Commissioner Headrick, filling in for absent Committee Chair Commissioner Lauritzen, introduced Matthew Roque to present the Budget Committee capital project proposals.

<u>Central Community College – Hastings Campus - Automotive</u> Careers Training Center

Mr. Roque presented the proposal, noting that Central Community College is proposing to construct a new building adjacent to the existing Furnas Building on the Hastings campus. The new space would support automotive and auto body programs. The new building would be 45,852 gross square feet and the college estimates the project cost to be \$22.3 million. The Automotive Careers Training Center would be funded with American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), Capital Improvement, and Capital Campaign funds.

Christopher Waddle, JD, Central Community College - Hastings Campus President, was present and answered Commissioner's questions regarding the proposal.

Committee recommendation: Pursuant to the Nebr. Rev. Stat. § 85-1414, the Budget, Construction, and Financial Aid Committee of the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education recommends approval of Central Community College's proposal to utilize Capital Improvement funds to construct and equip the Automotive Careers Technology Center project as outlined in the governing board's program statement approved on August 17, 2023, along with supplemental information provided.

science-focused building on the UNK campus. The cost of the project would be \$60 million of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds along with \$35 million in private funding. The building would include classrooms, simulation and clinical skills laboratories, and primary care spaces. Additional office space will accommodate growing faculty and staff and secure storage space for academic records.

Nicole Carritt, Assistant Vice Chancellor for Health Workforce & Relations from the University of Nebraska Medical Center, came forward to discuss and answer questions regarding the proposal, as did Dr. Jeffrey Gold, Chancellor from the University of Nebraska Medical Center via Zoom.

Committee recommendation: Pursuant to the Nebr. Rev. Stat. § 85-1414, the Budget, Construction, and Financial Aid Committee of the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education recommends approval of the University of Nebraska at Kearney and the University of Nebraska Medical Center's proposal to construct a Health Science Education Building Phase 2 on the UNK campus as outlined in the governing board's program statement approved on August 11, 2022, along with supplemental information provided.

Commissioner Headrick, on behalf of the Budget, Construction, and Financial Aid Committee, moved to approve the University of Nebraska at Kearney / Medical Center UNK UNMC Rural Health Education Building - Health Science Education Complex (HSEC) – Phase Two. A roll call vote was taken. Voting aye: Daniels, Headrick, Nelson, O'Holleran, Von Behren, Weber, and Wilson. The motion carried.

Nebraska Opportunity Grant (NOG) AY 2022-23 Year-End Report

Mr. Morrow presented the report, commenting that every year the CCPE is appropriated general funds from the legislature for the Nebraska Opportunity Grant, and those funds are combined with the Nebraska Lottery Funds that we receive to award each year. Mr. Morrow noted that Nebraska ranked 31st in the country for need-based undergraduate grant dollars per undergraduate enrollment. In the 2021-22 award year, \$23,928,265 was awarded to 13,183 students with the average award being \$1,815.09. He gave an overview of the NOG awarding by source, sector, and family income over the past 10 years.

Community College GAP Assistance Program 2022-23 Annual Year-End Report

Mr. Morrow presented the Community College GAP Assistance Program report, noting this is the seventh year of the program showing an increase in both applications and participants. The program is designed to provide financial aid to low-income community college students enrolled in credit or non-credit programs that do not qualify for federal Pell grants, preparing them for jobs in high-need areas. Mr. Morrow discussed eligible programs, in-demand occupation areas,

funding, and required reporting by the community colleges. The report also lists all the programs of study at each of the community colleges.

2023 Factual Look at Higher Education in Nebraska: Enrollment

Ms. Heese delivered a PowerPoint presentation summarizing the Enrollment section of the 2023 Factual Look at Higher Education in Nebraska. The Coordinating Commission is required by statute to report Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) data. Total fall enrollment for all sectors was up 1.0 percent over the last year and down 3.7 percent over the 10-year period. The report includes graphs and details regarding enrollment for students by sector, student level, full-time/part-time classification, gender, race/ethnicity, age, and distance education status. Ms. Heese gave a brief tutorial of the Enrollment Data Dashboard that is available on the Commission's website.
