











 Mid-Plains CC (-396)
 Vatterott College (-361)
 UNL (-280)


Graduate Students






Graduate enrollments accounted for higher percentages of total fall enrollment in 2012 than in 2002, statewide, and at:

- For-Profit/Career School sector












- ◆ Increasing: Under 18, 25-39, and 50-64 year-olds

Percentage of Total Fall Undergraduate Enrollment Under 25 Years of Age – by Sector Fall 2005 - Fall 2011




Percentage of Total Fall Undergraduate Enrollment 25 Years of Age or Older – by Sector Fall 2005 - Fall 2011




Nebraska Public Colleges and Universities Fall Enrollment



Nebraska Public Colleges and Universities 12-Month Enrollment




Nebraska Public Colleges and Universities Fall Enrollment Divided by 12-Month Enrollment




Fall Enrollment of First-Time Freshmen

Total Fall Enrollment of First-Time Freshmen (FTF) Nebraska Public and Independent Institutions and For-Profit/Career Schools



- ◆ 2002-2010: up 1,456 (8.0%) or 1.0% per year
- ◆ 2010-2012: down 1,220 or 6.2% Net 10-year increase of 1.3%






