



Total Fall Enrollment Nebraska Public and Independent Institutions and For-Profit/Career Schools



- ◆ Since 2001, total statewide fall enrollment has increased 27.3%, or 3.0% per year from 114,818 in fall 2001 to 146,151 in fall 2010.






Total Fall Enrollment by Student Level Nebraska Public and Independent Institutions and For-Profit/Career Schools



Undergraduate Total Fall Enrollment of Minorities Nebraska Public and Independent Institutions and For-Profit/Career Schools










- ◆ Increasing: Under 18 and 25-39 years of age

- ◆ Stable: 22-24 year olds Decreasing: 20-21 and 30 or older


Nebraska Independent Colleges & Universities Total Fall Undergraduate Enrollment by Age Fall 2003 - Fall 2009




- ◆ Small and fluctuating %: Under 18


Nebraska Public Colleges and Universities Fall Enrollment



Nebraska Public Colleges and Universities 12-Month Enrollment




Nebraska Public Colleges and Universities Fall Enrollment Divided by 12-Month Enrollment



Total Full-Time Faculty Compared to Total Fall Student Enrollment Nebraska Public and Independent Institutions




- ◆ Increases in faculty generally parallel increases in fall enrollment. The correlation between the number of full-time faculty and fall student enrollment, statewide, was 0.93 for 2000 through 2010, the same as for 1999 through 2009.


- ◆ This analysis does not include part-time faculty, and changes in fall student enrollment may or may not accurately reflect changes in faculty workloads. Therefore, results should be interpreted only as a broad, general comparison.

Ratios of Total Fall Student Enrollment to Full-Time Instructional Faculty Nebraska Public and Independent Institutions




- ◆ Three of the ratios are rising. However, these ratios should be interpreted only as imprecise measures of student-to-faculty ratios.




- ◆ The percentages of faculty who are Hispanics, black non-Hispanics or Native Americans trail the percentages of students in these three racial/ethnic groups. However, the percentages of faculty who are white non-Hispanics, Asian/Pacific Islanders or non-resident aliens are higher than the percentages of students in these groups.


Average Salary of Full-Time Instructional Faculty Nebraska Public and Independent Institutions



Women as a % of Full-Time Instructional Faculty by Rank Nebraska Public and Independent Institutions




% Ratio of the Average 9-Month Salaries of Female Full-Time Instructional Faculty to Male Faculty by Rank Nebraska Public and Independent Institutions



- ◆ There is a continuing gap between the average salaries received by male and female full-time instructional faculty, except at the instructor level where women earn, on the average, more than men.

% Ratio of the Average 9-Month Salaries of Female Full-Time Instructional Faculty to Male Faculty by Sector Nebraska Public and Independent Institutions



- ◆ The gap between the average salaries received by male and female full-time instructional faculty varies by sector as well as by rank.
