



I am wanting to send a support letter in regards to SCC beginning a dental hygiene program. As a dentist practicing in Lincoln for 10 years, as well as being involved with the UNMC GPR residency program for 8 years, I strongly have seen the increased demand for dental hygienists in our community, as well as the Nebraska community. Unfortunately I've experienced the shortage in my practice first hand-we had to increase our wages significantly to meet the community demand, making it nearly impossible to do more than break even in the hygiene department without jeopardizing standard of care. Which in my office we opt to take a financial hit versus do 30 minute hygiene appointments or assisted hygiene. Additionally patients wait times in a standard private practice are lengthening significantly for basic care, and that is not what is needed for Nebraskans. I can only echo my colleagues in Medicaid offices and FQHCs about their struggles to meet their even higher demands with less and less hygienists available.

I think we can all say the tipping point was Covid, where a number of hygienists retired early or changed professions. But unfortunately this shortage has been a long time coming, as more and more dental schools are opening, enrollment increases and the number of graduating dentists in Nebraska grossly outnumber hygienists for years. As you may know know, for a successful private dental office, 1 dentist benefits most from 2 hygienists at minimum, so this disparity has been a long time

I personally have seen such high quality assistants graduate from SCC, so I'm more than confident that having a hygiene program would have students doing high quality work. I am I'm also confident they would hold high standards in asepsis/OSHA as well as ethics.

I know there have been opposition from prominent hygiene instructors at UNMC, but I hope the outreach from other professionals in the community can show you the high need for our community and how impactful this program can be for our state. My name is Marty Matz. I have been practicing dentistry for 37 years and have been a solo private practice owner for 32 years. I don't believe I have ever seen a bigger drought in dental hygienist profession than what we are experiencing now. I remember a time when an Iowa community college was proposing a doubling of their class size. All my dentist friends were wondering how they all would get jobs.

Recently I have had a reduction in my hygiene staff of 50% due to a two hygienists retiring and another taking a contract offered by a nearby dentist that promised an unreasonably high wage. I have reports of large hiring bonuses and excessive hourly wages. I don't believe a dental hygienist should receive a wage higher than a NICU nurse. Additionally, I have first hand reports of more dentists performing their own hygiene appointments. My partner and I are performing several hygiene appointments every day to accommodate the shortage.

In addition to reaching out to the dental grapevine we have used online hiring websites for several months to no avail. We have not even received one inquiry.

The bottom line is: Demand is high and supply is low.





My name is Paula and I'm a periodontist in Lincoln, NE. We desperately need to graduate more highly trained hygienists. As one of the 5 practicing periodontists in Lincoln, I see periodontal disease at a much higher rate than most general dentists and other specialists. As people are living longer and keeping their teeth, it's become even more important that we have hygienists that can properly treat gingivitis and periodontitis, as well as, help educate patients on their overall oral health.

At this time, if I see a new patient referred for periodontal disease, it is at least 2-3 months before we have an opening to begin their treatment with our hygienists. Many of our referring general dental practices have been struggling to hire their own hygienists and have thus had to refer even more periodontal patients to us. Moreover, while the UNMC COD has increased its dental student class size, it has not added any additional hygiene spots, despite their being an overwhelming need for more hygienists, not dentists (both locally and nationwide).

For example, the office I was formerly employed in, has been actively trying to hire a Hygienist for a month.

Sadly, they have not received any applications, and I understand this is the norm for a lot of local offices.

Despite stepping away to raise my family and support our family farm in eastern Nebraska, my passion for the dental field stays strong. Offering a Dental Hygiene program at SCC would allow individuals like me to pursue a rewarding career, without the burden of relocating. A program such as this will address the shortage of quality Dental Hygiene professionals who can attain a degree from an accredited program through a local community college. This will play a huge role in equipping our local dental practices with qualified Dental Hygiene professionals so dental healthcare can remain strong in our communities.

I strongly encourage Southeast Community College to move forward with the implantation of the Dental Hygiene Program. Your leadership in this commitment would meet the evolving needs of both students and the dental health community.
