













% of Total Fall Enrollment <u>by Student Level</u> Nebraska Public and Independent Institutions and For-Profit/Career Schools


















Fall Enrollment Compared to 12-month Enrollment at Nebraska's Public Institutions


Nebraska <u>Public</u> Colleges and Universities Fall Enrollment



Nebraska <u>Public</u> Colleges and Universities 12-Month Enrollment




Nebraska <u>Public</u> Colleges and Universities Fall Enrollment Divided by 12-Month Enrollment










