## Background

- Coordinating Commission is required by statute to report IPEDS data
- Responsibility is fulfilled through the publication of the Factual Look and other reports, such as the Nebraska Higher Education Progress Report
- Factual Look is generally used by legislative staff, institutional researchers and Commission staff
- Provides a statewide statistical analysis
- Focuses on ten-year trends
- Does not answer "why"


## Background

- Consists of three parts:
- Degrees and Other Awards (formerly Section B)
- Data presented at September's Commission Meeting
- Enrollment (formerly Section A)
- Faculty and Salaries (formerly Section C)
- Planning and Consumer Information Committee approves sections of the Factual Look as they are completed
- Ensures timely dissemination of data
- Factual Look is now primarily an online publication
- Data corresponding to each section are available for download via the Commission's website

## Fall Enrollment by Student Level

| Graduates | $+2.7 \%(+654$ Students $)$ | $+43.9 \%(+7,482$ Students $)$ |



## Fall Enrollment by Student Level

$\checkmark$ Graduate enrollments accounted for higher percentages of total fall enrollment in 2013 than in 2003, statewide, and within all four sectors of higher education in Nebraska that offer graduate programs.


## Fall Enrollment by Sector and by Student Level

- Undergraduate enrollment increased across all sectors in Nebraska between fall 2003 and fall 2013
- Range from $+6.1 \%$ at the Community Colleges to $+21.3 \%$ in the Independent sector
- Graduate enrollment increased across all sectors offering graduate programs in Nebraska between fall 2003 to fall 2013
- Range from + 15.1\% at the University of Nebraska to + 105.9\% in the Independent sector
- Bellevue University and Creighton University accounted for nearly 65\% of the growth within the Independent sector


## Total Fall Enrollment by Gender

$\checkmark$ Women continue to outnumber men at the undergraduate and graduate levels, and across all racial/ethnic groups, except among foreign students.
$\checkmark$ Women accounted for 55.8\% of fall enrollment in both 2003 and 2013.


## Undergraduate Fall Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

## Undergraduate Fall Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity Compared to Nebraska Population of 18-24 Year Olds

$\checkmark$ White non-Hispanics, Black non-Hispanics, and Asians/Pacific Islanders were over-represented and Hispanics were underrepresented among undergraduates in fall 2013.

## Percentage of Fall Undergraduate Enrollment Under 25 Years of Age - by Sector -2003 \& 2013

$\checkmark$ Nebraska's Community Colleges enrolled a higher percentage of students under 25 years of age, while the independent institutions and for-profit/career schools enrolled a higher percentage of students 25 years or older


## Fall Enrollment Compared to 12-Month Enrollment at

 Nebraska's Public Institutions$\checkmark$ Percentage of the total activity captured in fall enrollment figures:
$\frac{\text { Fall Enrollment }}{12-\text { Month Enrollment }}=\frac{\text { Univ. of NE }}{85-87 \%} \quad \frac{\text { NSCS }}{70-79 \%} \quad \frac{\text { NE CCs }}{48-56 \%}$
