Background

- Coordinating Commission is required by statute to report IPEDS data
 - Responsibility is fulfilled through the publication of the Factual Look and other reports, such as the Nebraska Higher Education Progress Report
- Factual Look is generally used by legislative staff, institutional researchers, and Commission staff
- Provides a statewide statistical analysis
 - Focuses on ten-year trends
 - Does not answer "why"

Background

- Consists of two parts:
 - Degrees and Other Awards
 - Data presented at May's Commission meeting
 - Enrollment
- Completed sections of the Factual Look are approved by the Commission's Executive Director after consulting with the Planning and Consumer Information Committee
 - Ensures timely dissemination of data
- Factual Look is primarily an online publication
 - Data corresponding to each section are available for download via the Commission's website
 - Data users can view data via a dashboard on the Commission's website: https://ccpe.nebraska.gov/enrollment-dashboard


What's New for 2023

 - Capitol School of Hairstyling and Esthetics is now Capitol Beauty School


Key Context

- Following the Great Recession of 2008, fall 2009 enrollment increased to 140,770 (□) and peaked the following year at 145,893 (□).
- This report focuses on 10-year trends, and 2012 (□) is the baseline for this report.
- Since 2010, fall enrollments have steadily declined but remain higher than prerecession levels (■).
- The impact of COVID-19 can be seen beginning with fall 2020 enrollments, particularly at the community colleges, with U.S. Nonresidents, and distance education.




Total Fall Enrollment




Fall Enrollment by Student Level


Undergraduate Fall Enrollmentby Full-Time/Part-Time Classification










Undergraduate Fall Enrollment by Age



Graduate Fall Enrollment by Distance Education Status



Location of Students Enrolled Exclusively in Distance Education Courses (Fall 2022)

Undergraduate

- Overall, 24% of undergraduate enrollments were exclusively distance enrollments
 - Ranges from 9% at the University of Nebraska to 40% at the nonpublics
- 60% of exclusively distance enrollments were located in Nebraska
 - Ranges from 16% at the nonpublic institutions to 96% at the community colleges
- Overall, about 10% of undergraduate fall enrollments were exclusively distance education enrollments in another state
 - Ranges from 1% at the community colleges to 23% at the nonpublic institutions

Graduate

- Overall, 50% of graduate enrollments were exclusively distance enrollments
 - Ranges from 39% at the University of Nebraska to 79% at the state colleges
- 52% of exclusively distance enrollments were located in Nebraska
 - Ranges from 37% at the nonpublic institutions to 72% at the state colleges
- Overall, about 24% of graduate fall enrollments were exclusively distance education enrollments in another state
 - Ranges from 13% at the University of Nebraska to 37% at the nonpublic institutions



Fall Enrollment of First-Time Freshman



Fall Enrollment Compared to 12-Month Enrollment

- This report focuses on fall enrollment for two main reasons:
 - Fall enrollment data is reported in much more detail than 12-month enrollment (historic data for full-time/part-time status, age group, distance enrollment)
 - IPEDS is starting to collect more detailed information on 12-month enrollments
 - Fall enrollment data is available in IPEDS earlier than 12-month enrollment data
 - Fall 2022 data were reported in spring 2023, while 2022-23 12-month data will not be collected until fall 2023
- Fall enrollment provides a "snapshot" of the total number of students who were enrolled at an institution on October 15 or the institution's official fall reporting date
 - Decreased 4.6% between fall 2012 and fall 2021
- 12-month enrollment is the total unduplicated headcount of students enrolled at an institution any time during the academic year
 - Decreased 13.8% between 2012-13 and 2021-22
- In general, both metrics follow similar trends for most sectors/ institutions in Nebraska, indicating that either is a valid measure for trend analyses
 - Fall enrollment figures have captured 87% to 89% of 12-month enrollments at the University of Nebraska and 53% to 70% of 12-month enrollments at the community colleges


Dashboard Demonstration – Enrollment

- https://ccpe.nebraska.gov/enrollment-dashboard
 - How many undergraduate students under age 18 were enrolled part-time in fall 2021?
 - Under tab Fall Enrollment by Age, choose <18 (age), undergraduate (student level), and part-time (FT/PT)
 - Answer: 11,978, an increase of 132.9% since fall 2011



Dashboard Demonstration – Enrollment

- What percent of part-time undergraduate students under age 18 were enrolled at the community colleges?
 - Under tab Fall Enrollment by Age, choose <18 (age), undergraduate (student level), and part-time (FT/PT)
- Answer: 9,199 / 11,978 = 76.8% of PT undergrads under 18 were enrolled at the community colleges
