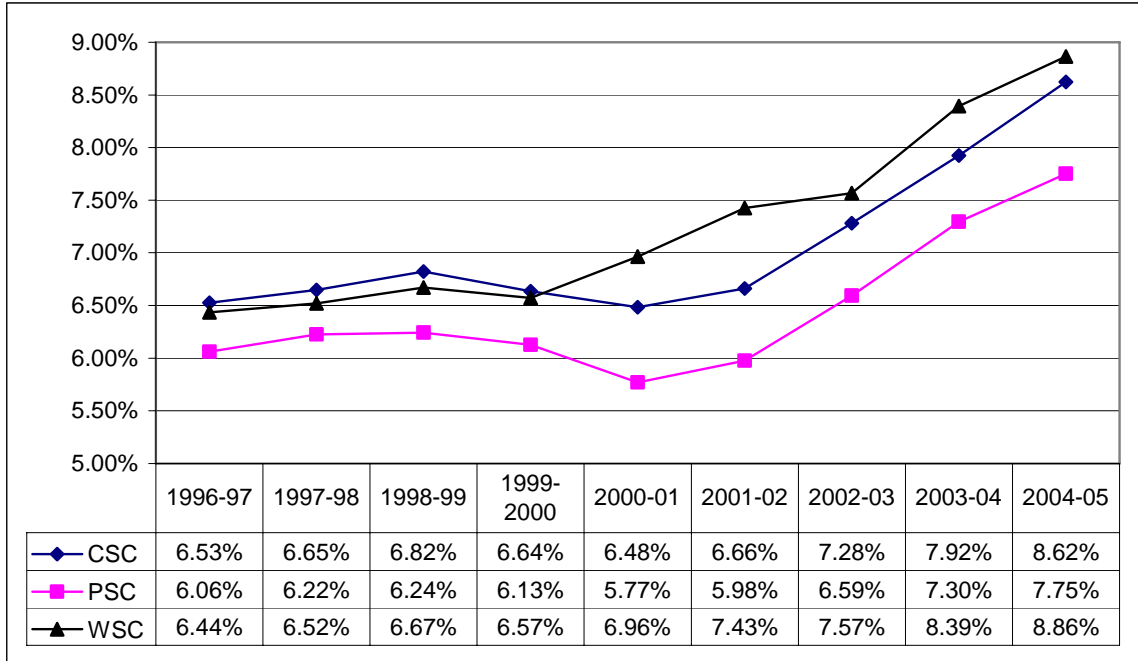

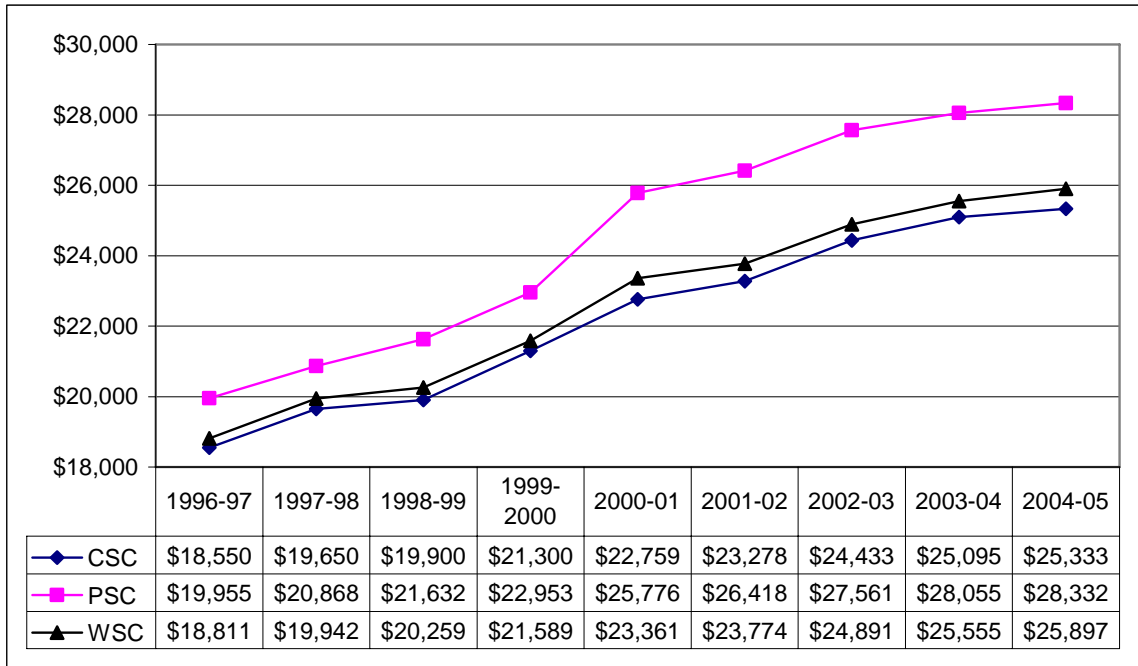

Average Income for Very Low-income Families Living in Counties Within Each Nebraska State College Service Area 1996-97 through 2004-05



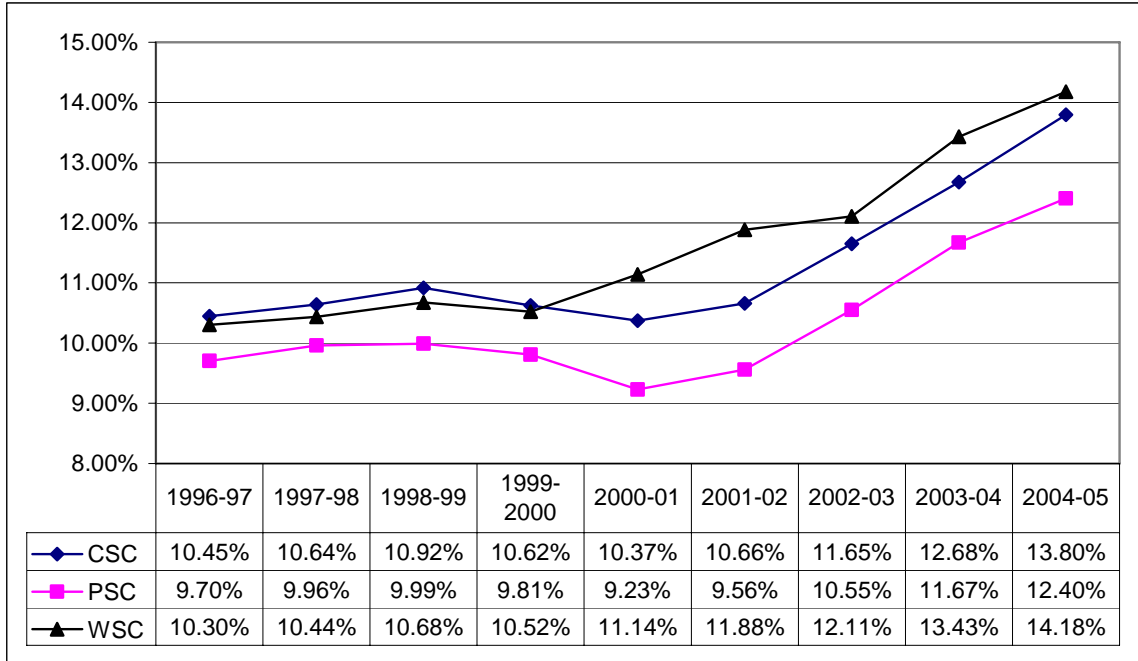

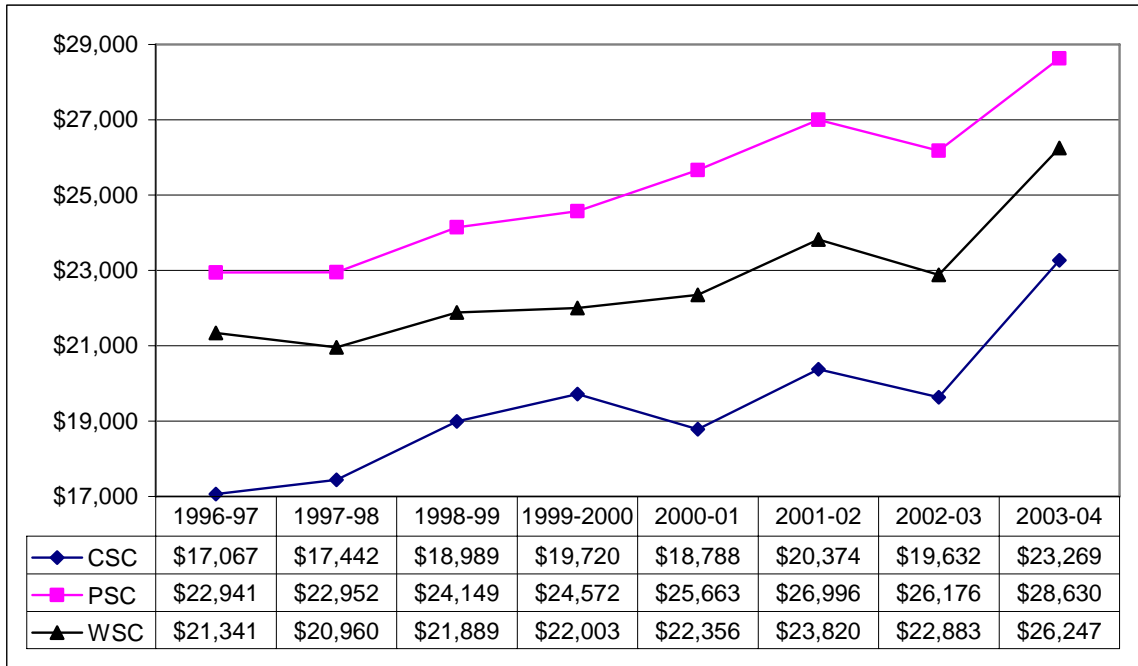

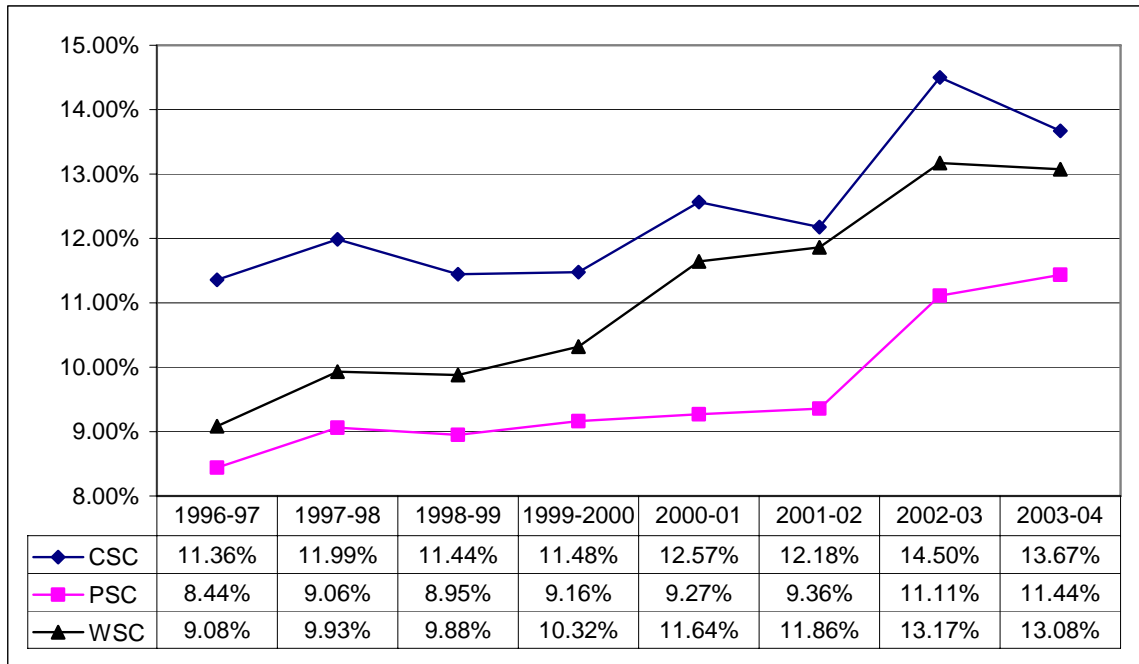

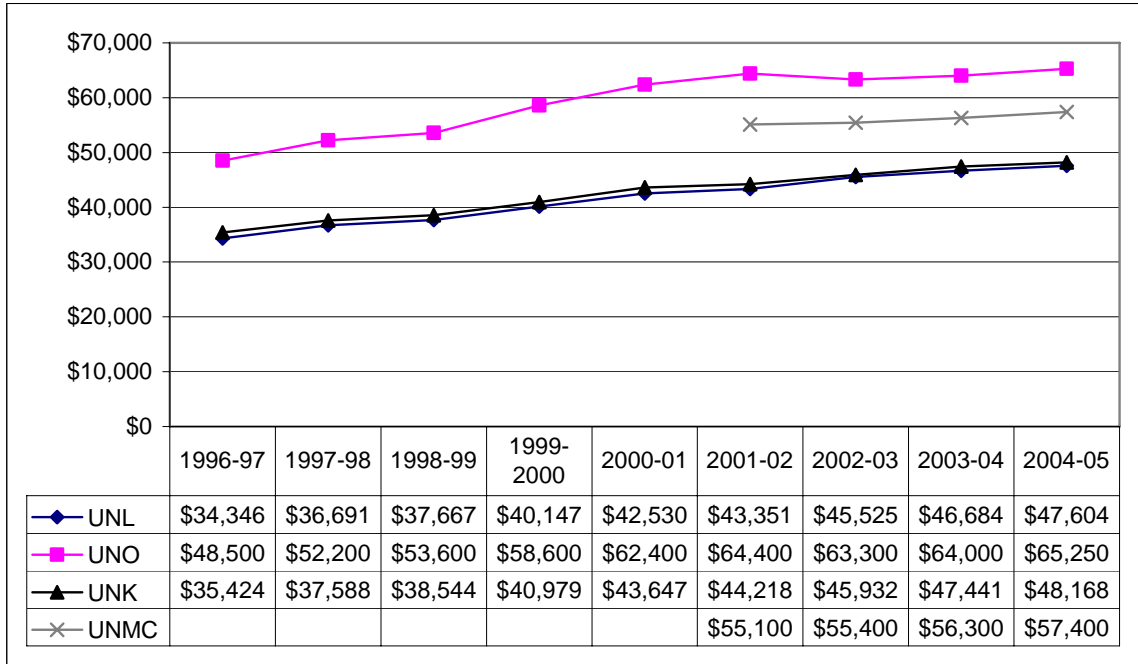

Average Income for Median-income Families Living in Counties Within Each University of Nebraska Campus Service Area 1996-97 through 2004-05



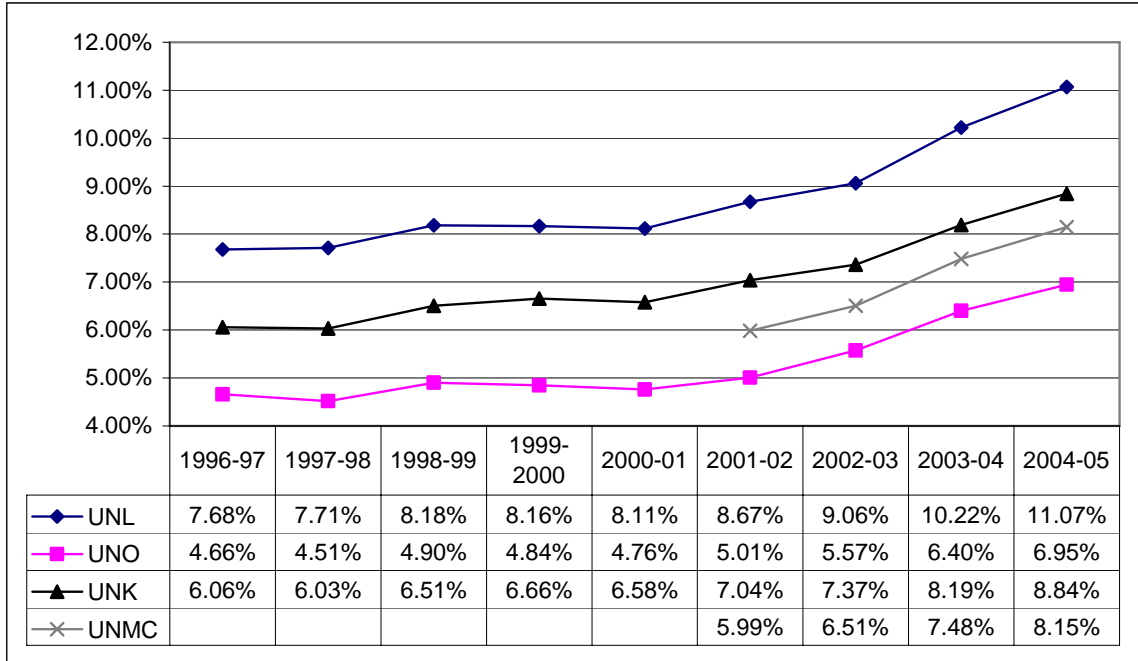

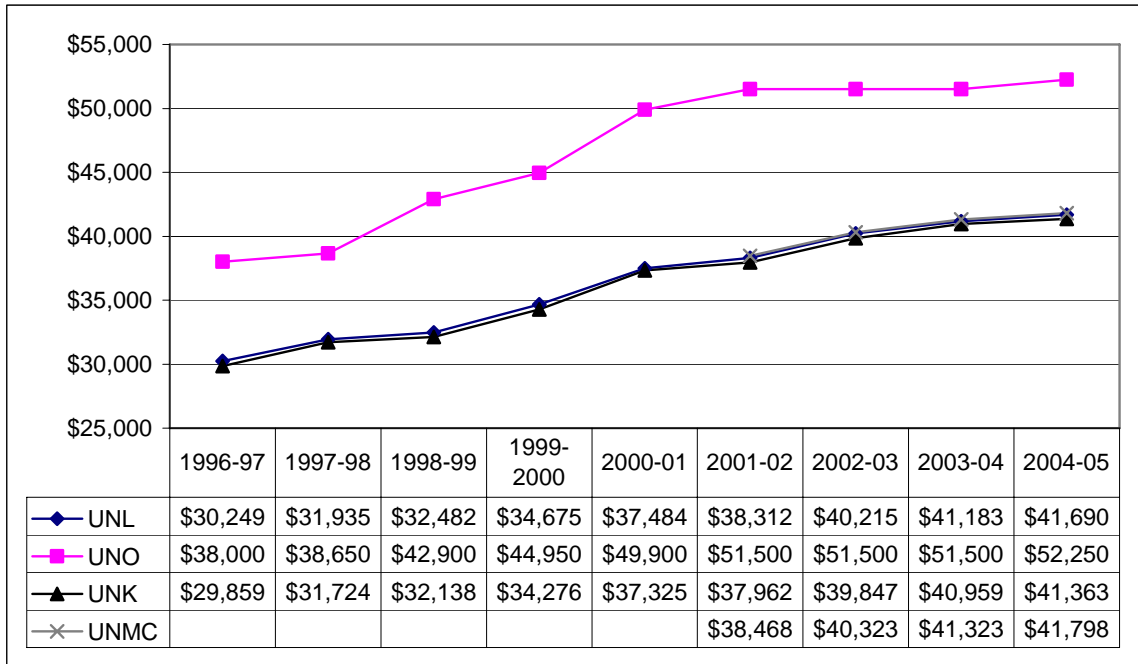

Average Income for Low-income Families Living in Counties Within Each University of Nebraska Campus Service Area 1996-97 through 2004-05



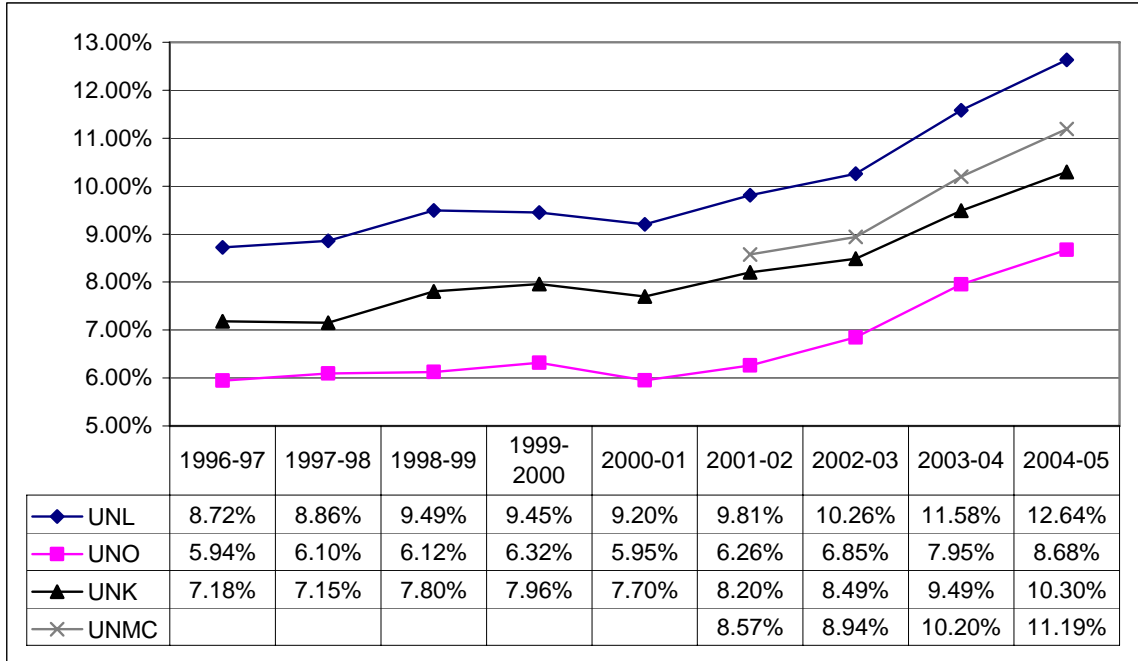

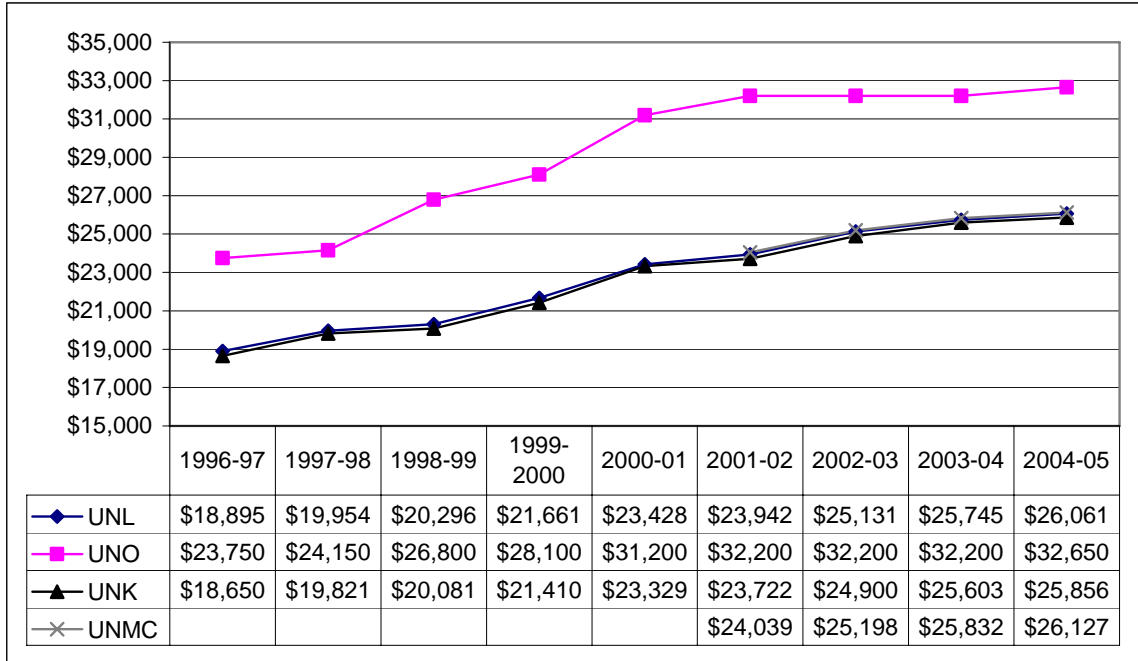

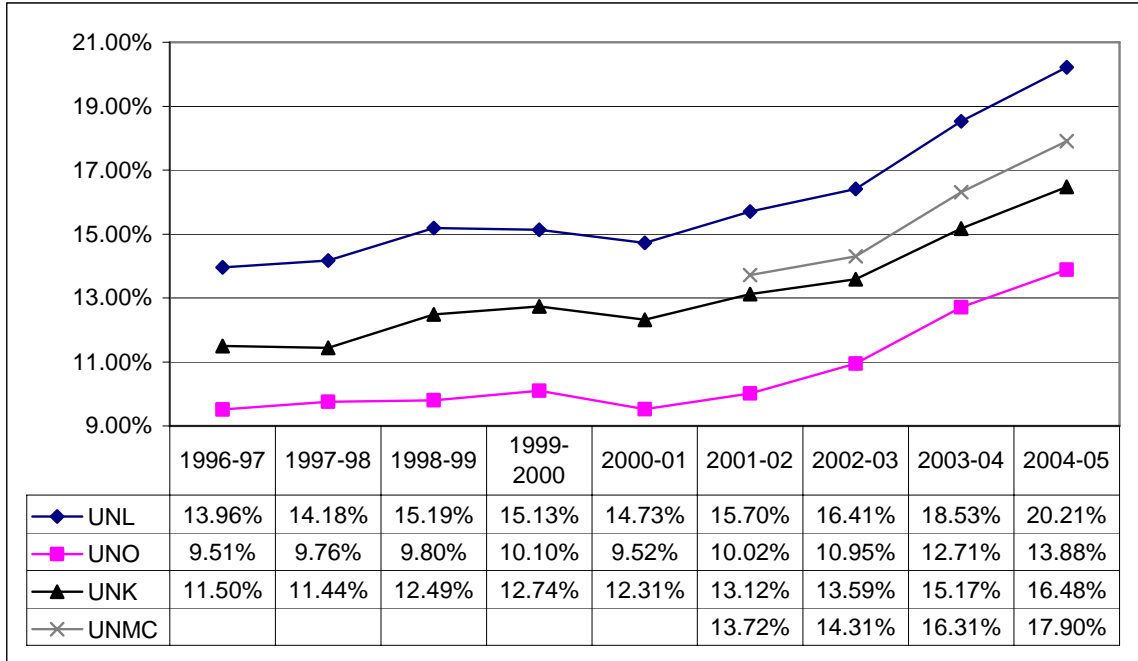

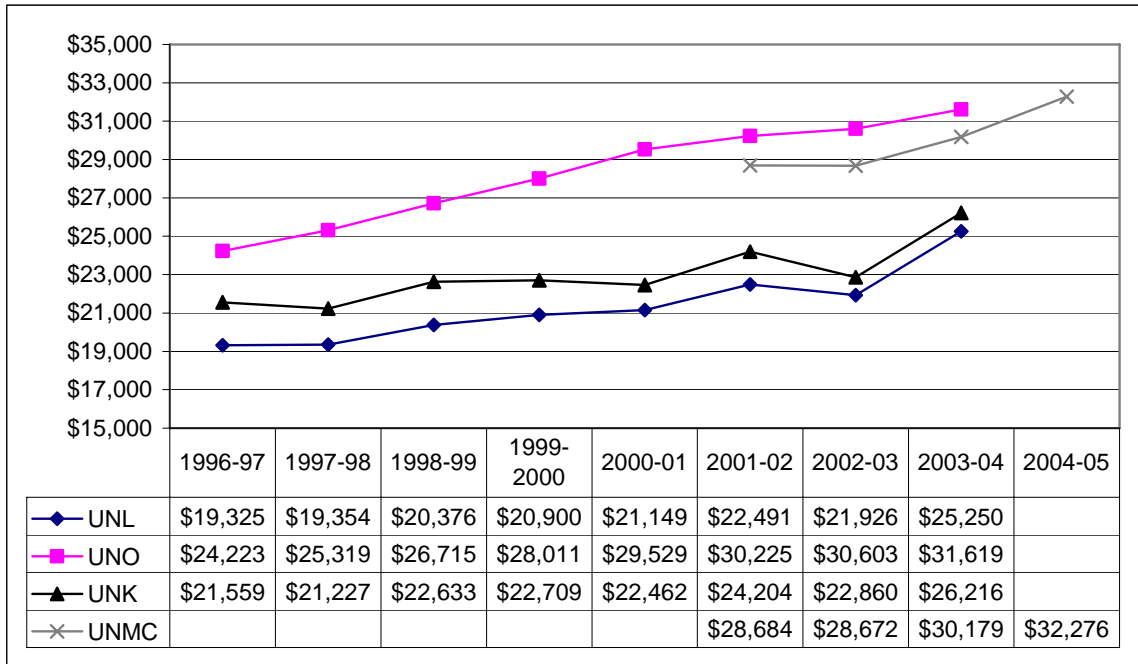

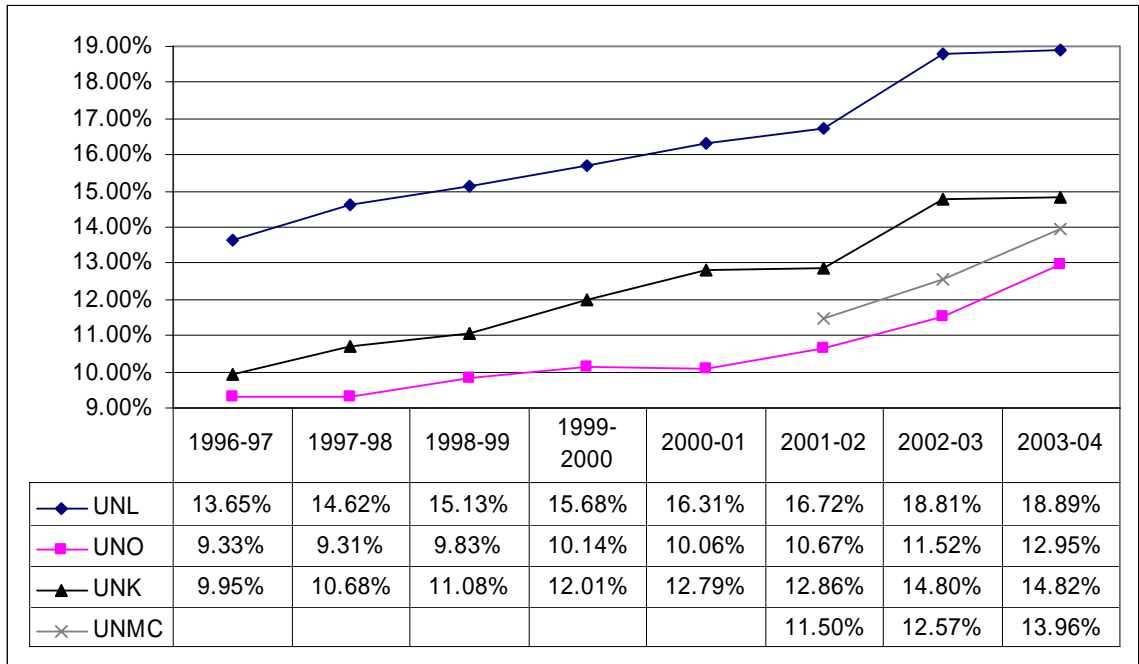

STATE INVESTMENT IN HIGHER EDUCATION

After years of tightening budgets during the country’s most recent recession, many states have been able to breathe a little easier in fiscal year 2006. General fund appropriations in 2005-06 rose nationwide by 6 percent from the previous year, according to a survey completed by the Center for the Study of Education Policy. According to the survey, Nebraska ranked 14th highest in percentage increase from fiscal year 2005 to fiscal year 2006, posting a 7.3 percent increase in state spending on higher education. This is a significant increase, considering that Nebraska ranked 27th in the nation with an 8.7 percent increase over two fiscal years (2004-06).

A recent analysis by the National Center for Higher Education Management Systems (NCHEMS) projects that all states face potential budget deficits from 2005 to 2013. The survey projects that:

- Spending at the state and local level will increase an average 4.4 percent per year from 2005 to 2013 while revenue will increase an average 3.7 percent over the same period;
- Grants from the federal government to state and local governments are expected to be cut substantially due to the current federal fiscal outlook; and
- In the majority of the states, growth in other service areas such as K-12 education, social services, corrections, and especially Medicaid will reduce the amount of funding available to higher education.

NCHEMS projects that Nebraska will have a funding shortfall of approximately 4.3 percent by 2013. (Jones, NCHEMS)

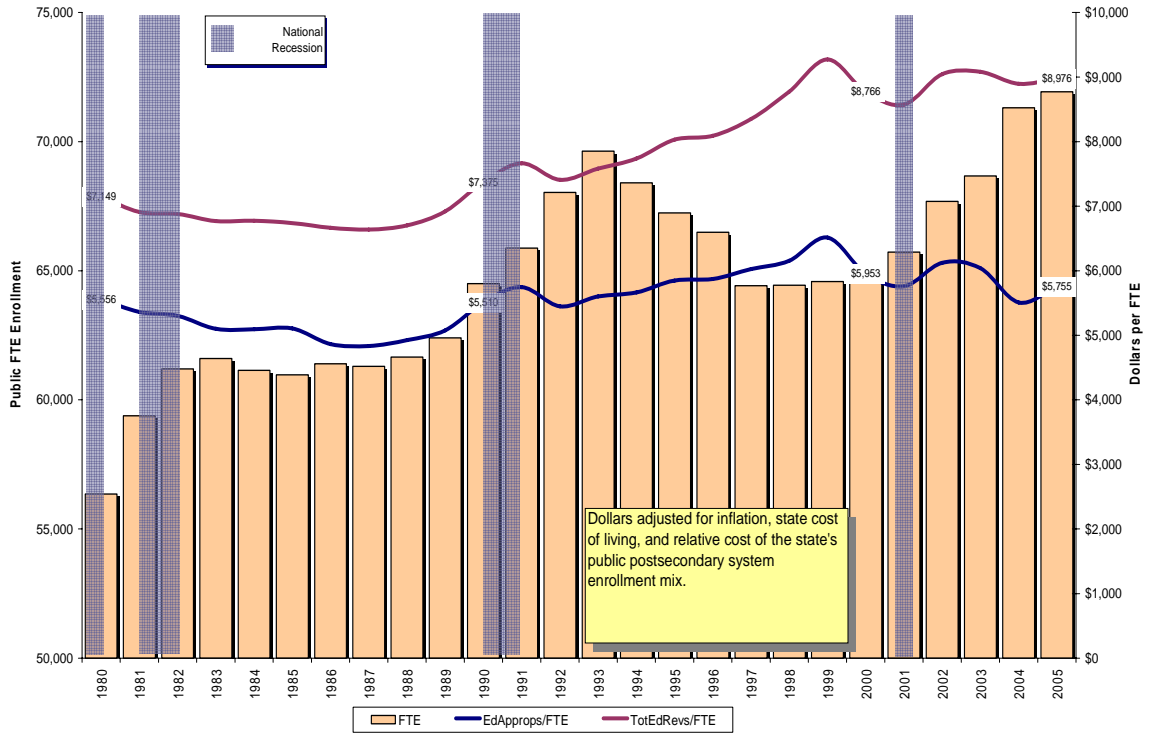
This section of the report covers two topics: appropriation comparisons within the state and appropriation comparisons with other states.

Appropriation Comparisons within the State

The following information discusses state appropriation per full-time equivalent student. The dollar amounts exclude funds appropriated or reappropriated for tuition and capital appropriations. The base state appropriation is divided by the number of full-time equivalent students at the institutions to arrive at the appropriation per full-time student equivalent. (Note: Enrollment decreases can therefore lead to increases in appropriations per full-time equivalent student.) Additionally, the community college sector receives income from property taxes; therefore, the report provides a second set of data where the state appropriation and property taxes are added together to derive a total appropriation per full-time equivalent student within the community college sector.

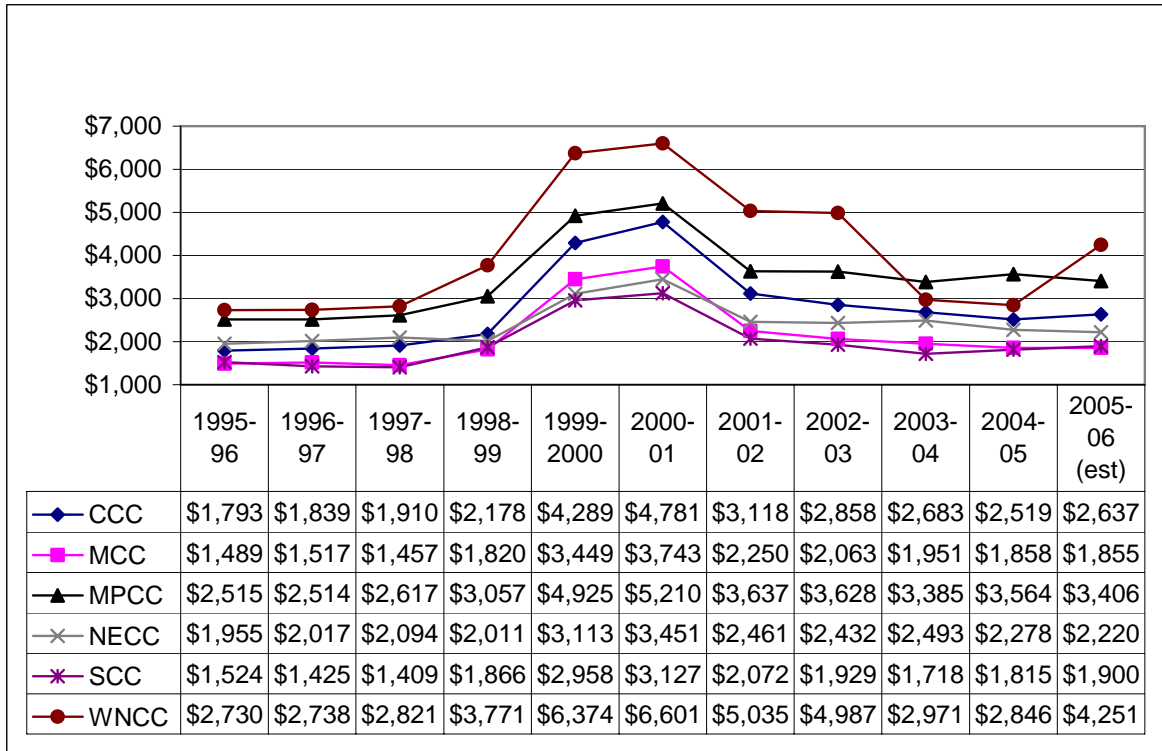

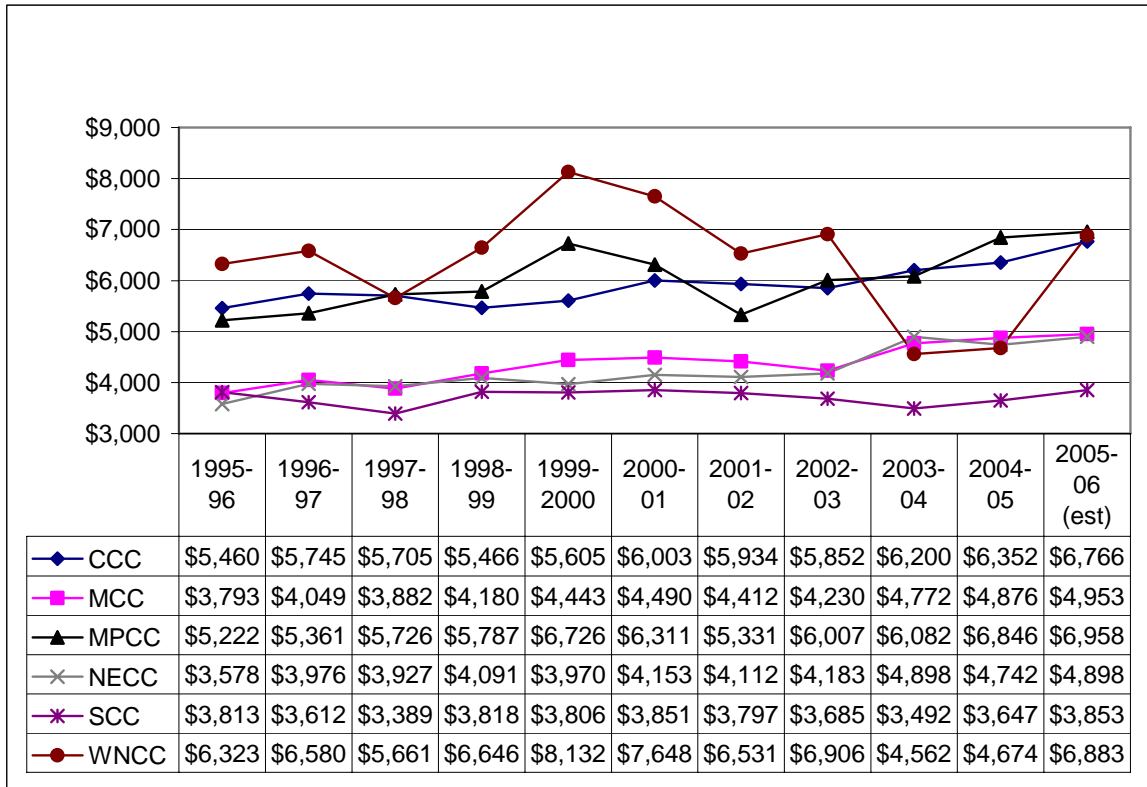

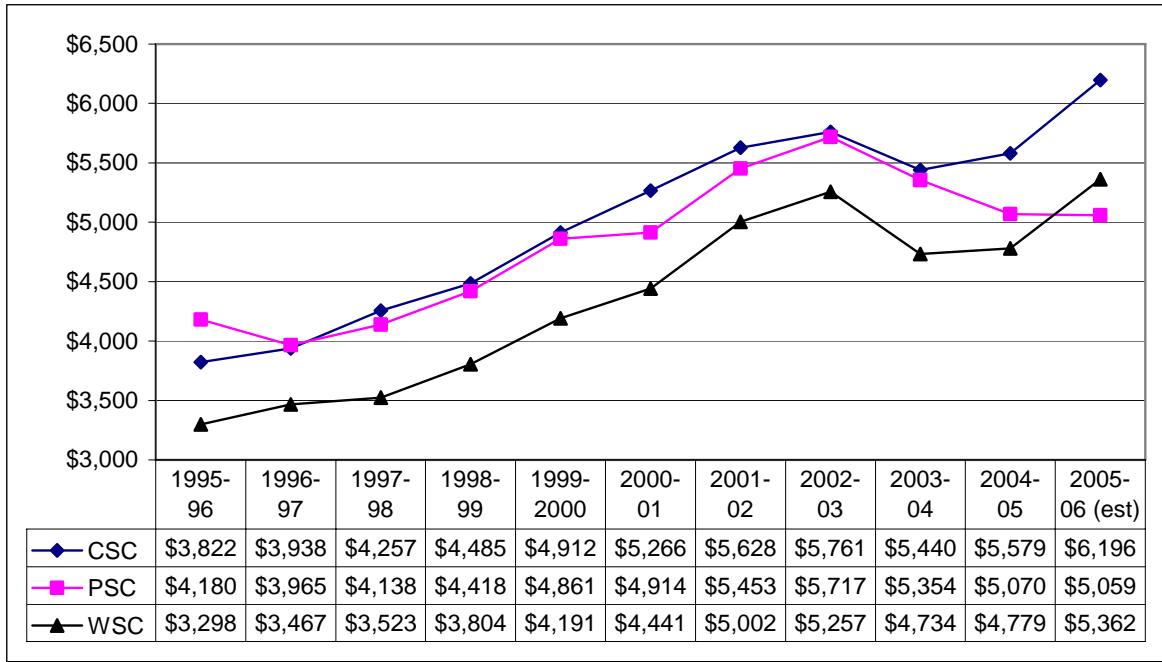

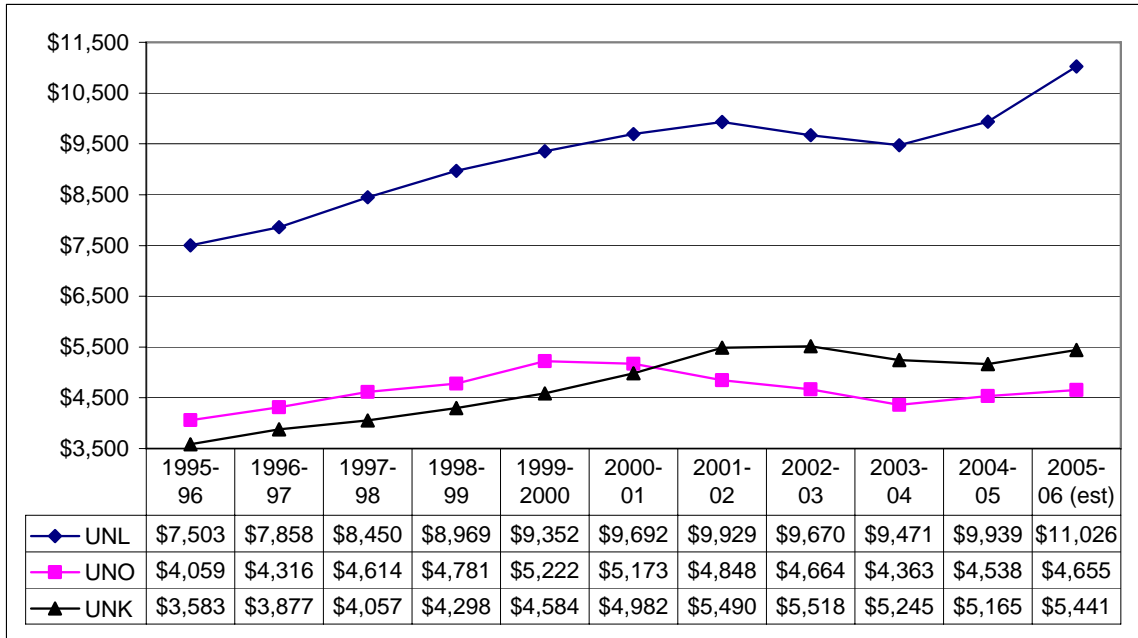

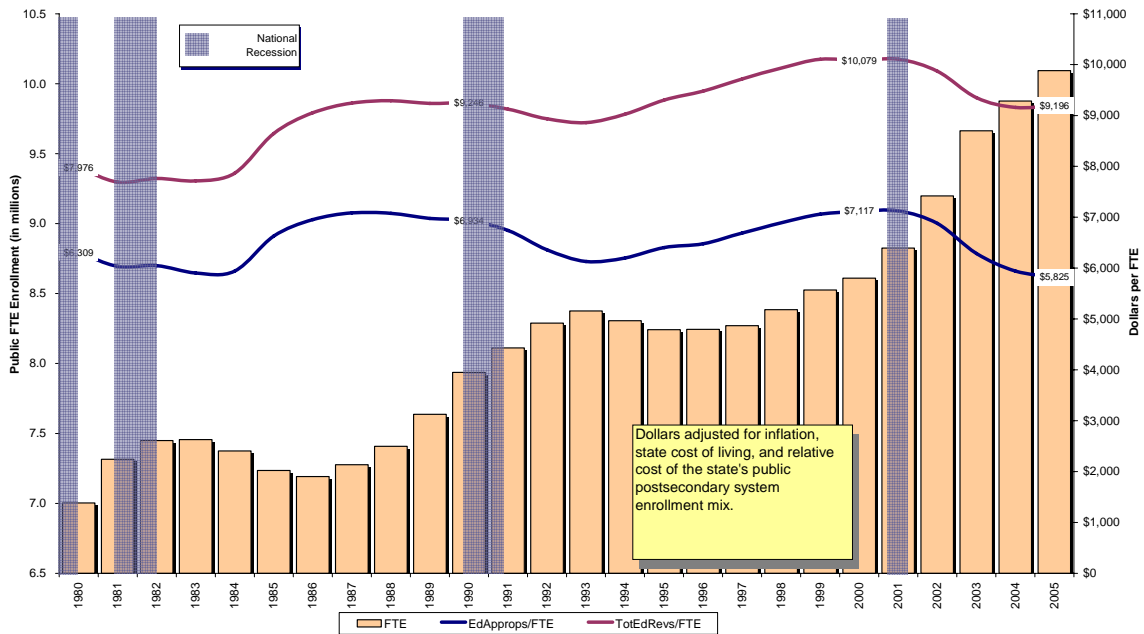

One of the major statewide goals in Nebraska’s *Comprehensive Plan* states that:

Nebraska will value higher education and support its investment in public higher education through fair and reliable funding policies that provide appropriate levels of support to enable institutions to excel and meet the educational needs of the State and its students. (*Comprehensive Plan*, 2003, p. 8)

As evidenced by state appropriations, Nebraska has generally been supportive of higher education.

In FY06, Nebraska's appropriation of state tax dollars for higher education operating expenses was \$542,425,000. This is a 7.3 percent increase over FY05, which places the state 14th in the nation in the percent of increase. Nationwide, the average one-year increase was 6.0 percent. Additionally, the \$542,425,000 represents a 10.1 percent increase over five years (FY01 to FY06), which places Nebraska 27th in the nation. Nationally, states increased their appropriations by an average of 9.9 percent during that same period. From FY96 to FY06, the state appropriation has increased 40.7 percent, which placed Nebraska 29th in the nation. On average, all states increased their appropriations to higher education by 50.1 percent over the same ten years. (*Grapevine*, 2006)

Other ways to measure a state's investment in higher education include appropriations per \$1,000 in personal income, and appropriations per capita. For FY06, Nebraska's appropriation per \$1,000 of personal income was \$9.33. This was significantly over the national average of \$6.56, which gave Nebraska a rank of 13th in the nation. This is a slight increase from the FY04 amount of \$9.24, but still lags behind the FY02 amount of \$10.84. (*Grapevine*, 2006)

Additionally for FY06, Nebraska's appropriation per capita was \$308.41. This, too, was significantly over the national average of \$225.25 and placed Nebraska 7th in the nation which is the same ranking as in FY04. (*Grapevine*, 2006)

The federal government provides several types of financial aid. The U.S. Department of Education (ED) publishes a comprehensive source of information about federal student aid programs, *The Student Guide*. It is available free on the Internet at www.studentaid.ed.gov.

Common types of federal student aid are:

Federal Pell Grant: Federal Pell Grants are awarded to undergraduates who have not earned a bachelor’s degree. Students must demonstrate eligibility by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), which is available from ED. Pell Grants do not have to be repaid. The award range on the Pell Grant for award year 2005-06 is \$400 to \$4,050.

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG): Undergraduate students with exceptional need and who have not received a bachelor’s degree are eligible to receive the FSEOG. FSEOG awards can range from \$100 to \$4,000 and do not have to be repaid, but awards are subject to the availability of funds at a student’s institution.

Federal Work-Study (FWS): FWS provides on- and off-campus jobs for graduate and undergraduate students who demonstrate financial need. The amounts awarded vary from institution to institution.

Leveraging Educational Assistance Partnership (LEAP): LEAP allocates funds to states to establish state grant programs. States must, at a minimum, match LEAP grants dollar-for-dollar. These grants are then awarded to students who demonstrate high financial need. (In Nebraska, these funds are part of the Nebraska State Grant Program.)

Perkins Loan: Perkins Loans are fixed, low-interest (5 percent) loans available to graduate and undergraduate students with financial need. Undergraduate students may borrow up to \$4,000 per year, and graduate students may borrow up to \$6,000 per year depending on the availability of funds at the institution.

Subsidized and Unsubsidized Stafford Loans: Stafford Loans are available to undergraduate and graduate students. Students must demonstrate financial need

in order to qualify for a Subsidized Stafford Loan, where the interest is paid by the federal government while the student is in school. Unsubsidized Stafford Loans are available to all students, but borrowers are responsible for the interest while in school. Loan limits for Stafford Loans range from \$2,625 to \$18,500 depending on grade level and dependency status.

Parent Loan for Undergraduate Students (PLUS): PLUS loans are available to the parents of dependent undergraduate students. Parents may borrow up to the student's cost of attendance, less any other financial aid received.

Hope and Lifetime Learning Tax Credits: The Hope and Lifetime Learning Tax Credits permit families to claim a tax credit on their federal tax forms. The Hope Tax Credit can be claimed for the student's first two years of study, while the Lifetime Learning Tax Credit is available to all students studying at a college or university.

As discussed earlier in this report, tuition and mandatory fees and the student payment share have increased considerably over the past ten years. Therefore, having financial aid available to assist with college expenses is a necessity for many students. While the state has been generous in its financial support of the Nebraska State Grant program, other types of financial assistance have not received funding increases, and some have actually received decreased funding. These include the Federal Pell Grant and the LEAP program. As a consequence, students have relied primarily upon student loans, both federal and private, to fund their education.

Tuition Waivers

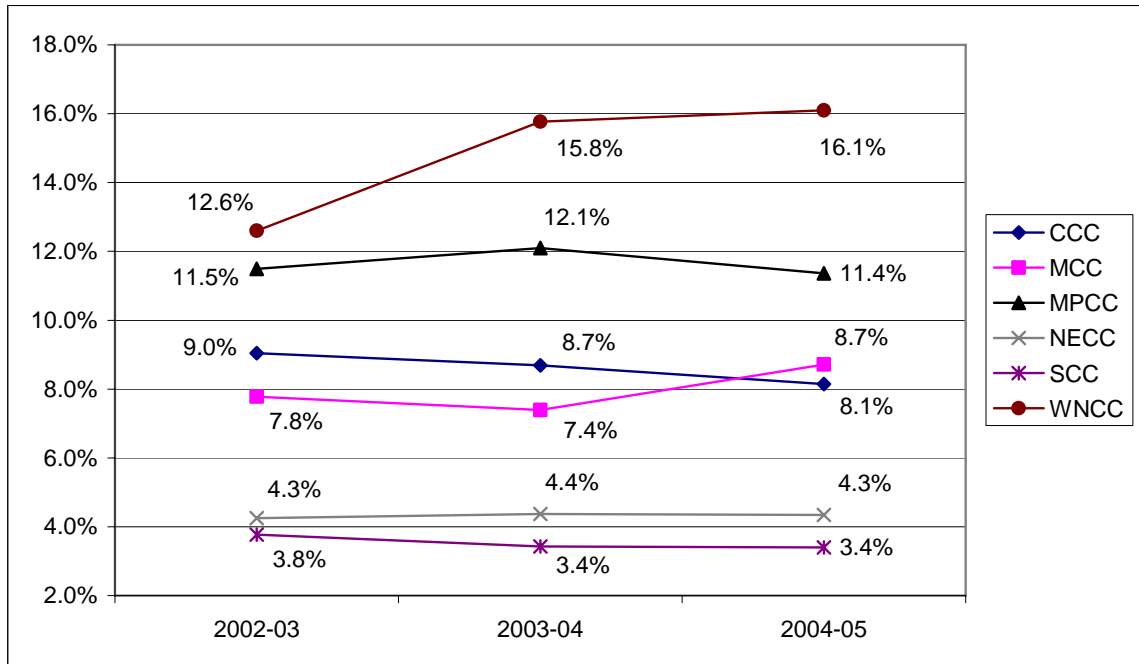
Many institutions routinely waive or discount a portion or all of an individual student's tuition charges as a form of financial assistance. Tuition waivers can be awarded for a number of different reasons, such as working as a campus ambassador, demonstrating financial need, being a nonresident student, serving as a graduate assistant, or declaring a certain major.

The average discount rate for four-year private colleges was 39.4 percent of the published tuition price in 2002, the most recent information available. In the same year at public institutions, the average discount rate was 13.9 percent. (*Tuition Discounting Study*, the National Association of College and University Business Officers 2003)

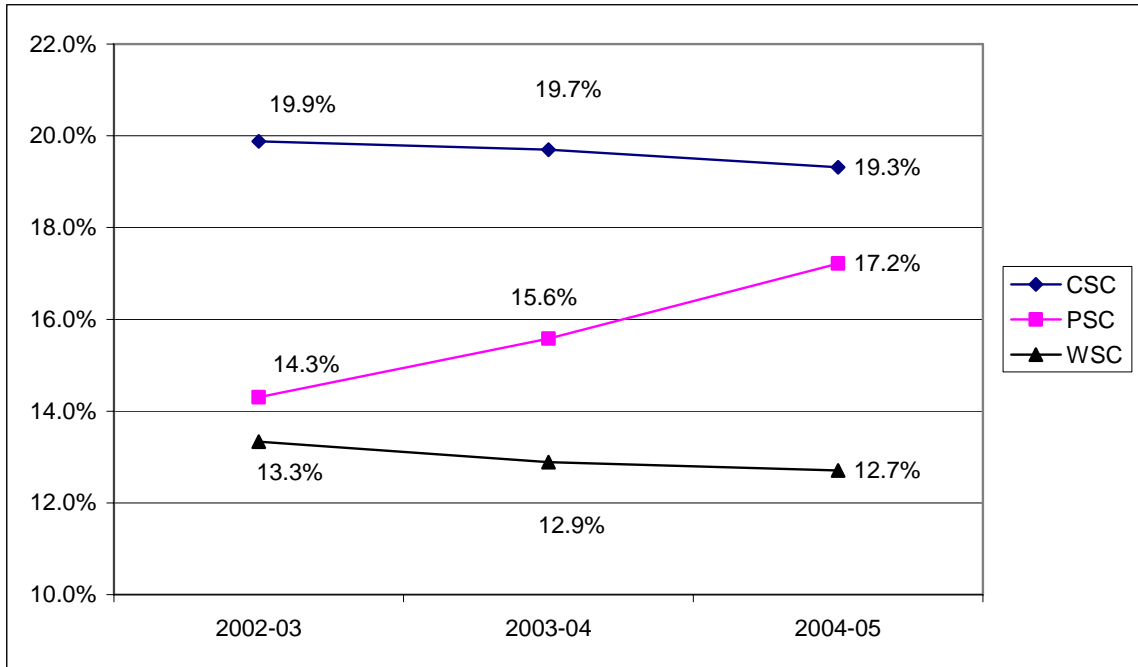
**Tuition Discount Rates at Nebraska's Community Colleges

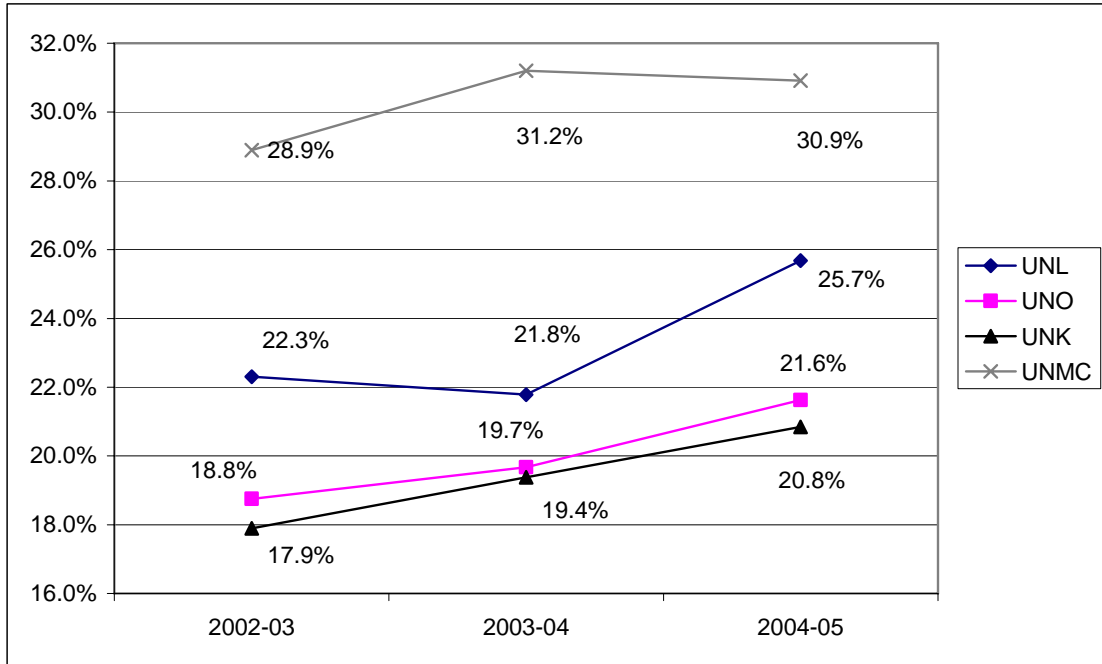

State Grant Trends

The Nebraska State Grant (NSG) is administered by the Commission and is awarded to students in consultation with financial aid administrators at Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions. The NSG can only be awarded to students who are residents of Nebraska, who are attending a Nebraska college or university, and who are eligible for the Federal Pell Grant. While the state has increased funding over the past few years, additional funds are needed. In 2003-04, Nebraska ranked 38th among the states in estimated need-based student aid grant dollars per full-time undergraduate enrollment. (*Report on State-Sponsored Student Financial Aid*, 2005, pg. 23) The ranking has remained the same since 2002-03. These relatively low funding levels resulted in Nebraska receiving an F for affordability in *Measuring Up: The National Report Card on Higher Education*. (2004, p. 24)

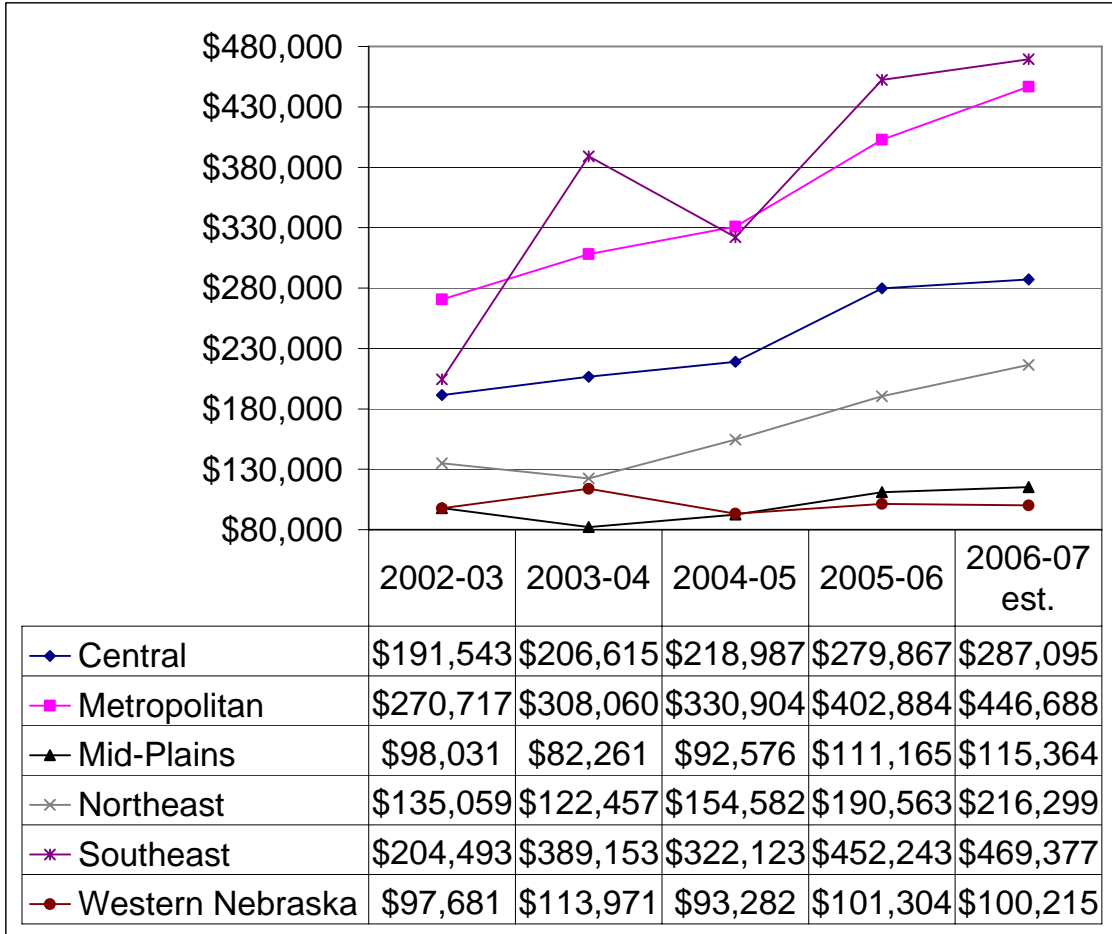
In 2002, the Commission recommended that state grant dollars follow the students. Since this is a program for low-income students, the institutions with the most low-income students will receive a greater percentage of the state grant dollars. The Commission defined low-income students as those who are eligible for the Federal Pell Grant. This recommendation was accepted by the Legislature and included in the allocation formula developed by the Legislature when it created the Nebraska State Grant in LB574 [2003].

The following charts show the allocations of state grant funds to Nebraska's public institutions over the four years of the program, followed by a chart that shows the allocations by sector.¹

2002-03 to 2006-07**

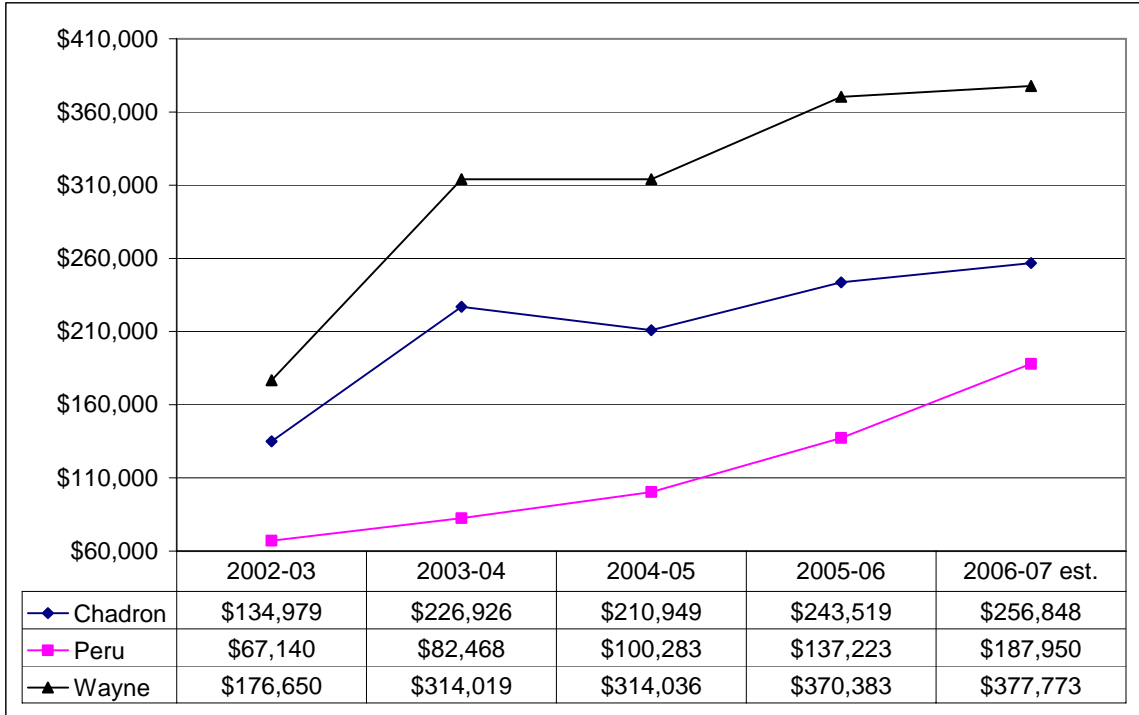

2002-03 to 2006-07**

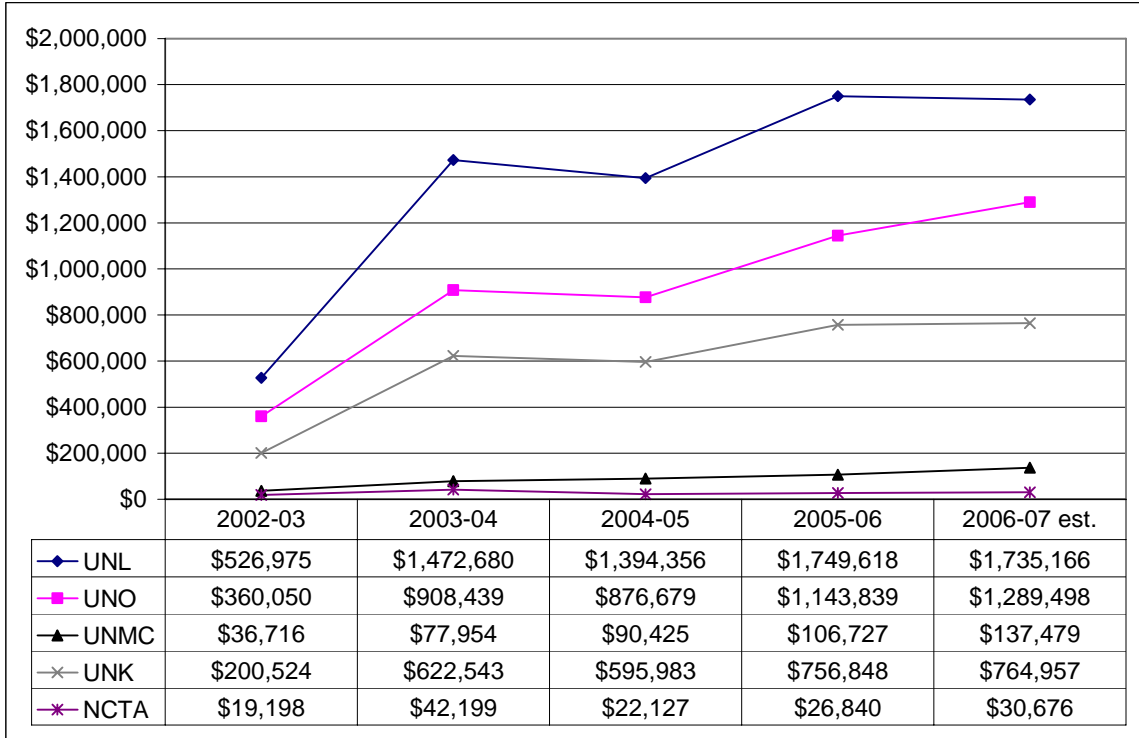

2002-03 to 2006-07**

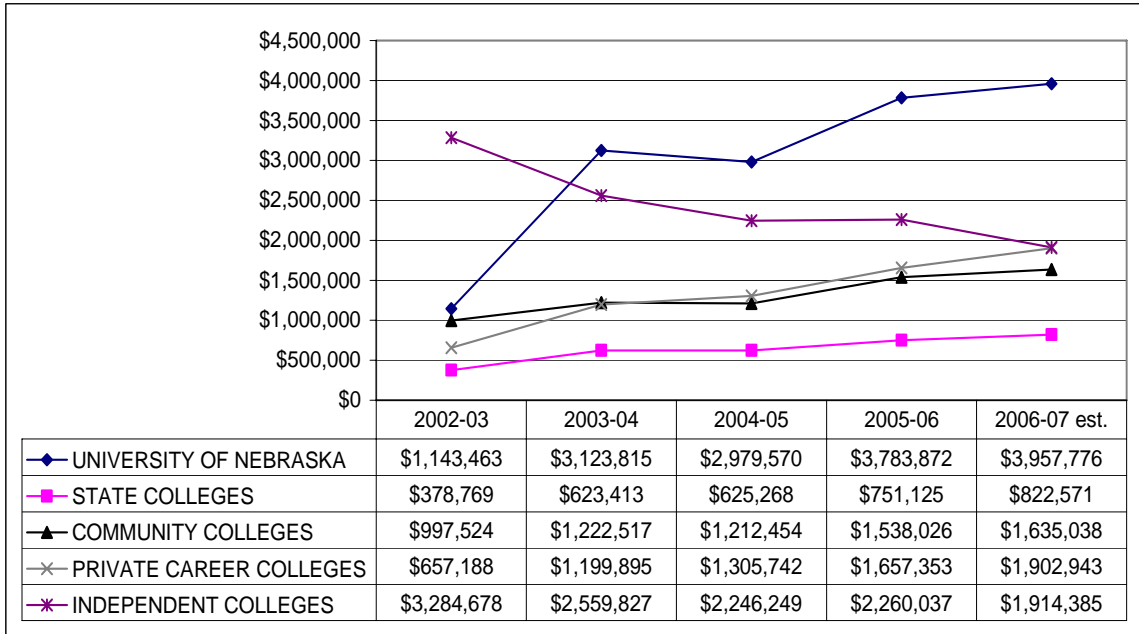

Student Loan Trends

Student loan borrowing by far makes up the bulk of financial assistance available to students. Nationwide, borrowing from the federal loan programs (Perkins, Subsidized Stafford, Unsubsidized Stafford, PLUS) made up 70 percent of the aid awarded by the federal government in 2004-05. In 1993, less than half of college graduating seniors had borrowed funds to help pay for their educational costs. Today, two-thirds of those graduating seniors have borrowed. (*National Crosstalk*, Spring 2006, p. 10) Nationwide, student loan borrowing from 1994-95 to 2004-05 increased 145 percent, and from 1999-2000 to 2004-05, it increased 69 percent. (*Trends in Student Aid*, 2005, pp. 10-11) **Nationwide, the average debt for students graduating with their bachelor's degree is \$19,200.** (*National Crosstalk*, Spring 2006, p. 10)

To put this borrowing in perspective, look at a student graduating with \$20,000 in student loan debt from the student's undergraduate education. To repay that loan in 10 years at 6.8 percent interest¹, the student's monthly payment will be \$230 per month. By the time the loan is paid in full, the student will have paid back the \$20,000 borrowed plus \$7,619 in interest. However, because the student may have other expenses associated with graduating and obtaining a job, the student may decide to lower the monthly payment by stretching out the repayment term to 20 years. In that case, with the monthly payment reduced to \$153 per month, by the time the loan is paid in full the student will have paid \$16,640 in interest. (*National Crosstalk*, Spring 2006, p. 8)

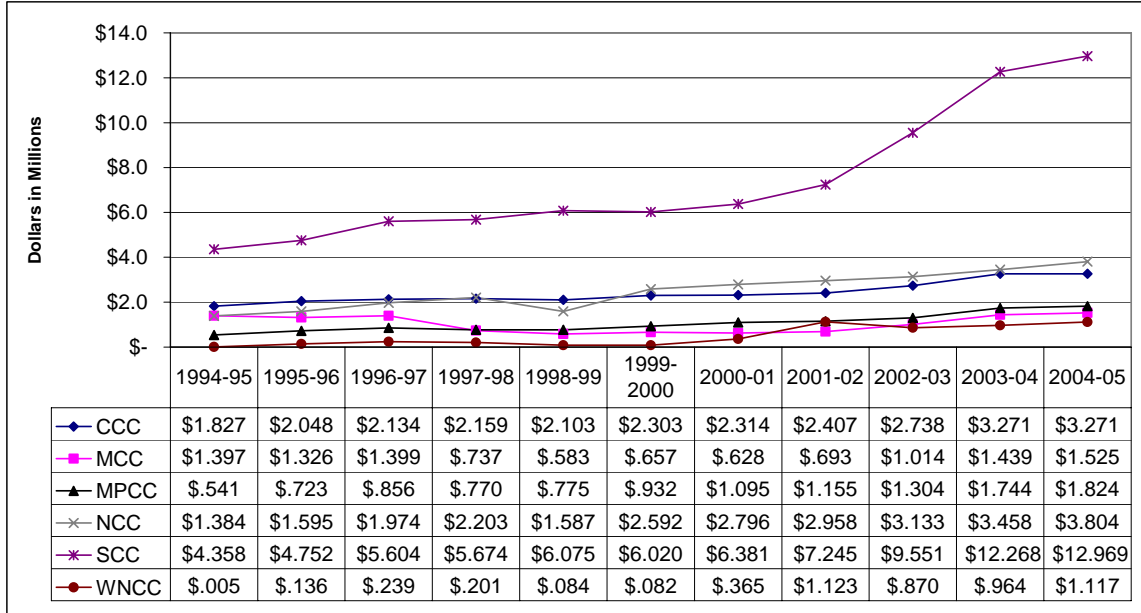

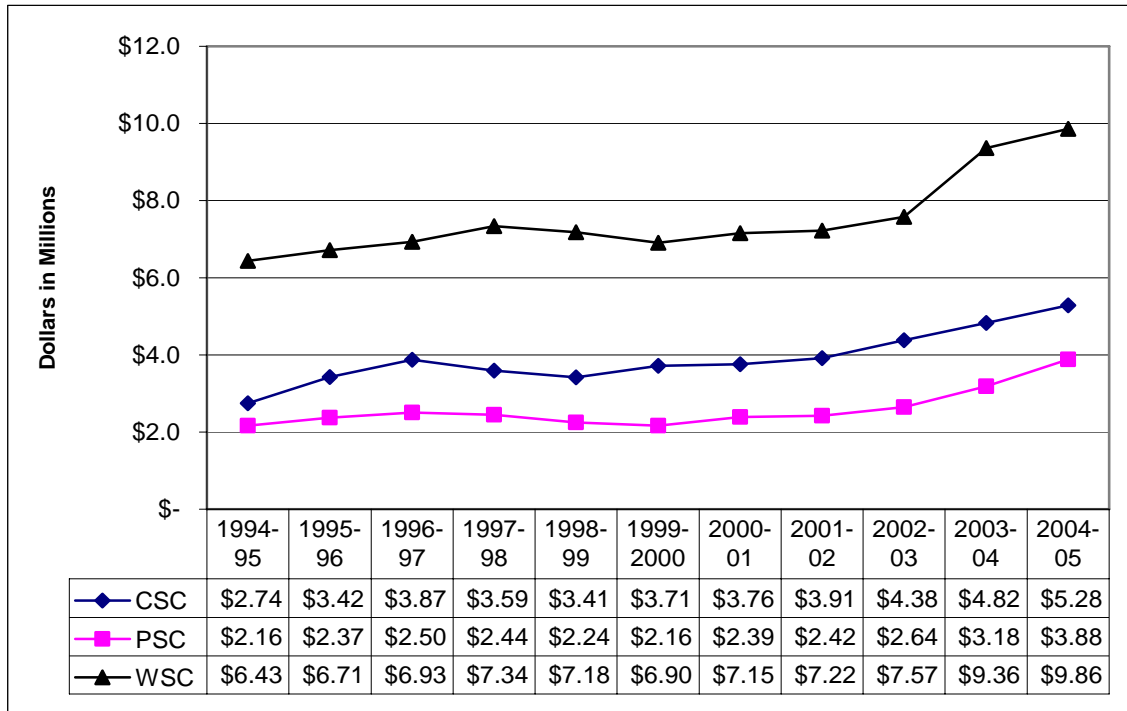

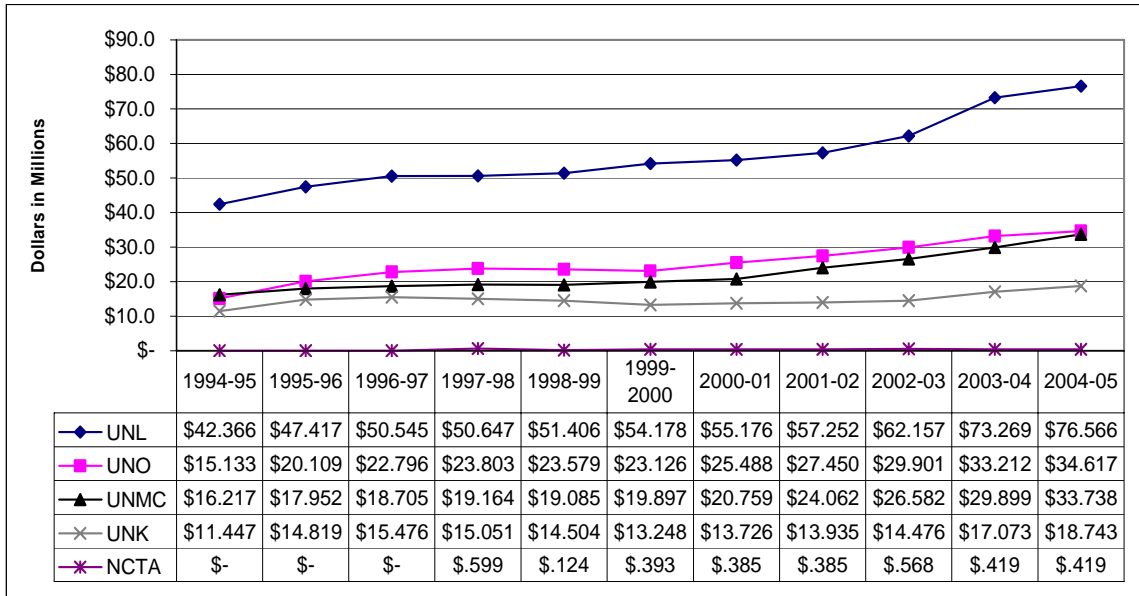

CONCLUSIONS

In this *2006 Tuition, Fees, and Financial Aid Report*, significant findings for each of the three interrelated areas of affordability, state investment, and financial aid will affect the future of Nebraska higher education. The findings demonstrate a need for change in supporting the state's public postsecondary institutions.

Affordability of Higher Education

Affording a higher education has become more difficult for students and their families in Nebraska. The tuition and mandatory fees a full-time resident undergraduate student must pay at a Nebraska public postsecondary institution has seen double- and triple-digit increases over the past 10 years. In addition, students are contributing a higher share of revenue at all but one of Nebraska's higher educational institutions. Therefore, families are contributing more of their income to the tuition and mandatory fees costs of educating a family member and costs are rising faster than incomes. Nevertheless, those points are less dramatic for most Nebraska institutions than at their peers in other states.

- All but one of Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions charge less than the 2005-06 average tuition and mandatory fees for a resident, undergraduate student when compared to their peers. The exception is the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, which is slightly higher than its peers' average.
- Compared to 2005-06 resident tuition and fees, the percent of 2005-06 non-resident tuition and mandatory fees is considerably less than the peer's average for all but two of Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions. The exceptions are the University of Nebraska at Omaha and the University of Nebraska at Kearney.
- All but three of Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions have student contribution shares in 2005-06 that are less than their peer's average. The exceptions are Metropolitan Community College, Mid-Plains Community College, and Southeast Community College.

State Investment in Higher Education

State investment in higher education is increasingly threatened by other obligations. Although the state has increased its investment levels through appropriations for Nebraska's public colleges and universities, students and their families are still contributing a higher share of institutional revenue through tuition and mandatory fees. In addition, research has shown a declining future in the state's investment levels. State appropriations will likely continue to increase; however, appropriations are not likely to surpass the increasing rates of tuition

and mandatory fees. Therefore, families will likely be contributing larger portions of their income to educate their students in Nebraska, and/or student debt loads will continue to increase.

Comparisons with Peers

- When comparing 2005-06 state appropriations at Nebraska's community colleges to their peers', only Western Nebraska Community College has a higher appropriation per full-time equivalent student when compared to its peer's average.
- When comparing 2005-06 state appropriations and property tax revenue at Nebraska's community colleges to their peers', only Mid-Plains Community College and Western Nebraska Community College have a higher appropriation per full-time equivalent student when compared to their peers' averages.
- The 2005-06 state appropriations per full-time equivalent student at Chadron State College and Peru State College are higher than their peer averages, while Wayne State College's is less than its peer's average.
- The 2005-06 state appropriations per full-time equivalent student is significantly higher at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and slightly higher at the University of Nebraska at Kearney than their peer averages, while the University of Nebraska at Omaha's is less than its peer's average.

Financial Aid for Higher Education

Financial aid for higher education has become increasingly important for students and their families in Nebraska. Although the state has increased funding for the Nebraska State Grant Program, support remains low when compared to the rest of the country. In addition, even though the state has no direct control over student loan borrowing, borrowing has increased significantly over the past 10 years.

Other Financial Aid

- Total tuition waivers awarded at Nebraska's community colleges in 2005-06 are less than the averages of their peer institutions except at Metropolitan Community College and Western Nebraska Community College.
- Total tuition waivers awarded at Nebraska's state colleges in 2005-06 are less than the averages of their peer institutions.

- Total tuition waivers awarded at the University of Nebraska at Omaha and the University of Nebraska at Kearney in 2005-06 are less than the averages of their peer institutions. Tuition waivers awarded at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln are greater than that of its peer's average.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Based on the findings in this report, the Commission recommends the following courses of action in the interrelated areas of affordability, state investment, and financial aid. By implementing these objectives, the state will come closer to achieving the goals set out in the *Comprehensive Statewide Plan for Postsecondary Education*.

Affordability of Higher Education

- The student payment share has increased at all but one of Nebraska's public postsecondary institutions over the past 10 years. Additionally, families with median, low, and very low income especially are contributing more of their income to pay the tuition and mandatory fees required to educate a family member. While students and their families certainly should contribute financially toward the student's education, **the Commission expects colleges and universities to strive to keep resident tuition and mandatory fees, and increases to those charges, as reasonable as possible so as not to price students out of obtaining an education. The Commission also encourages institutions to keep tuition and fees comparable to institutional peers or an identified national standard. In addition, the Commission encourages institutions to continue their efforts to increase efficiency through collaboration, advances in technology, and other appropriate means.**
- While nonresident students at Nebraska public higher education institutions pay more for tuition and fees than do resident students, those additional charges generally represent a smaller percentage premium than that charged by most of our institutions' peers in other states. Nebraska institutions therefore offer a good bargain for many students that come here from other states. The Commission has supported that approach to build higher education enrollments in Nebraska and increase the number of highly educated individuals that remain in the state and contribute to its economy. **The Commission supports consideration of some additional lowering of that differential, particularly to take advantage of opportunities to entice students from surrounding states.** While low nonresident rates assist with the recruitment and retention of nonresident students, **the Commission encourages institutions to review these charges to assure that low nonresident rates do not adversely affect programs and tuition charges for resident students.**

State Investment in Higher Education

- Having an educated population significantly enhances the economic and social well-being of a state. Therefore, **the Commission recommends that the Legislature maintain appropriate levels of state appropriations for public postsecondary institutions in Nebraska.**

Financial Aid for Higher Education

- Since students from median-, low-, and very low-income families would primarily benefit from financial assistance awarded from the state, and since the contribution from their income for tuition and mandatory fees has increased considerably, **the Commission encourages increased funding for the Nebraska State Grant program.**
- Although not specifically evaluated in this report, we are aware that the means to enroll in dual credit courses (courses that carry both collegiate and high school credit) is sometimes affected by family income. To increase the number of high school students taking dual enrollment courses, **the Commission encourages the Legislature to provide scholarship funds to allow needy students to take advantage of those opportunities and better prepare themselves for college attendance or entry into the workforce.**

Calculating Current Dollars

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change over time in the prices paid by urban consumers for a market basket of consumer goods and services and is maintained by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics. More information on the Consumer Price Index is available from the Bureau of Labor Statistics Website: www.bls.gov/cpi/home.htm.

The Consumer Price Index can be used to adjust tuition and fee prices from past years for inflation so that those prices can be more accurately compared from year to year. The table labeled 'current dollars' displays tuition in actual dollars from that tuition year. The table labeled 'constant dollars' displays tuition and fee data which have all been converted to 2005-06 dollar amounts taking into account the effect of inflation. In order to calculate 2005-06 constant dollars from current dollars, current dollar amounts are simply multiplied by the CPI factor associated with each year. Academic year CPI factors for 1995-96 through 2005-06 can be found in the table to the right.

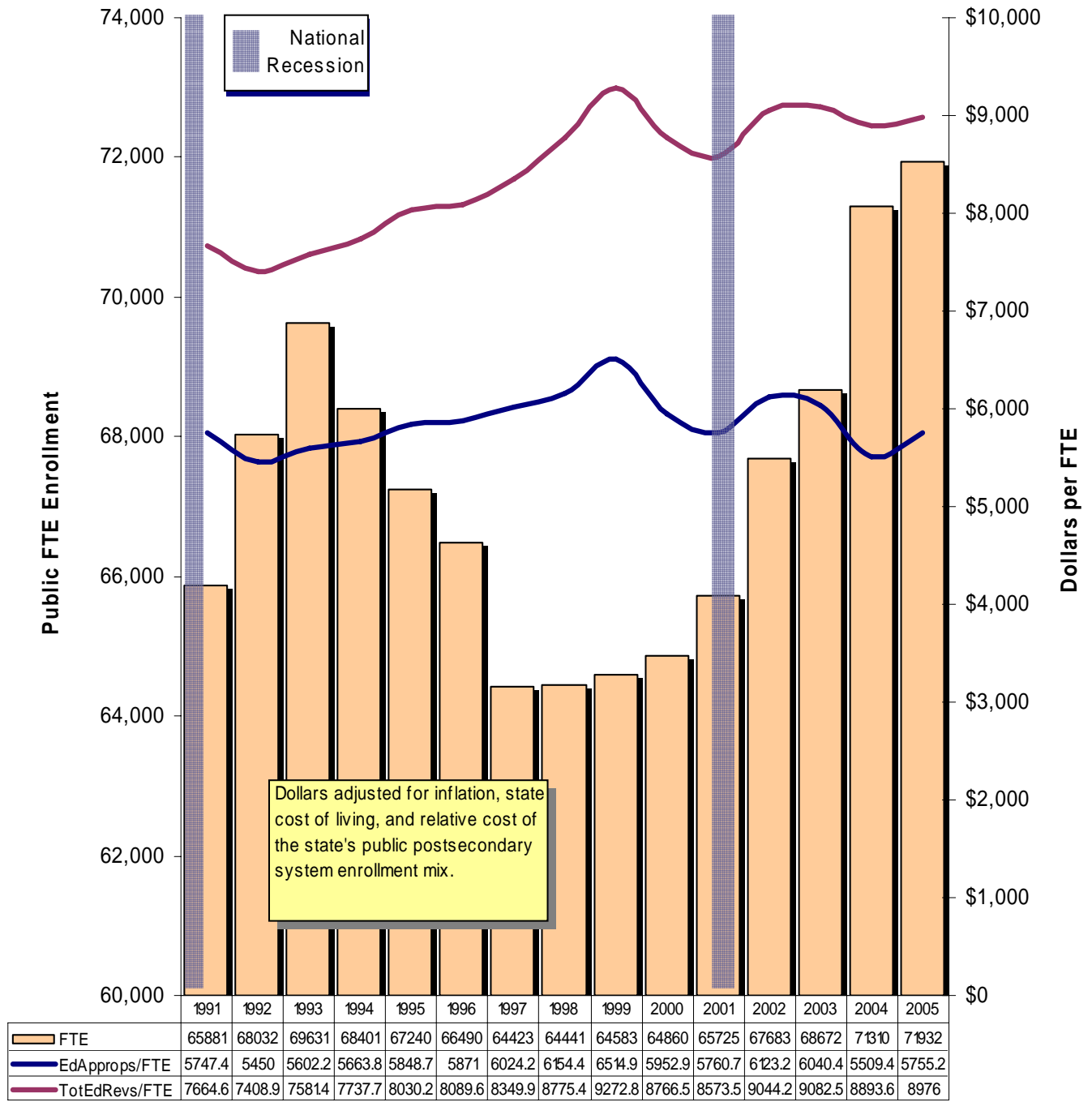

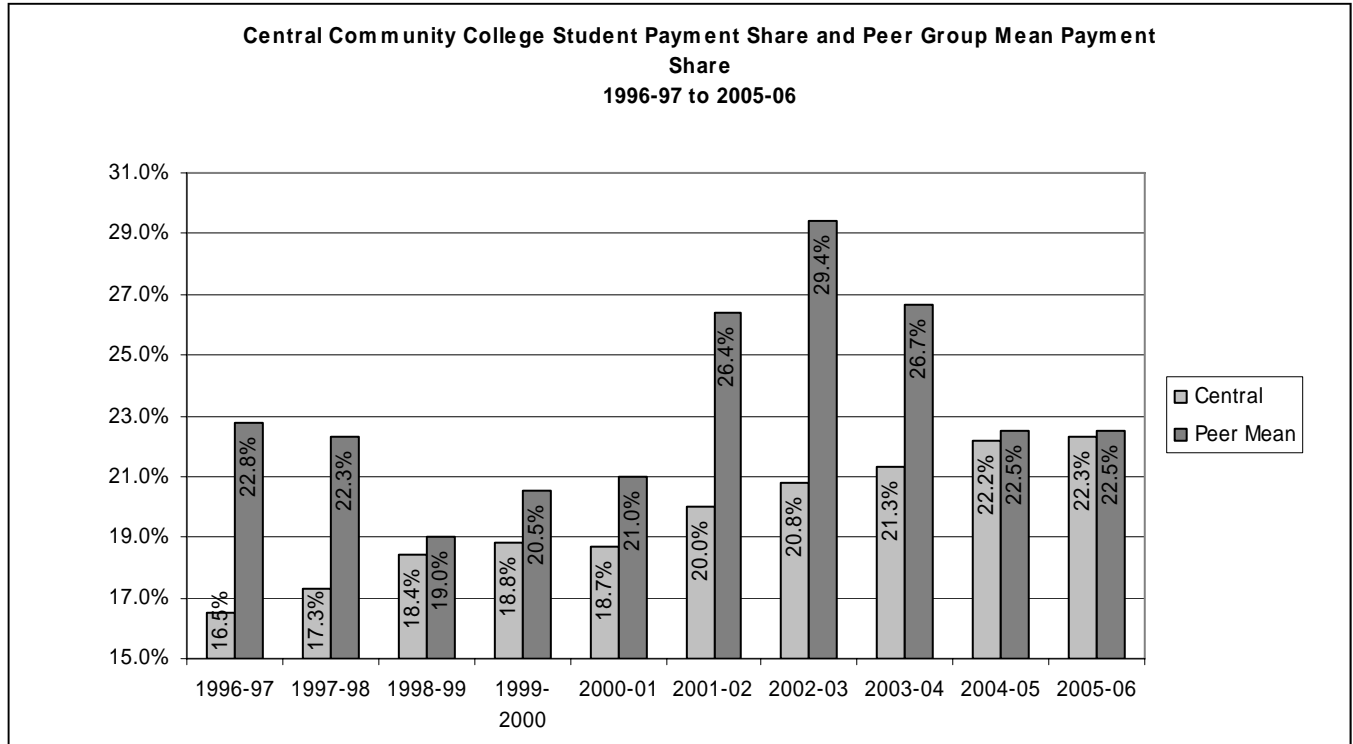

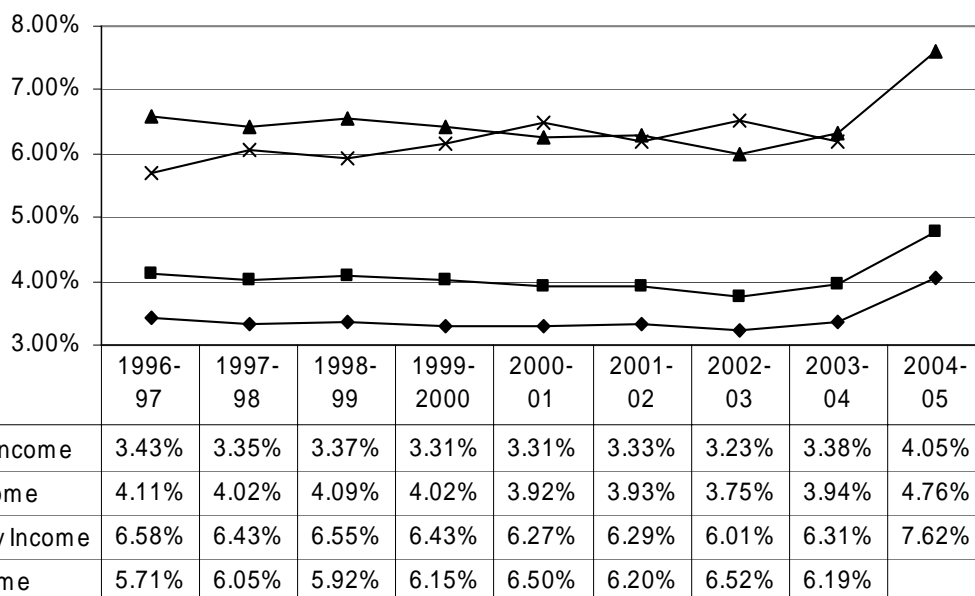

Increases as Compared to Inflation 1996-97 to 2005-06¹**



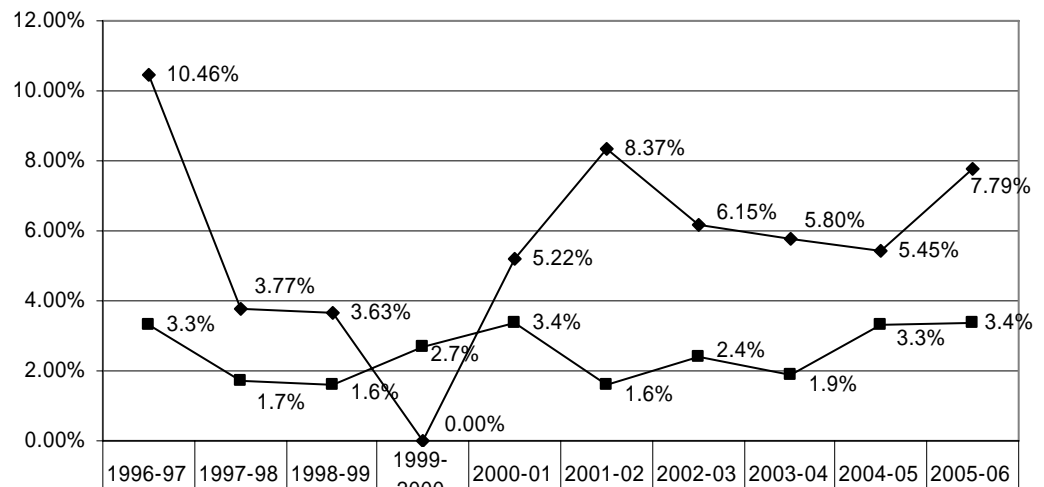

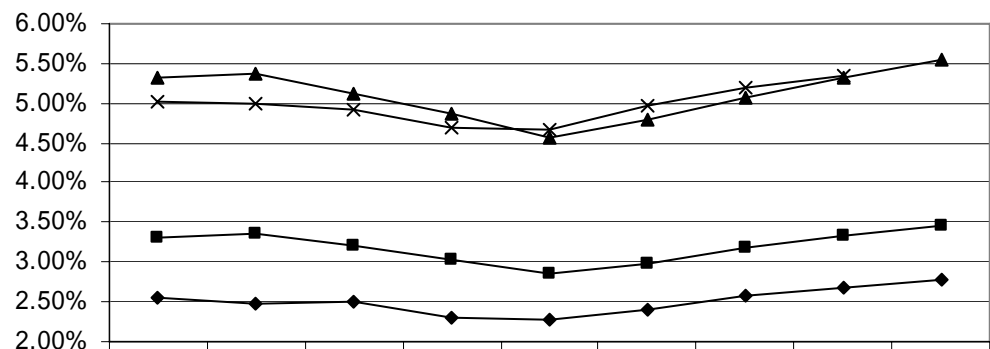
Metro Community College Tuition and Mandatory Fees Increases Compared to Inflation and as Percentage of Income

Mandatory Fees at Metropolitan Community College in 1996-97 through 2004-05²**

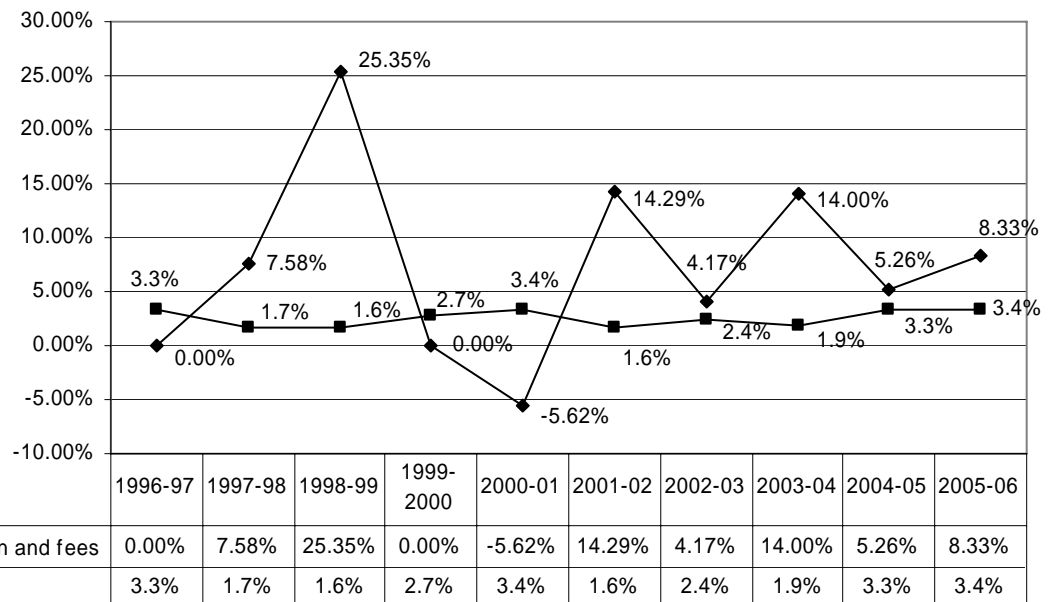

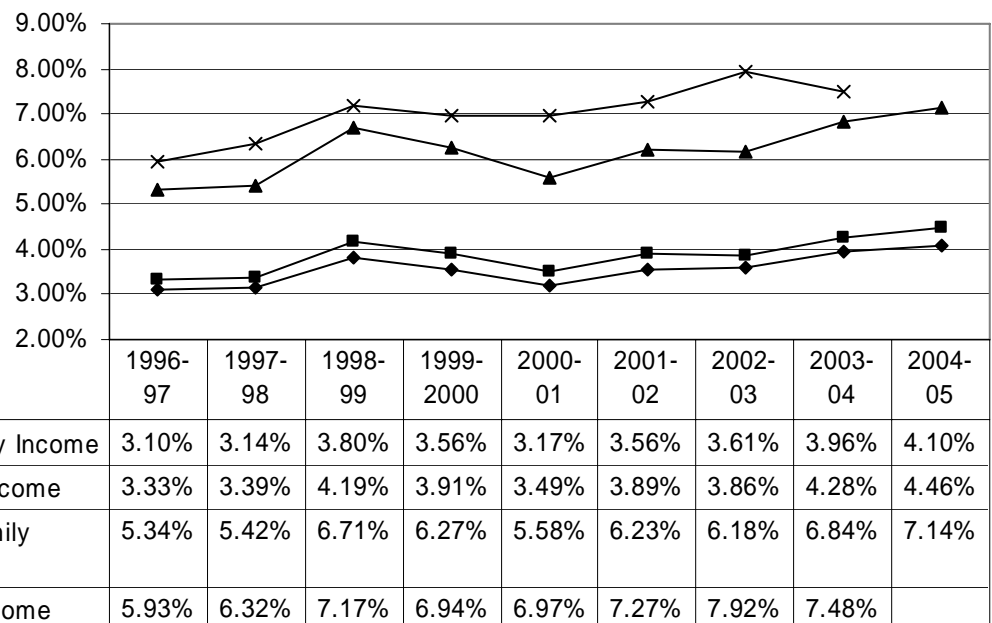

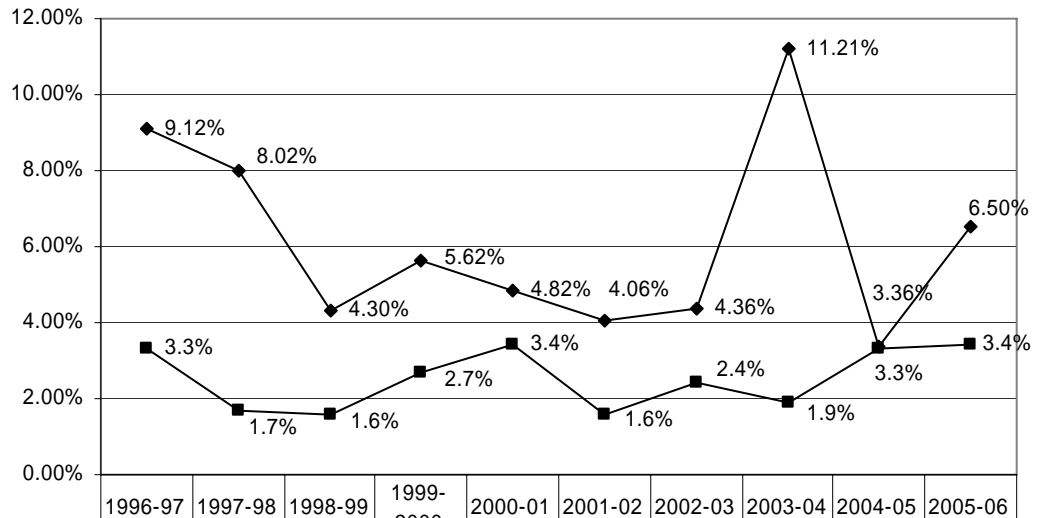

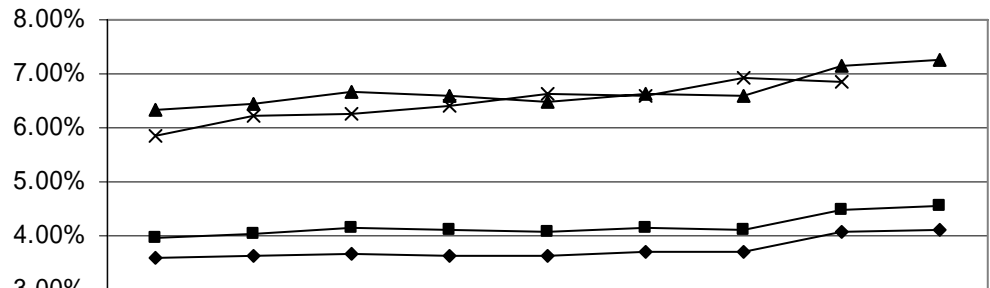
Northeast Community College Tuition and Mandatory Fees Increases Compared to Inflation and as Percentage of Income

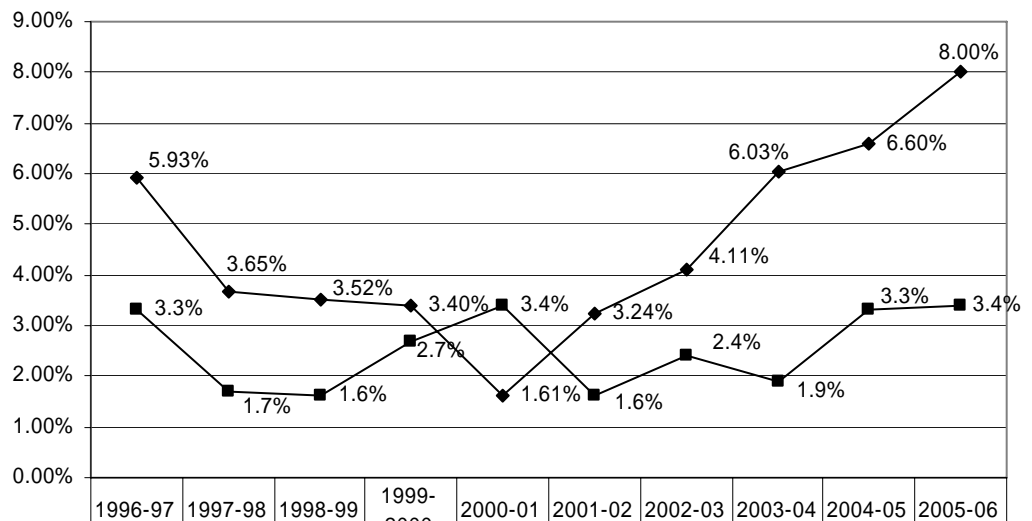

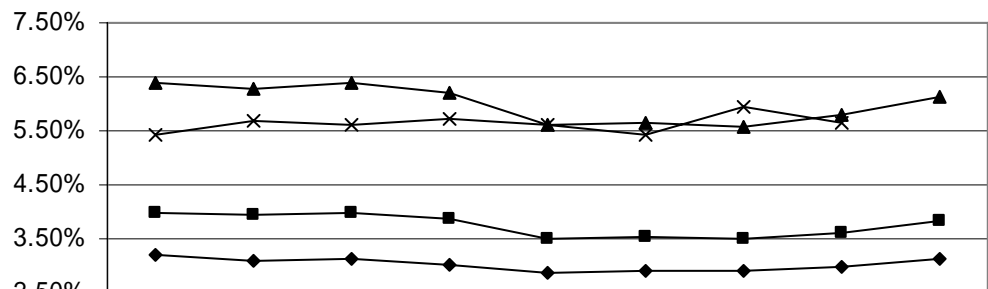
Southeast Community College Tuition and Mandatory Fees Increases Compared to Inflation and as Percentage of Income

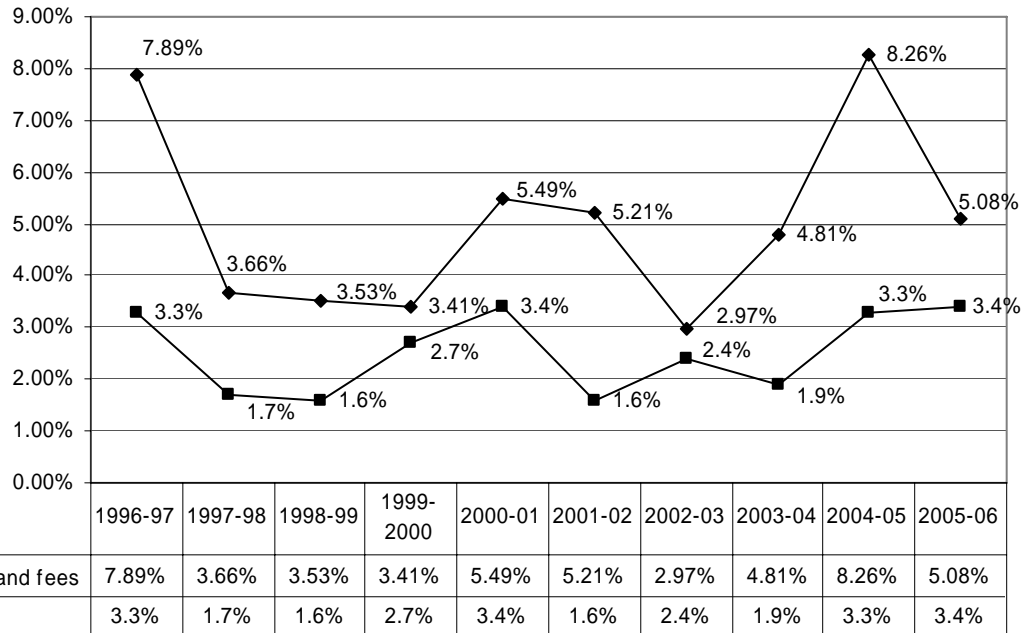

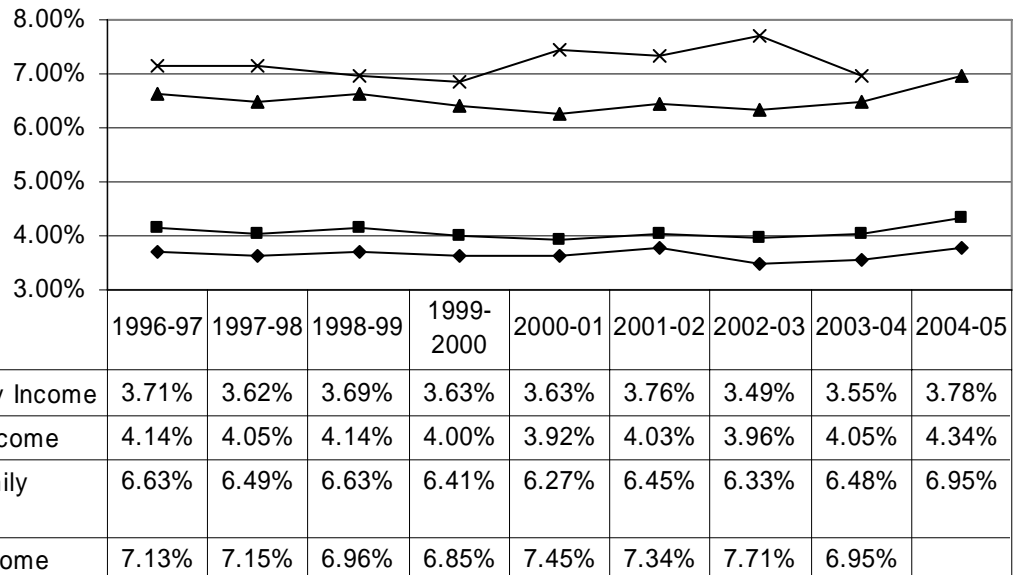

Western NE Community College Resident Undergraduate Tuition and Mandatory Fees Annual Increases as Compared to Inflation 1996-97 to 2005-06¹



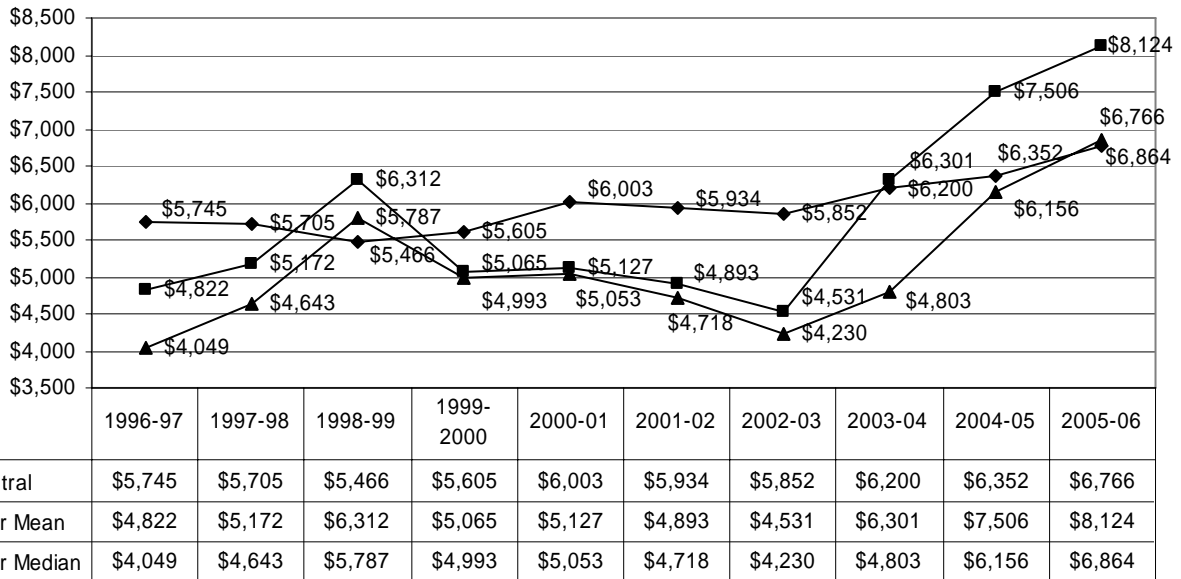

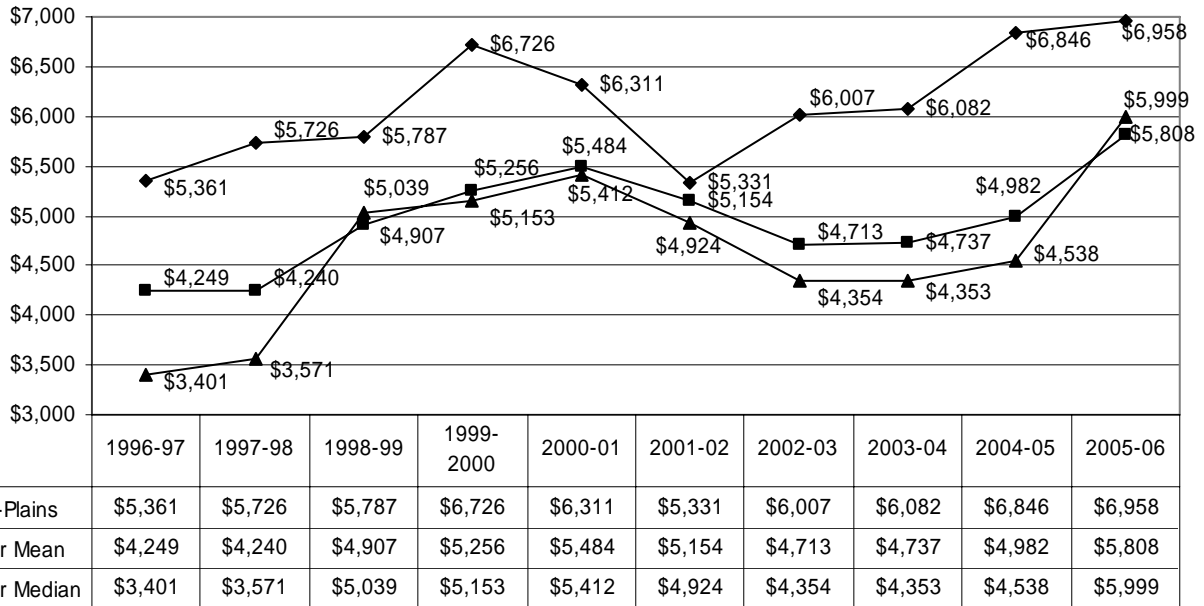

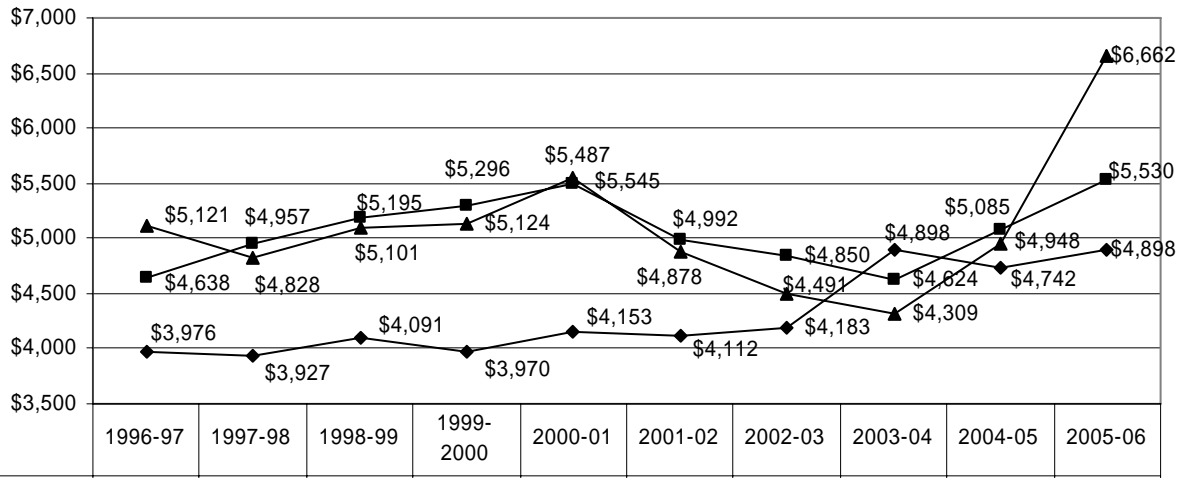

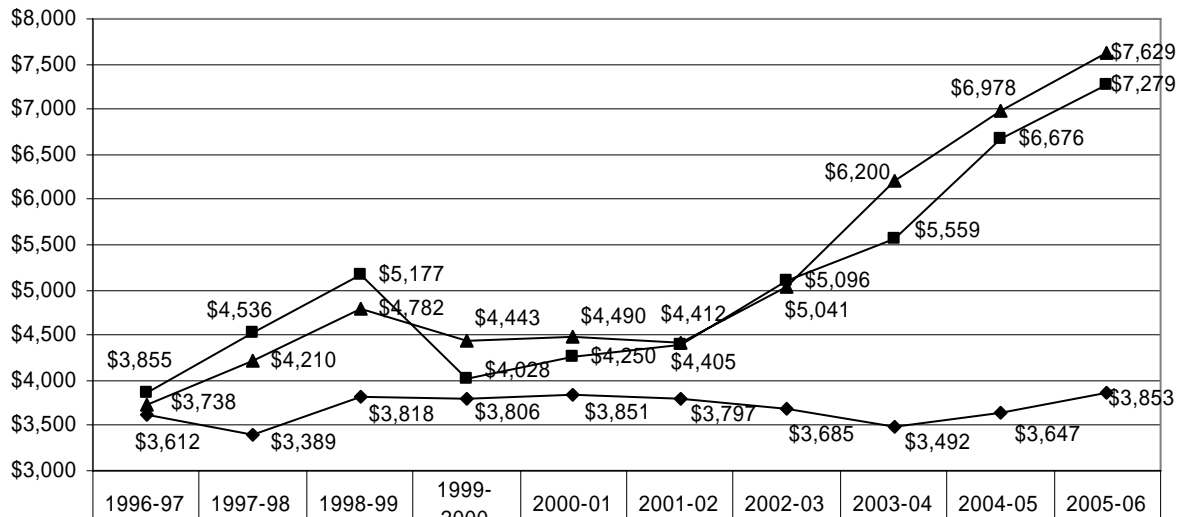

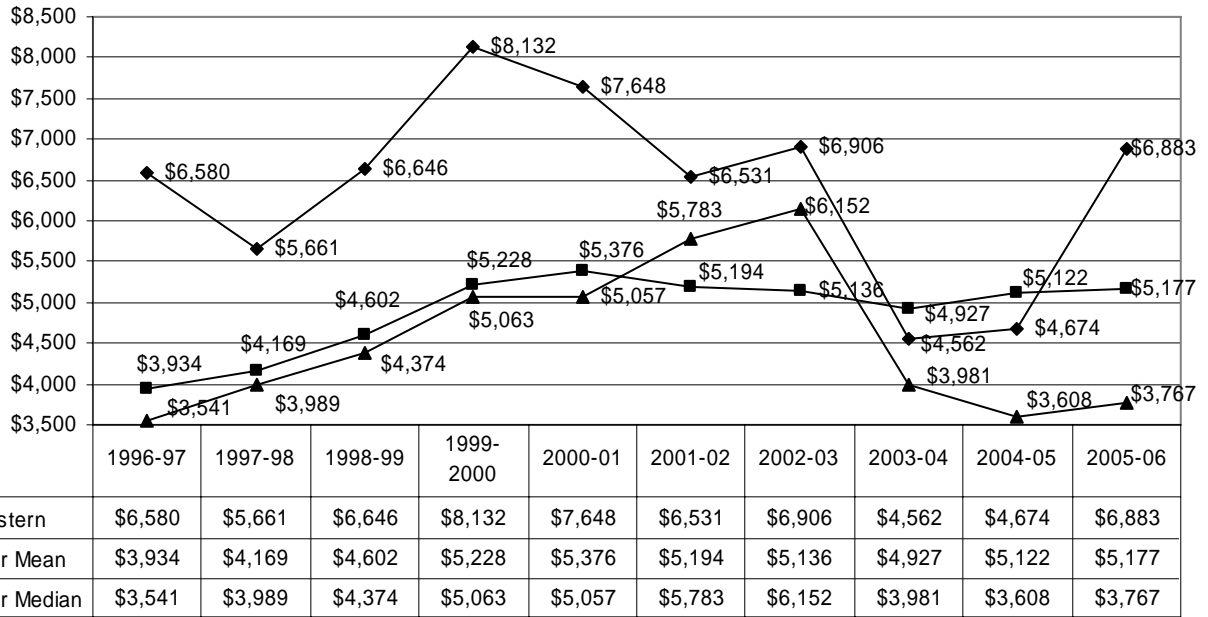

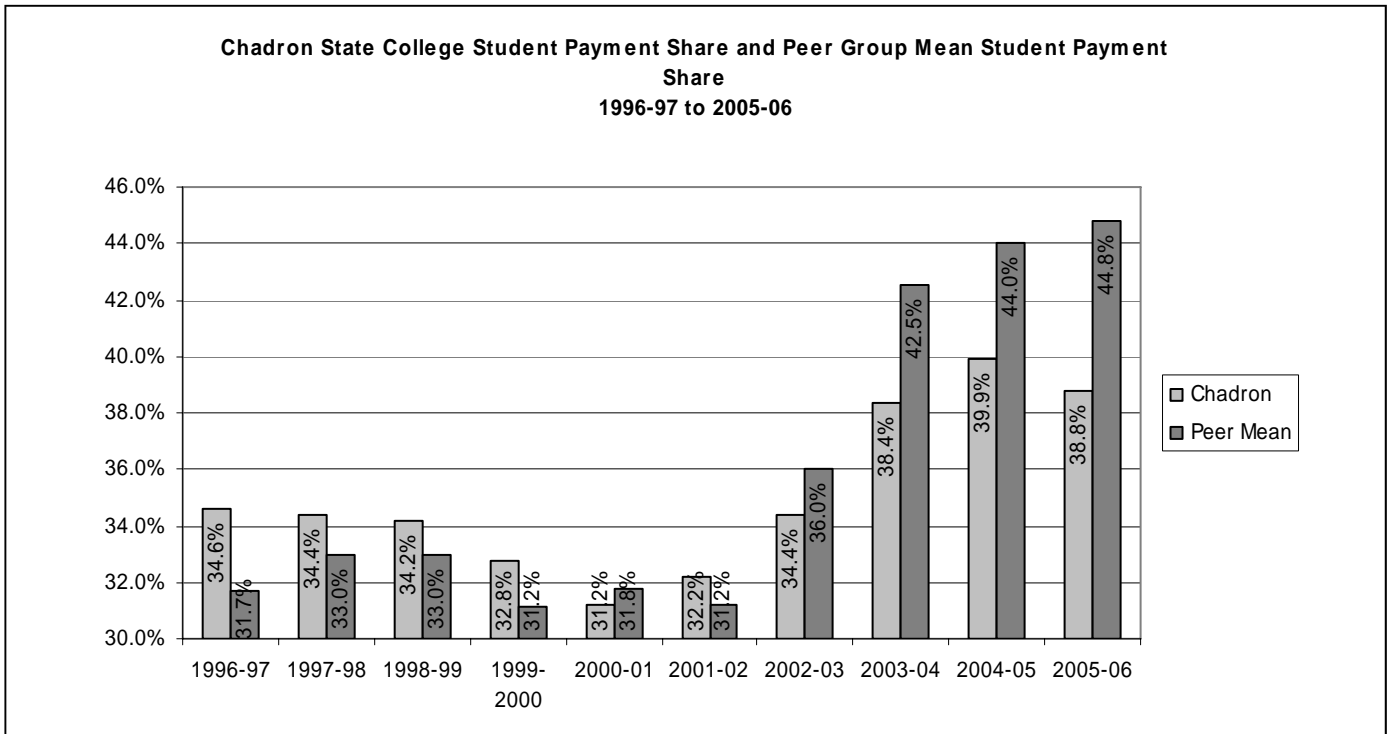

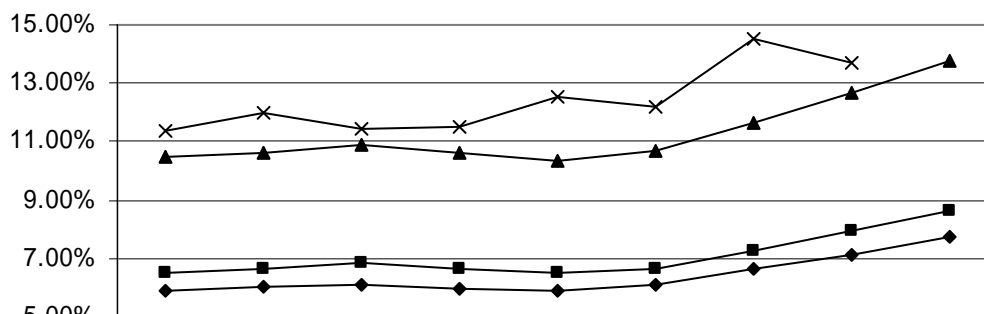
Chadron State College Tuition and Mandatory Fees Increases Compared to Inflation and as Percentage of Income

Mandatory Fees at Chadron State College in 1996-97 through 2004-05²**

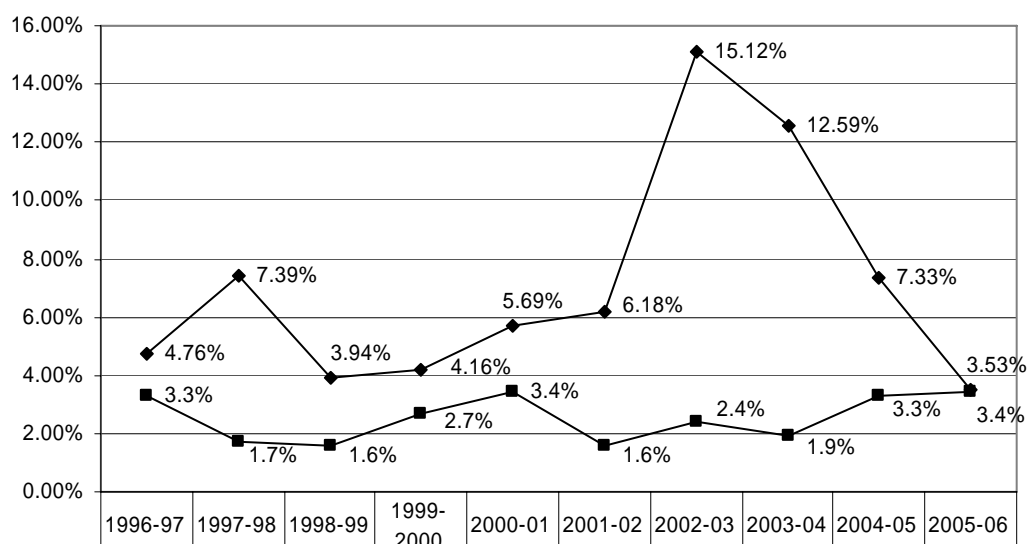

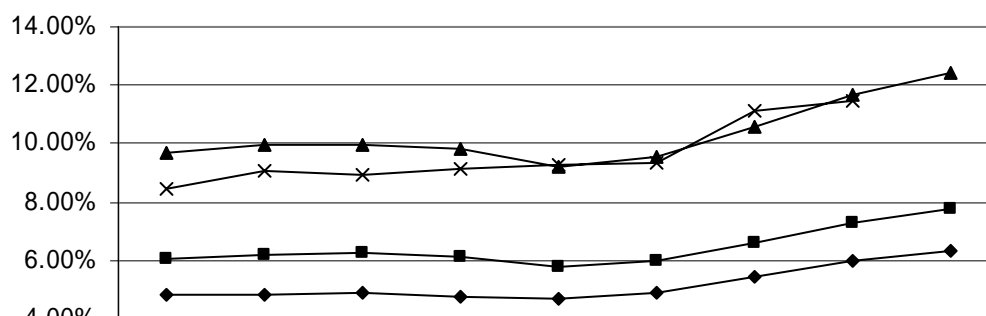
Peru State College Tuition and Mandatory Fees Increases Compared to Inflation and as Percentage of Income

Mandatory Fees at Peru State College in 1996-97 through 2004-05²**

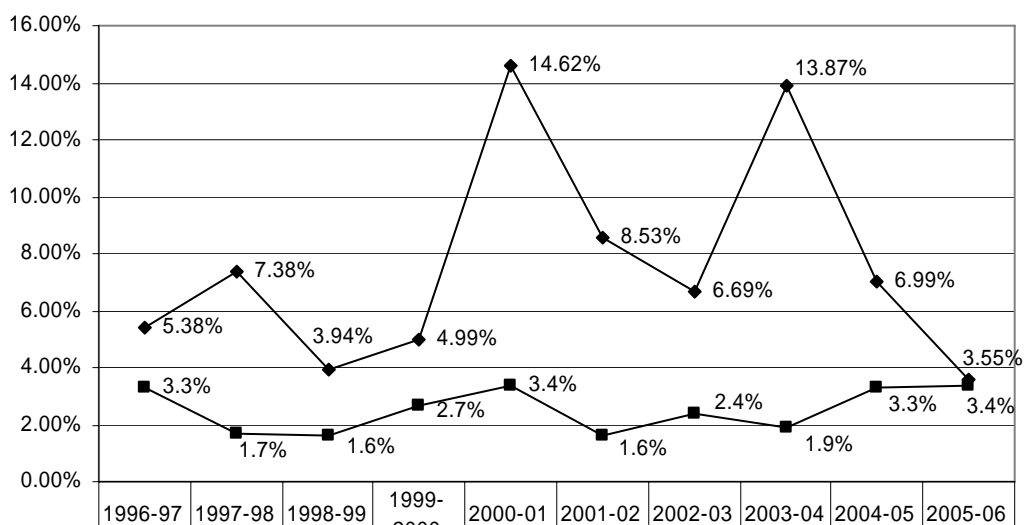

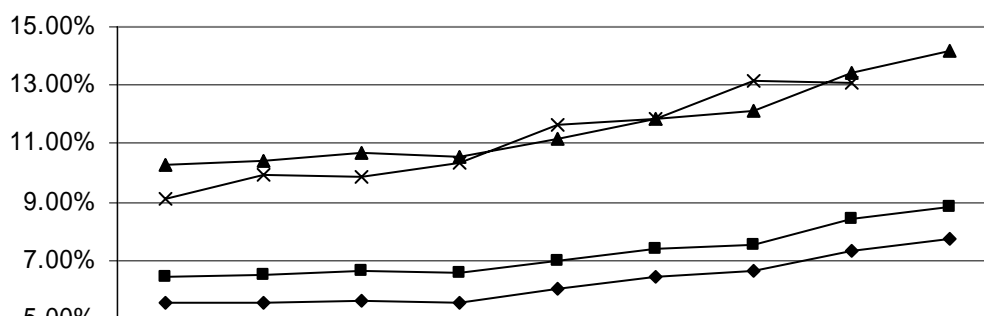
Wayne State College Tuition and Mandatory Fees Increases Compared to Inflation and as Percentage of Income

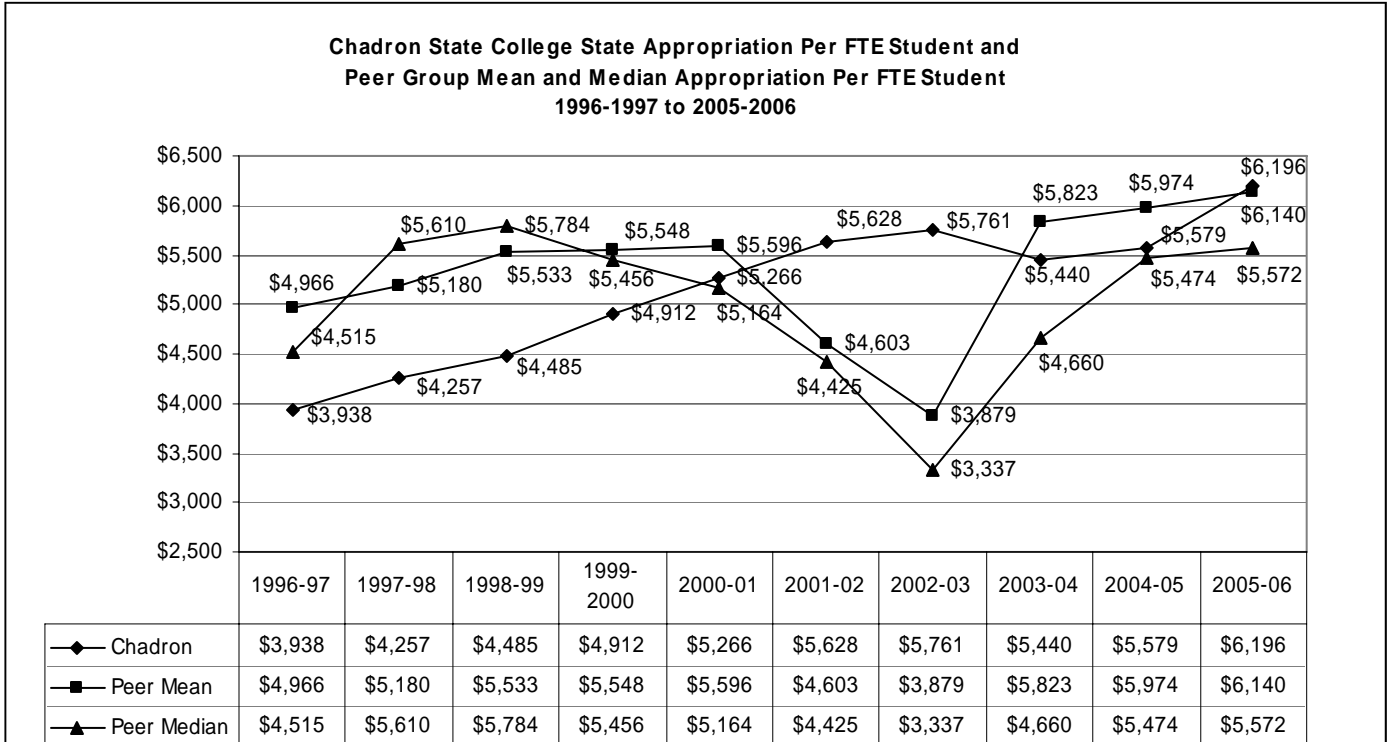
**What Percentage of Family Income would be Required to Pay Undergraduate Resident Tuition and

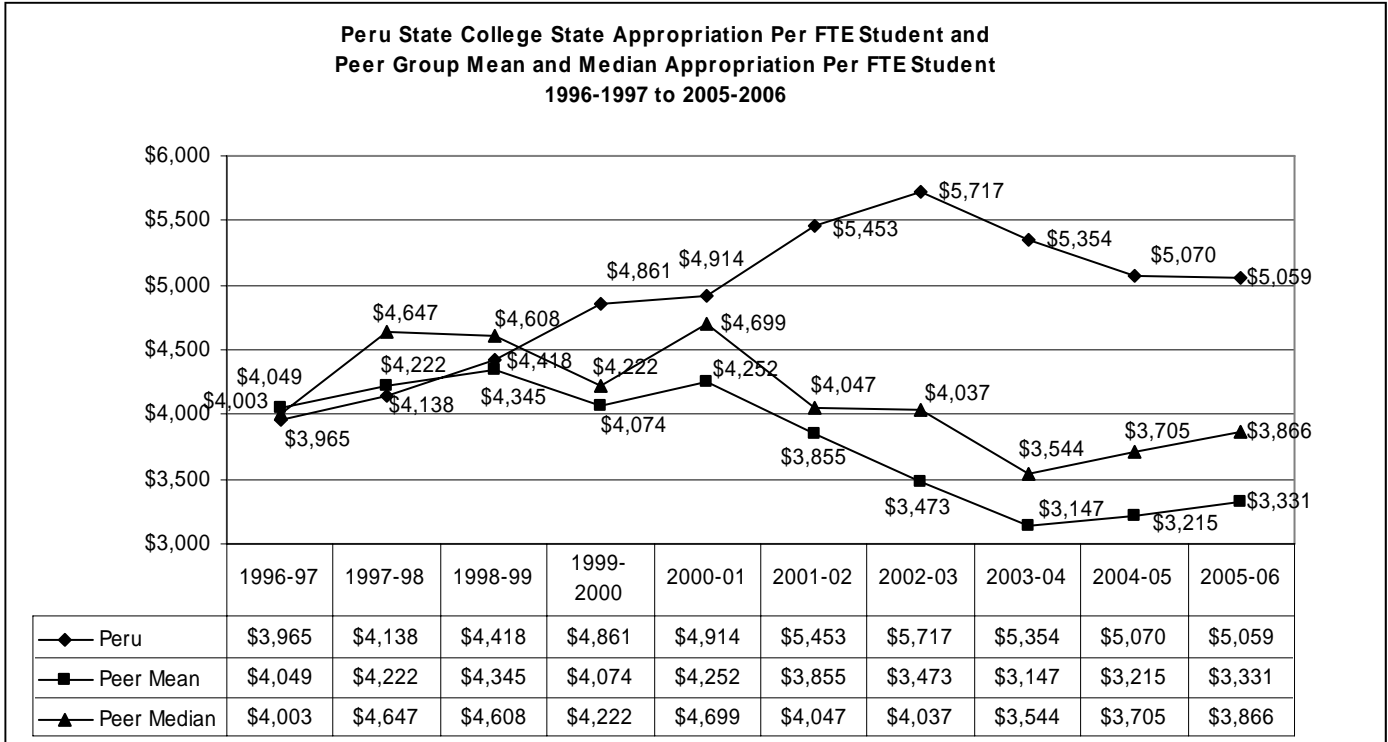

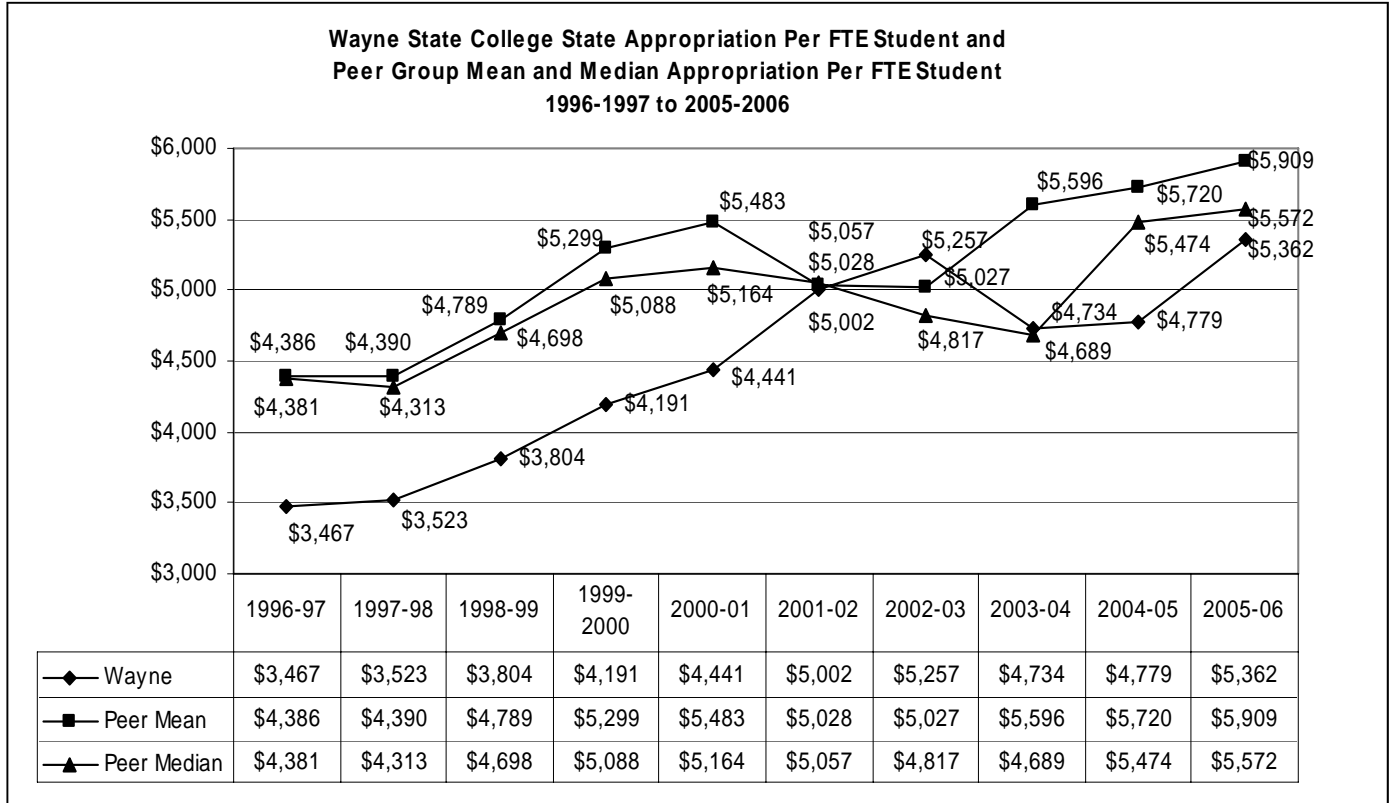

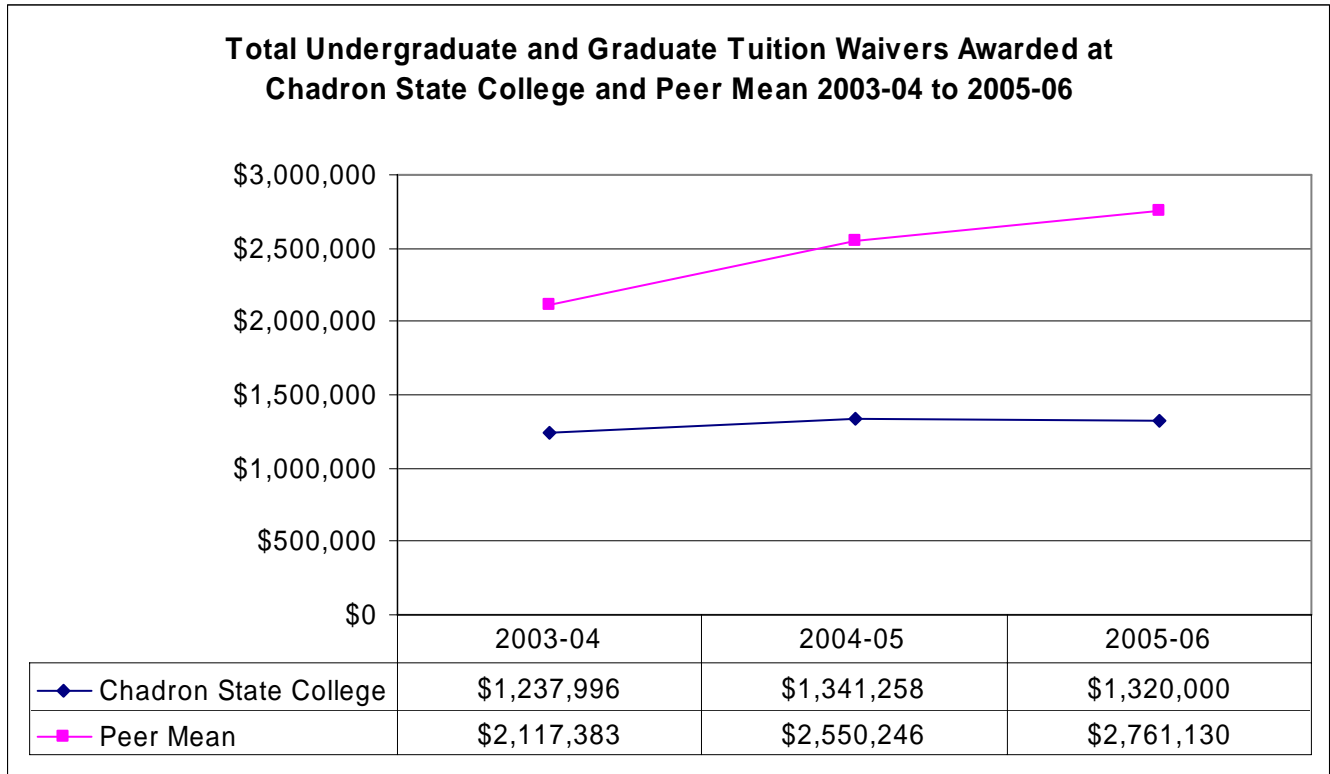

2003-04 to 2005-06**



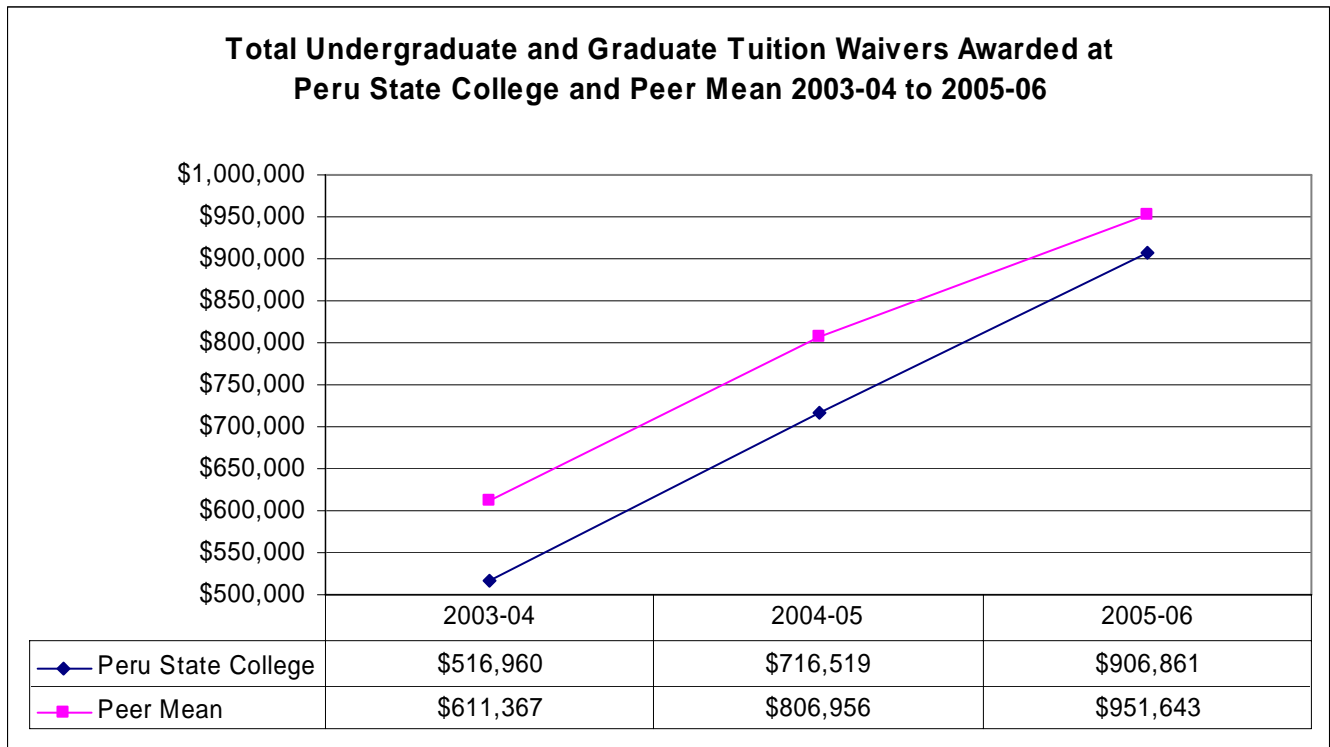

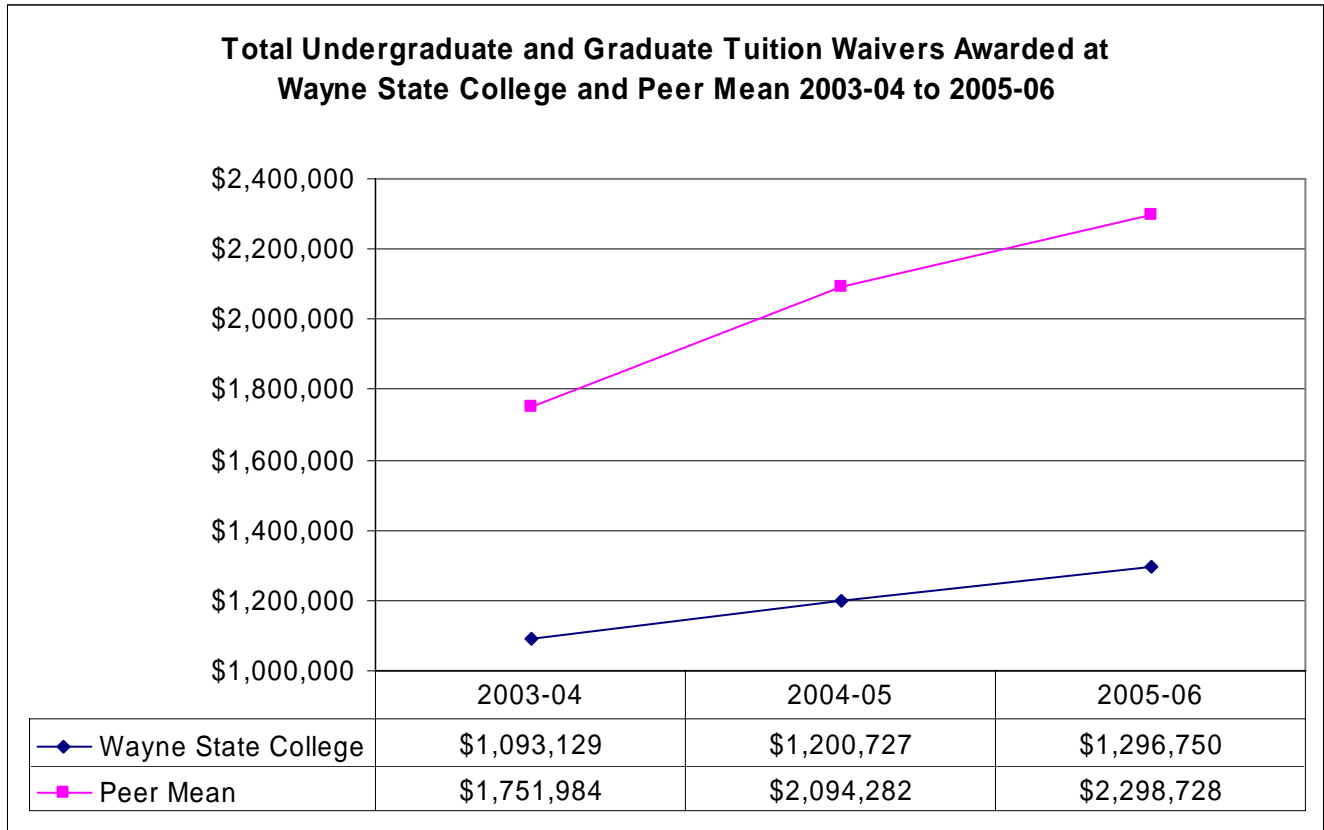

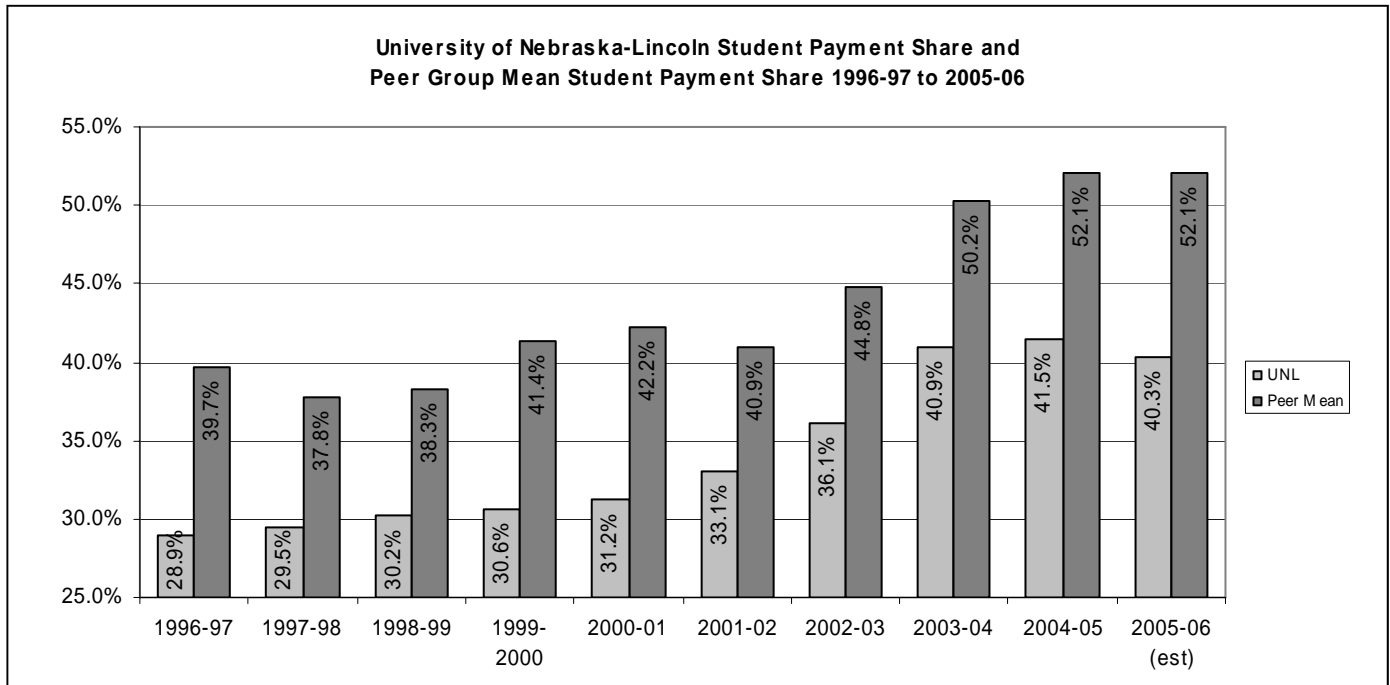

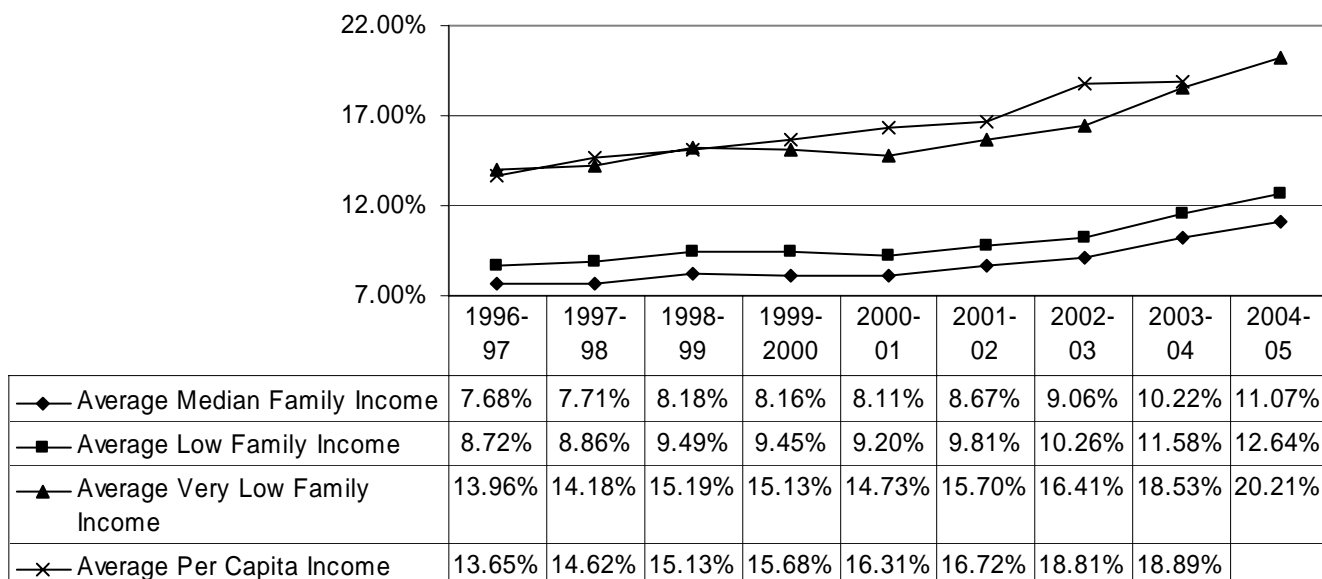

as Compared to Inflation 1996-97 to 2005-06¹**



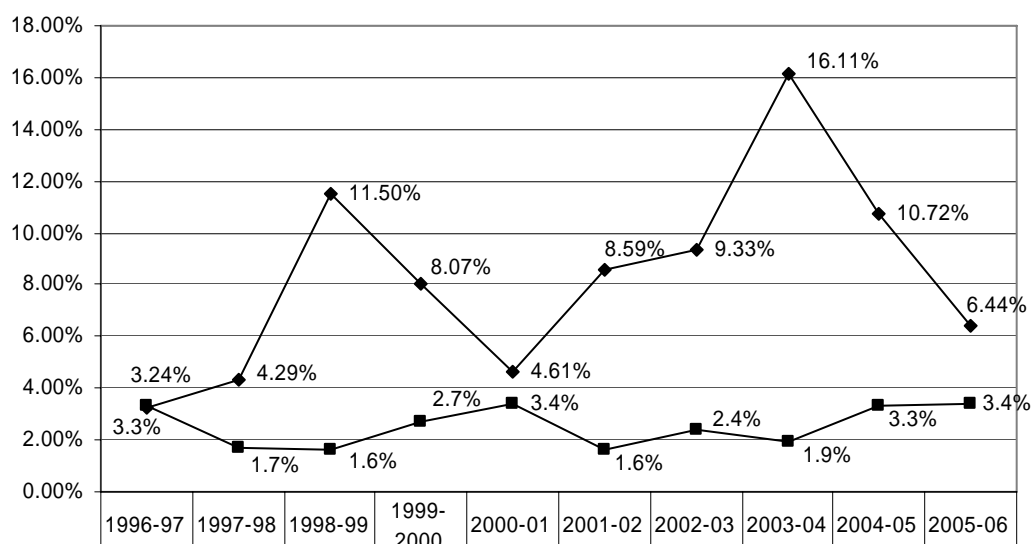

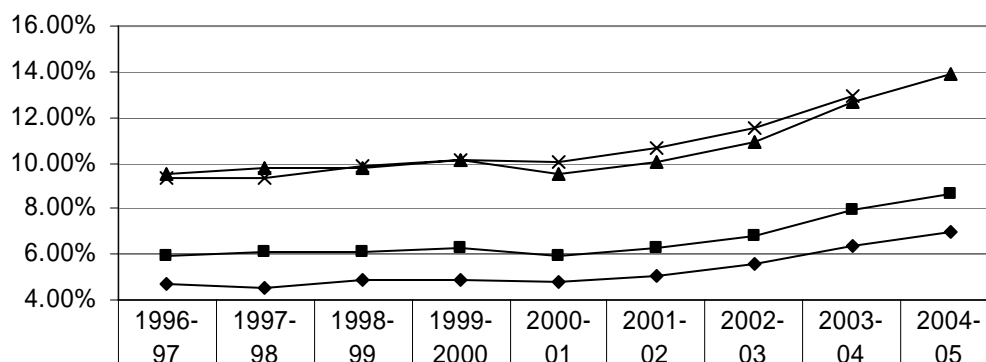
University of Nebraska at Omaha Tuition and Mandatory Fees Increases Compared to Inflation and as Percentage of Income

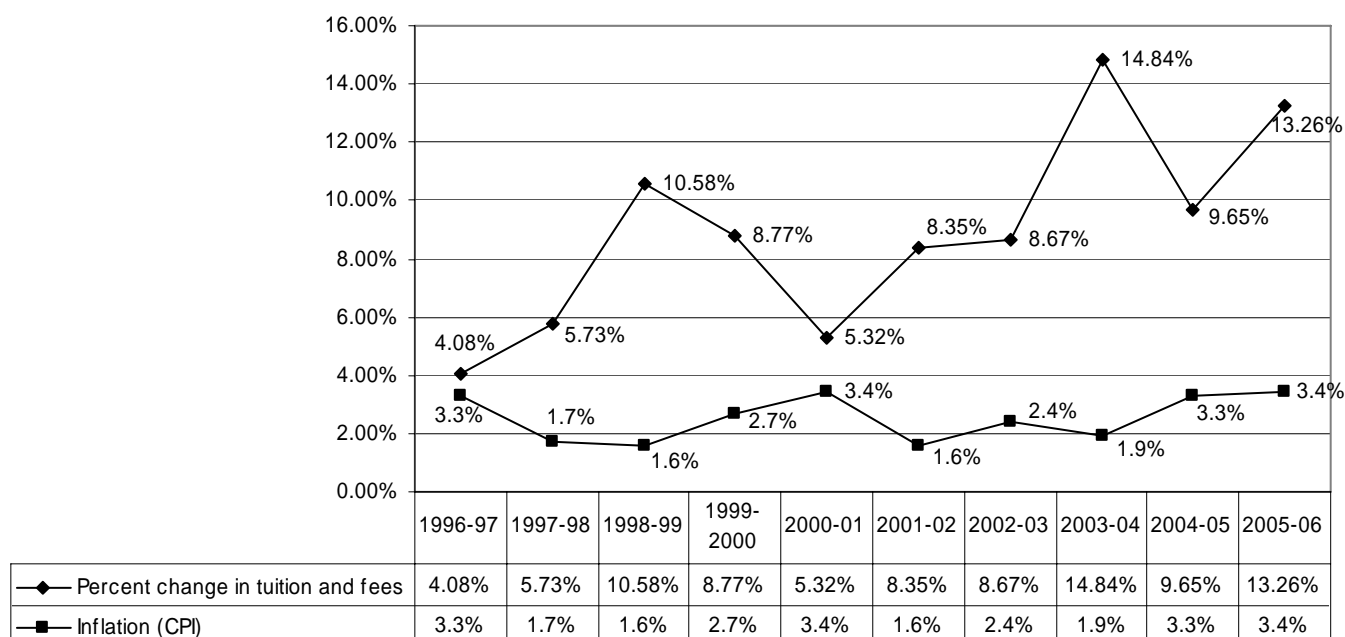

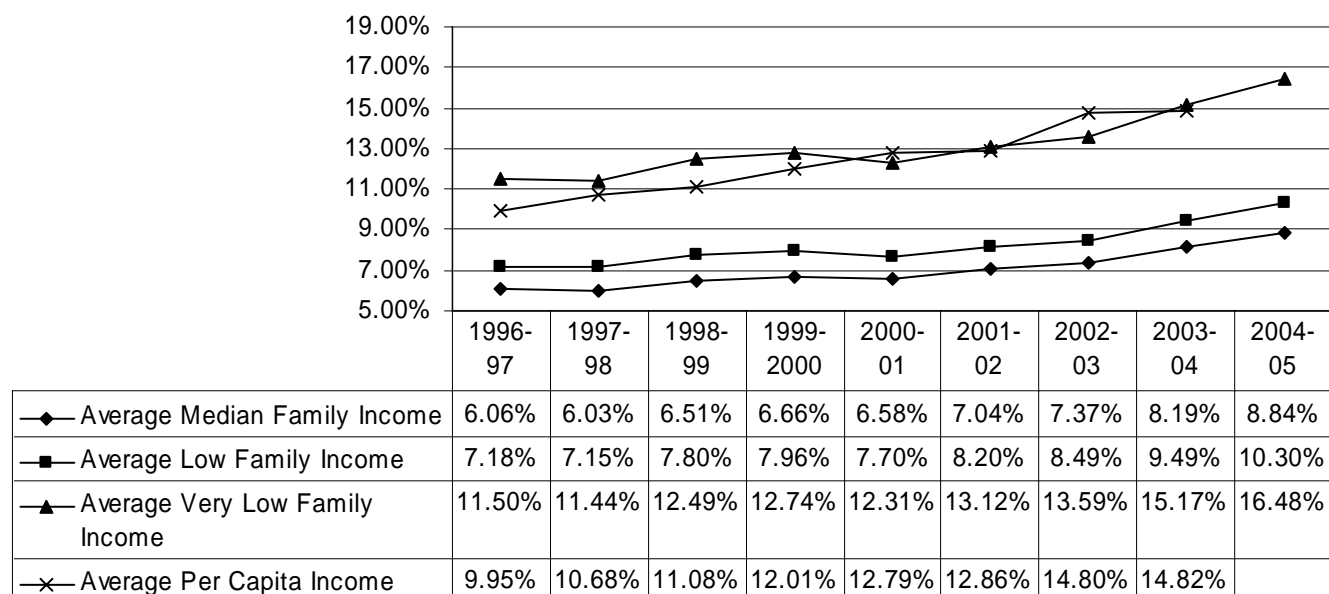

University of Nebraska at Kearney Tuition and Mandatory Fees Annual Increases as Compared to Inflation 1996-97 to 2005-06¹



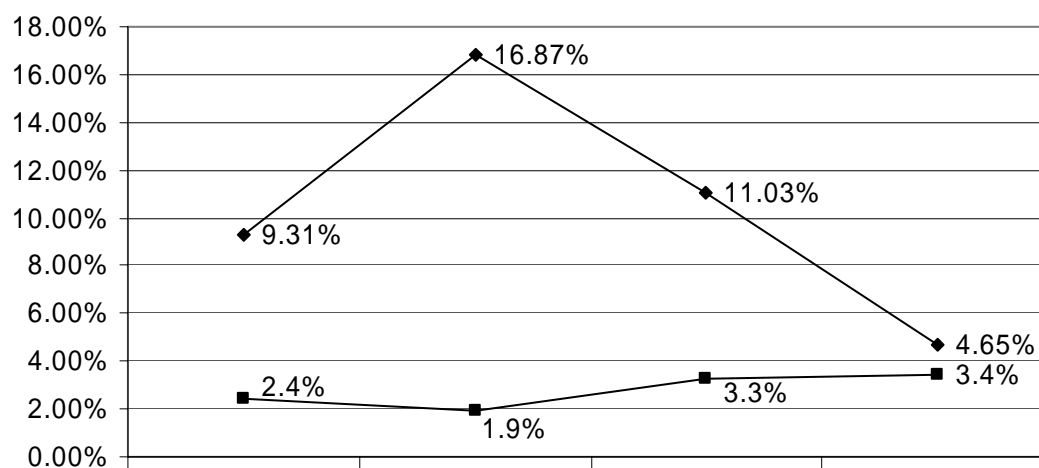

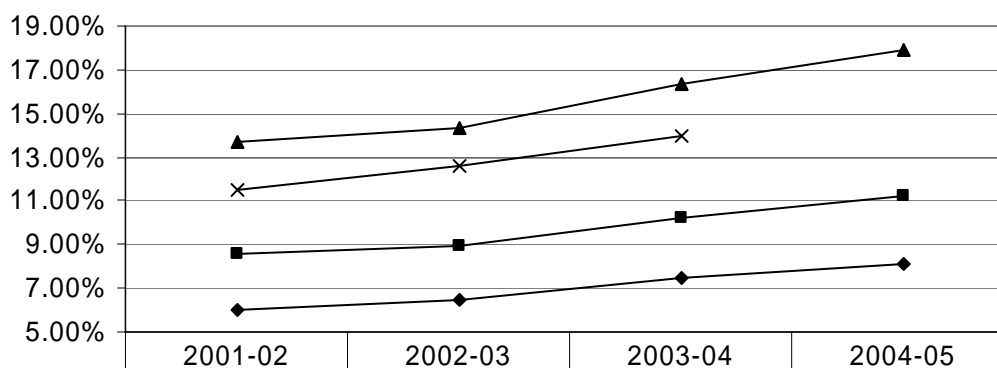
University of Nebraska Medical Center Tuition and Mandatory Fees Increases Compared to Inflation and as Percentage of Income

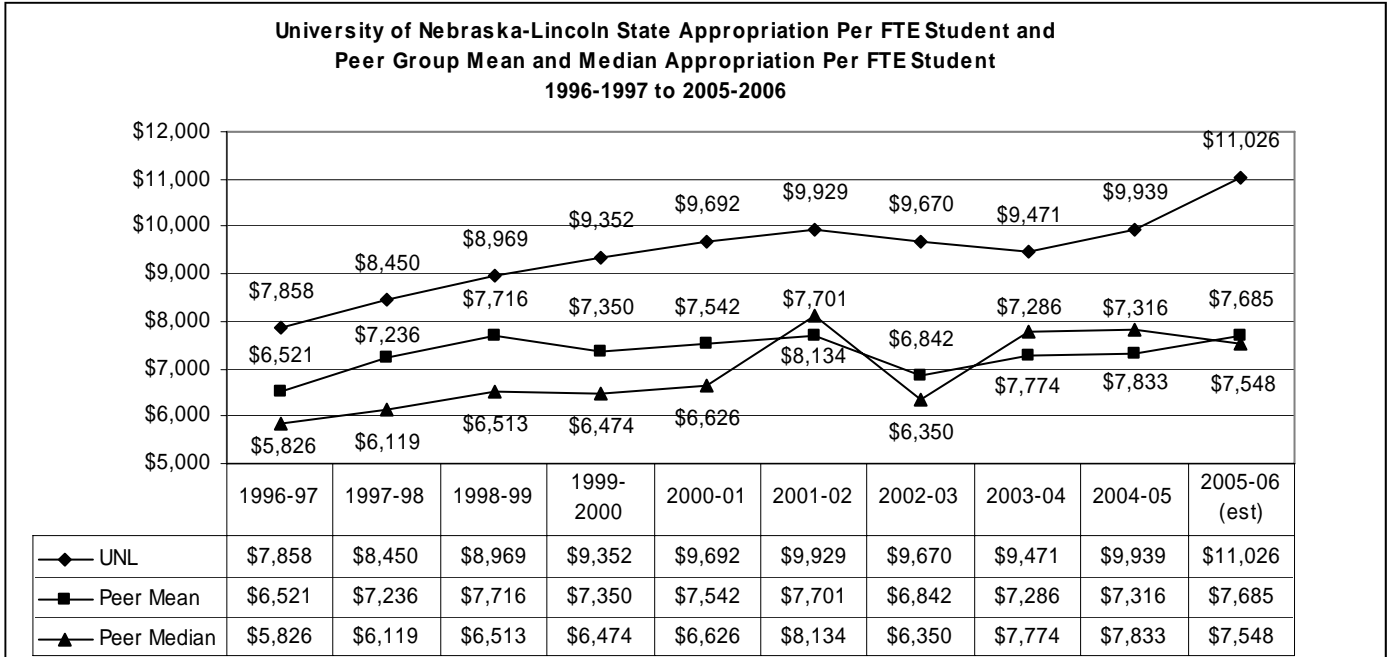

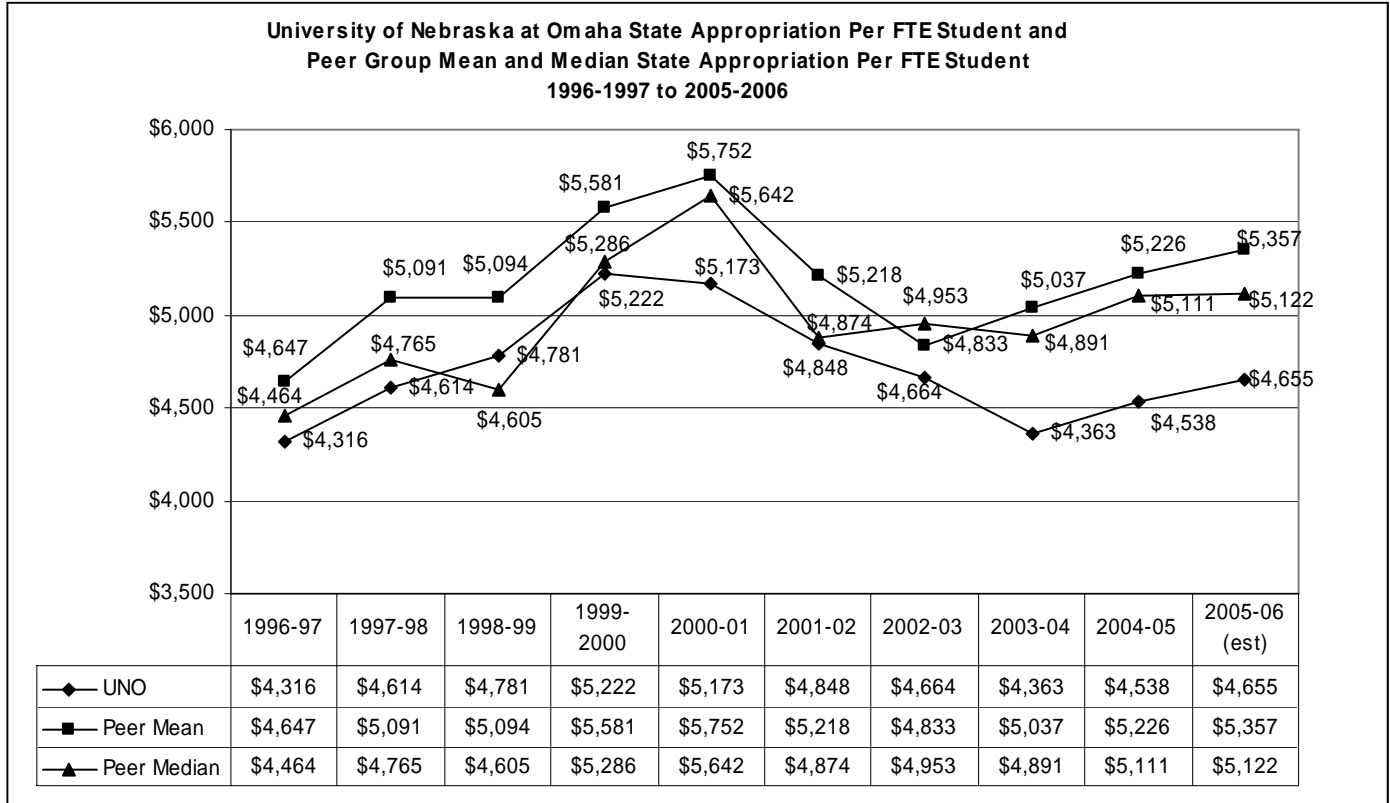

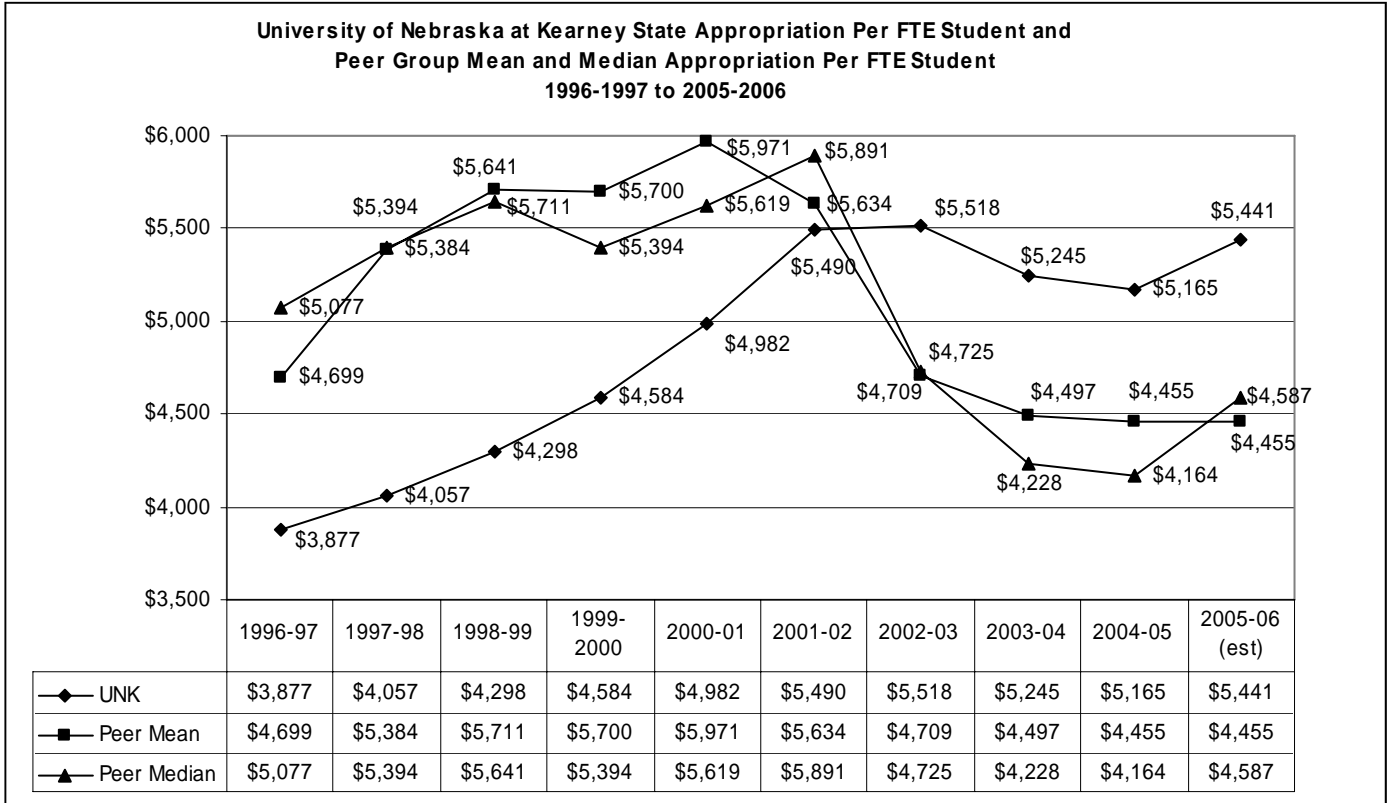
